Once the friends leave or the movie is over we are right back in the midst of our suffering. Earthly things can only comfort us in part, but the Psalmist tells us that there is a place we can go to find real lasting comfort.

If we accept them by faith then these words become personal.

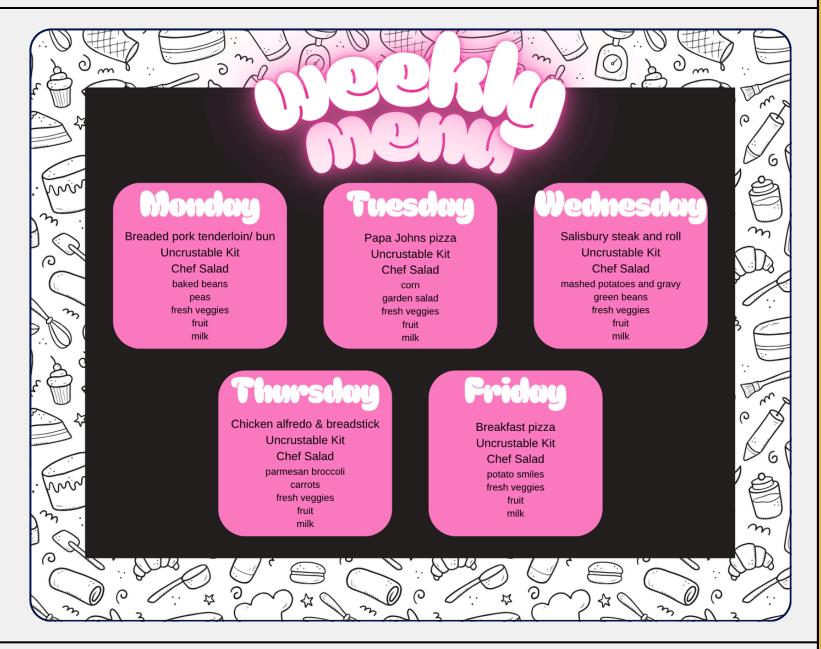
These words are not from some God, but from our God. They are words to us from our Father and from our Redeemer. We belong to him, and he cares for us.

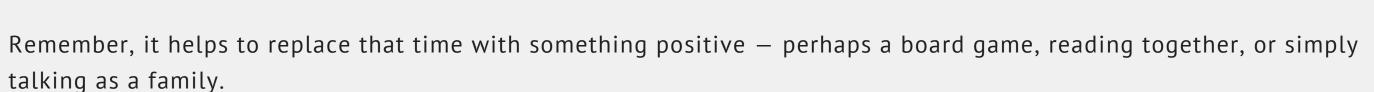
LETTER FROM SISTER CATHERINE

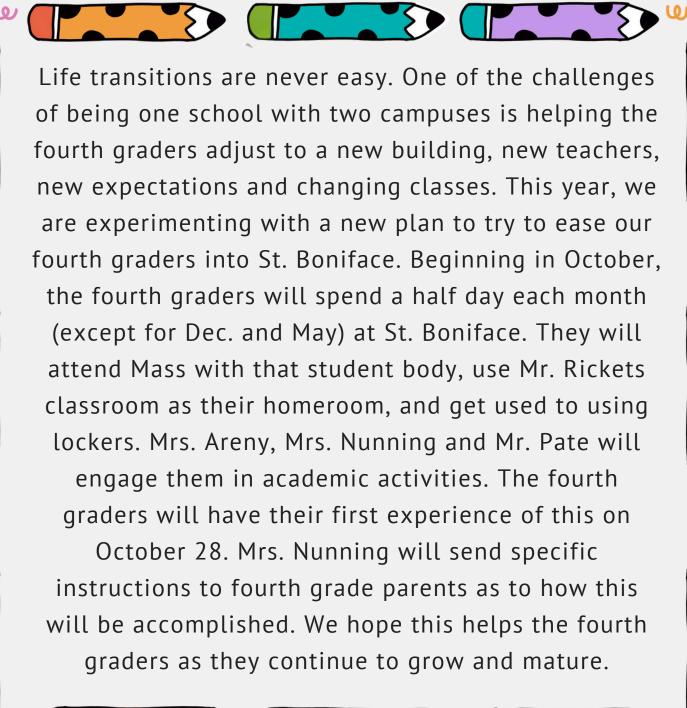

SAMMIE VAUGHN

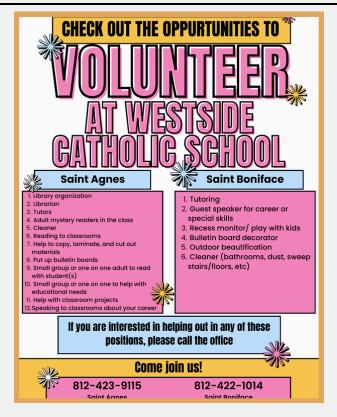
SECOND GRADE

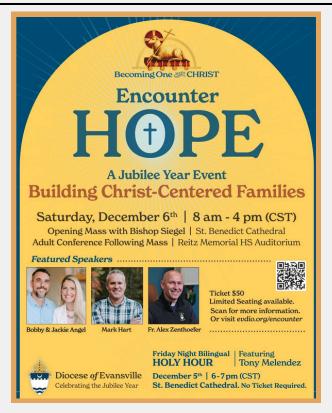
