- Average reach per post: ~4,000–7,000 views, showing healthy visibility among residents.

- Other posts with limited visuals or event recaps show lower engagement, indicating the importance of photo/video content.

- 1. Continue emphasizing visual posts (photos, videos, live updates).
- 2. Post regularly around city events, infrastructure updates, and community stories.
- 3. Cross-promote content on Instagram to reach the younger generation on this platform.
- 4. Track quarterly analytics (views, likes, shares) to show measurable progress to the Board.
- 5. Post more Reels; the data shows that Reels are the ones that are gaining the net followers increase.


