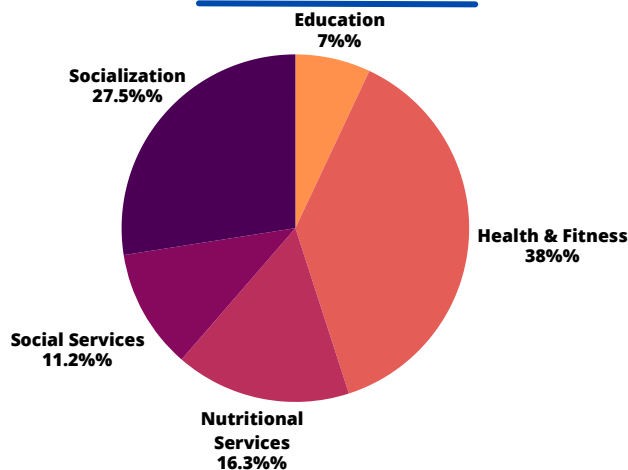

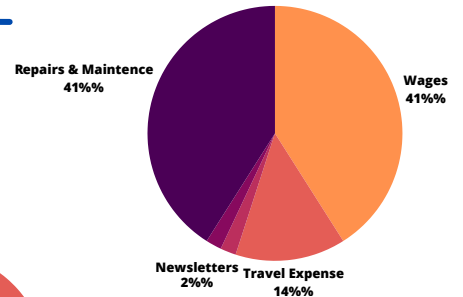

Annex Remodel & Sunroom Removal



Annex Remodel: In 2025, the Sunroom was removed after a failing roof caved in. Later in the year, Loose began annex was remodeled to create a more open and functional floor plan. Improvements included new flooring, a drop ceiling, modest wall construction for bathrooms, and updated cabinetry. This project was made possible through ARPA funding and Fenton Township CDBG funds.
