CHRISTMAS TREE HISTORY

Germany is credited with starting the Christmas tree tradition—as we now know it-by the 16th century, when devout Christians sources record bringing decorated trees into their homes. Some built Christmas pyramids of wood and decorated them with evergreens and candles if wood was scarce.

Most 19th-century Americans found Christmas trees an oddity. The first records of Christmas trees being cut for display come from the 1820s in Pennsylvania's German community. However, trees weren't originally accepted by most Americans because of its prior history of being associated with mythology and pagan cultures. But the 'evergreen/eternal life' and 'candles/light of the world' imagery eventually solidified this tradition to represent Jesus and Christianity.
