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### Introduction

America's Epic Adventure<sup>™</sup> was developed for the purpose of helping churches defend against the relentless attacks by those perpetrating a secular, evolutionary worldview. For decades the Church's foundation (Christ and His Word, Ephesians 2:19-20) has been attacked in a manner unbeknownst by many.

To remove the prevailing Christian worldview from the American culture, secularists first eliminated Bible reading and prayer from America's public schools through laws enacted by the Supreme Court in the 1962 *Engel v Vitale* and 1963 *Abington School District v Schempp* cases (violating Article's I and III of the U.S. Constitution as only Congress is to make laws, not the Supreme Court). As a whole, Christendom in America did nothing in response, continuing to send their children to institutions in which God's Word and prayer were no longer part of their daily education.

Secondly, the Supreme Court again made a new law in the 1987 *Edwards v Aguillard* case, in which they declared schools and teachers could no longer teach any form of Creationism alongside Evolution. Many churches and Christians did nothing in response, continuing to send their children to institutions in which they would be taught solely in science classes that there is no God, the universe somehow made itself, and they are the highest evolved animal lifeform to date, originating by a random chance culmination of molecular actions and reactions. There were many, however, who would no longer conform to the pressures of the culture or government. Many churches and Christians started Christian schools or homeschooling, refusing to let their children be indoctrinated by those who stand firmly against the Lord God.

Thirdly, in the midst of these aggressions against the Lord and His Church, secularists began teaching a revised version of American history. For several decades, they attempted to tell the country that the founders of the country were just a bunch of deists. They were not devout Christians and did not use the Bible for any inspiration in seeking independence or crafting our new forms of government. This, however, was easily refuted by simply reading the founders' own words! They were extremely faithful and turned to the Lord and His Word regularly in the formation of the United States of America. Consequently, the secularists had to take a different approach in more recent years. Now the current paradigm they are pushing is, yes, the founders were faithful, orthodox Christians. They did use the Bible as the foundation for



America, its Constitution, and its laws. That is why America has been and still is racist, sexist, bigoted, etc. because it was founded that way by Christian men. Therefore, America needs a complete remaking by purging and erasing this foundation and its influence upon the culture.

What does this have to do with the Church? The Church has the same foundation – Christ and His Word! If, then, that foundation must be removed by the secularists from any influence upon American culture, then the Church must also be removed by the secularists from any influence upon American culture.

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America's Epic Adventure™ lessons challenge students with the historical accounts of America's founding. The lessons relay the faith and dedication to God's Word of those who helped establish the country. Students will see how God blessed, even with apparent miracles, when people were faithful to Him, but also how things did not go as well when they were not faithful.

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### A MIRACULOUS STORM

### **THE PILGRIMS**

A Miraculous Storm (*Pilgrims*) – Walking by faith in the Lord - Proverbs 3:5-6 Lesson Outline

- 1. Those who settled Jamestown cared more about money than sharing the Gospel.
- 2. Pilgrims sought freedom of religion.
- 3. A miraculous storm helped them escape England.
- 4. They eventually seek freedom in America.
- 5. A series of storms force them to settle in Plymouth.
- 6. By living according to the Bible, the Lord blessed their colony and their relations with Native Americans.

### LESSON

### <u>Jamestown</u>

On May 14, 1607, after a rough and scary 5-month journey, 104 men started the colony of Jamestown, Virginia. To get people to join this daring journey, they were told part of its mission was to tell people in the New World about Jesus. Even the charter (the paper from the king that said they could start a colony) said they were to tell the Native Americans about Jesus. 104 men signed up! The problem was, only one of them, Robert Hunt, was a minister, and he was the only one who regularly tried to tell others about Jesus. The rest of the colonists did not care about that. All they wanted to do was discover gold.

In fact, they never spent any time planting or tending crops or digging wells for water. By the end of the first year, they had humbled themselves to not just buying, but begging and stealing corn from the natives. And the only thing they ever found was pyrite – fool's gold!

To help fix things, on September 10, 1608, John Smith was named the president of the colony's council. He immediately demanded discipline and work by ALL the colonists. He had a well dug, crops planted, and declared that 2 Thessalonians 3:10 was to be strictly enforced, "...that if any would not work, neither should he eat."

Captain Smith also tried to work with the Native Americans. Back in December of 1607, he was captured while out looking for food and brought to chief Powhatan. Smith feared for his life, but wrote that he was saved when the 11-year-old Pocahontas threw herself across him "at the minute of my execution, she hazarded the beating out of her own



brains to save mine; and not only that, but so prevailed with her father, that I was safely conducted to Jamestown."

The encounter allowed John Smith to build good relations with the Natives, often relying upon them for food supplies to save the colony. Many, though, did not like the new working conditions under Smith, even though things had started to turn around. They even had a corn harvest! In the fall of 1609, a mysterious gunpowder explosion in the canoe in which Smith was sleeping, left him badly injured. He sailed for England that October, never to return to Jamestown.

With the mosquitoes, malaria, tainted water, misplaced priorities, self-serving relations with the natives, and no work ethic, 2/3 of the settlers died. This would be the continuing story for Jamestown for many years as they regularly did not obey God and served only themselves.

### **The Pilgrims**

At the exact same time Jamestown was beginning in 1607, back in England, the government had begun raiding homes in Scrooby in Nottinghamshire, imprisoning those who would not adhere to the Church of England. A group of separatists led by William Brewster and other religious men were gathering to worship God according to their understanding of the Bible and not by the demands of King James.

It was illegal to leave the country, yet the separatists attempted to do so in the spring of 1608, bound for Holland. They decided to split up to draw less attention to themselves. The women and children journeyed down river to the coast; the men went overland. They would board a Dutch ship when they all arrived. The women and children arrived early, saw no one was there, got seasick, and went back up the river so not to draw attention at the port. But then the tide went out and their boats got stuck in the mud!

The men arrived the next morning, also saw no one was there, but went ahead and started preparing for their trip. All of a sudden, a great company of officials arrived to arrest them. The Dutch captain weighed anchor and began to take off! The men who were still on land ran and hid. The men on the ship told the captain to go back because they did not know where their families were.

The captain finally decided to turn around when just as he did, a fearful storm rose up against them. The ship was driven off course to the coast of Norway. For 14 days the storm raged! They often could see neither sun, moon, nor stars. The captain believed God was punishing him for not returning the men to their families. However, if the storm had not suddenly risen against them and kept them from returning, there may not have been an America as we know it today.



When the authorities arrived and found only the women and children who had made it to the coast, they felt awkward about arresting them. After some questioning, they were allowed to go freely. The families eventually found another ship and joined the men in Holland. If the storm had not stopped the men and they had returned, they very well may have been arrested and perhaps kept from ever leaving – the pilgrims may have never made it to America.

They all finally made it safely to the Netherlands (between France and Germany on the North Sea coast; the area they lived in was called Holland). However, King James eventually sent out an international manhunt for them! They finally decided to find a way to move to the New World and establish a colony where they could worship and live in freedom.

### The New World

They set sail from Holland on the Speedwell. The ship, however, developed leaks. They had to squeeze with other passengers from England on board the Mayflower. A total of 102 passengers with 30 or so crew left Plymouth, England on September 6, 1620, headed for America. The trip was challenging to say the least. It seemed to storm the whole trip. They were stuck below deck for two months with bad food, tainted water, no bathrooms, and only one set of clothes – the one you were wearing. Yet, they thought it was worth it to be able to worship God and live according to the Bible.

Land was sighted on November 9<sup>th</sup>! They all ran up on deck and began to praise God for bringing them to the New World. They celebrated for so long that Captain Jones had to force them below deck so he could continue operating the ship. They had arrived at Cape Cod, north of where they were supposed to settle. They attempted for several days to sail south, but strong winter storms and winds kept them from making any progress.

They floated into the Provincetown Harbor of Cape Cod on Saturday, November 11, 1620. With the next day being Sunday, they stayed on board to worship together instead of unloading, despite two months of being cramped up in the Mayflower! That's how important the Lord's Day was to them! Then on Monday, November 13, 1620, the pilgrims set foot in the New World. They settled on a location on December 21<sup>st</sup> and began home construction on December 23<sup>rd</sup>. The winter was harsh with freezing temperatures, disease, and lack of shelter. Of the 130 or so original passengers, only 53 would survive to the following November. They remarkably didn't give up and stayed when the Mayflower went back to England on April 5<sup>th</sup>! They believed God would take care of them if they were faithful to Him.

Just a few weeks before the Mayflower left, a man named Samoset walked into the village on March 16, 1621. He had learned English from being captured and released by English fishermen in present-day Maine. His friend Squanto had been captured in 1605 and returned home for good in 1619 (Squanto crossed the Atlantic 6 times in his life). When Squanto



heard of this new group, he went to meet them. His people had been wiped out by a plague while he was in captivity. He was so pleased to see people living on his tribe's land that he stayed with them. He attended their worship services and listened to them read the Bible and pray. He was amazed at their "brotherly love."

The colonists became so fond of him that when he was captured by a rival tribe, Miles Standish led a group to rescue him, which would lead to another 50 years of peace. Following his safe return, Governor Bradford showed him the story of Joseph and how he too had been captured, but God worked it out for His good. Squanto and Bradford became close friends, and Squanto became a Christian.

Through all those storms, God had led the pilgrims to the one place in the whole continent where the natives were happy for someone else to live there, the land had already been somewhat prepared for them, and there was a native who spoke fluent English who could show them everything they needed to know to survive and prosper. The pilgrims were right – God did take care of them!

The colonists established good relations with the natives through the love of Jesus. In return, the natives worked side-by-side with the pilgrims. After the harvest of 1621, they all got together (most likely in October, 90 Indians and 53 colonists) for a three-day celebration.

### Living by the Bible

Problems came with the arrival of the *Fortune* in November of 1621. New colonists came with new rules from England. The rules said that no one could own their own land, they had to rotate from one piece of land to the next as they planted and harvested, they then were to bring all the food into one place and give everyone the same amount of food. It did not matter if you worked really hard or had been lazy and did nothing, everyone got the same amount of food. Many who did not follow the Bible did not work hard. This meant there was not nearly as much food as there had been. It was soon realized that there would not be enough to last the winter.

Governor William Bradford said the answer was in the Bible. He, just as John Smith had 15 years earlier, operated by the Scriptural teaching of 2 Thessalonians 3:10, "...that if any would not work, neither should he eat" and 1 Timothy 5:8, which says that if you do not provide for your own family, you have denied the faith like someone who does not believe in God! Therefore, because of what the Bible says, Brandford and the council declared that if you did not work, then you would not receive any food. Guess what everyone who had been lazy began to do? WORK!

A LOT more crops were planted in 1623 and everything was going well, until a really bad drought from May to June looked like it would kill all their crops. The colony came together for an entire day of fasting and prayer. That night, Governor Bradford wrote, "...it

began to overcast, and shortly after to rain, with such sweet and gentle showers, as gave them cause of rejoicing, & blessing God. It came, without either wind, or thunder, or any violence, and by degrees in abundance, as the earth was thoroughly wet and soaked. Which did so apparently revive & quicken the decayed corn & other fruits, as was wonderful to see, and made the Indians astonished to behold... For which mercy (in time convenient) they also set apart a day of thanksgiving."

And that's how this nation was founded – upon God's Word, with full faith and dependence on Him, giving Him all the praise and honor, including a special day of Thanksgiving unto God.
