

Why October to celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary?

Our journey starts with a naval confrontation that took place on October 7, 1571. The Battle of Lepanto, a naval battle fought between a coalition of European Catholic maritime states and the fleet of the Ottoman Empire, stands as a pivotal moment in Western history. Against overwhelming odds, the Christian fleet, led by Don Juan of Austria, achieved a decisive victory over the Turks. What makes this victory even more remarkable is the powerful intercession attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary through the Rosary. Pope Pius V, a Dominican pope who had great devotion to the Rosary, called upon all of Christendom to pray the Rosary for the success of this crucial battle. And when the victory was secured, the Pope attributed it to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As a tribute to this miraculous intervention, he instituted the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th.
