

St. Hilary of Poitiers - January 13

- A Bishop of Poitiers in France and fought against the heresy of Arianism
- St. Hilary is considered to be the earliest Christian Hymn writer, composing a book of lyrics in 360AD
- He is the Patron Saint against SNAKE BITES!!



GOSPEL: MATTHEW 3:13-17

Jesus came to John one day to be baptized. Jesus was God's Son, and had no sin for John to wash away in the Jordan River. But Jesus wanted to be baptized anyway, to please his Father in heaven. God looked down from heaven, and when Jesus came out of the river, God sent his Spirit to rest on Jesus like a dove. Then God spoke from heaven for John and everyone else to hear.
