Why We Collect Information

JPP Catholic School as Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) collects personal information about your child and family.

This helps us to plan learning programs and keep students safe at school.

We may collect information in writing, through computer systems, or in conversations.

Following the law

Some information must be collected because of Australian laws.

This helps the Principal and school to care for students and keep them safe.

Health information

We may collect health information (for example: allergies, medical conditions).

This information is private and important for your child's safety and wellbeing.

Why Information Is Important

If we do not have important information, your child's enrolment may be delayed or they may not receive the support they need. This is especially important for health and safety reasons.

Who We May Share Information With

We may share information to support your child's education and care. This may include:

- School staff and school leaders
- Other Catholic, government, or independent schools
- Government departments (for funding and policies)
- Catholic Church organisations (parish or diocese)
- Doctors and health professionals
- Support staff (for example: tutors, counsellors, coaches, volunteers)
- Online learning and communication systems (for example: video calls, school apps)
- Education and testing organisations (for example: NAPLAN)
- Service providers who help with school systems and administration
- People you give permission to
- Authorities when required by law (for example: child protection)

Sharing with parents

Information about students is usually shared with parents or guardians.

Moving to another school

If you apply to another CEWA or government school, your child's information (including health information) may be shared to help with the enrolment process.

Storing Information

Your information is stored in secure systems, including online ("cloud") systems. Some data may be stored outside Australia.

Accessing Your Information

You can ask to see or correct your child's information. In some cases, access may be limited if it affects privacy or safety.

Complaints

If you are concerned about privacy, you can make a complaint. The school will explain how your complaint will be handled.

Photos And School News

The school may share student achievements, activities, photos, or videos in:

- Newsletters
- School website
- School community communications


We will ask for your permission at enrolment before sharing photos or videos publicly.

Information About Other People

If you give us personal information about other people (for example: emergency contacts or doctors), please tell them you have shared their details.

Keeping Students Safe

The safety and wellbeing of students is the most important priority. If needed, student safety will come before privacy.
