Intent	Implementation
Children have opportunities to take part in different sports and try to make clubs varied both in provision and ages taking part.	Keep an eye on what the children are doing in sports club and making them multiskilled so they have a chance of experiencing different sports.
Look at buying a PE Curriculum so that we can clearly identify the content of lessons taught and the progression of learning	Work with Sporting Influence Coach to update Long Term Plan and to put in place the taught learning units. Purchase Complete PE scheme costing £500
Ensure all pupils can access competition in school through regular intra-school competition, as well as all pupils accessing intercompetitions against other schools. Competition formats to reflect needs of pupils. See school games offer. Teachers will have increase confidence with the teaching of PE. They can learn from a sports coach and be able to use their expertise.	Talking and having meetings with the sports coach
Making sure that all the children in the school can swim as it is a life skill and understand water safety so they can use this in the future. It will mean that the children will swim and be comfortable in water.	Certificates. Assessment. Conversations with the Teaching Coaches
Having an opportunity to take part in different sports and varied age clubs will ensure that the children are exposed to all sports and they might enjoy it and be good at it. This will mean that they will then take it up outside of school and be more active.	Registers, planning different activities during club time. In July 2024, there was no option for KS1 Sports Club. We are looking to significantly improve this whilst maintaining KS2 participation during the year.	Attendance at KS1 and KS2 Sports Clubs

Lessons planned are now progressive and build in a systematic manner using Complete PE. The Teachers are now more familiar with the scheme, lesson content and how to deliver high quality PE lessons. When the coach has been absent, lessons have continued to be delivered of the same quality.
