St. Kateri Tekakwitha Also known as "Lily of the Mohawks" Feast Day: July 14 Patron of Environment and Ecology, Orphans

Born in 1656 to her Christian Algonquin mother and Mohawk Chief father. She contracted smallpox at age 4 which scarred her skin. The humiliation of the scars led her to wear a blanket to hide her face. The rest of her family died during the outbreak.

Kateri was a skilled worker, hard working and patient. Kateri refused marriage and at age 19, she converted to Catholicism much to the dislike of her fellow Mohawk clan. To avoid continued hardships and persecution, she fled to a Christian native community south of Montreal.

Kateri was known for her steadfast devotion and self-mortification and continual prayer life. She died at the young age of 24 due to poor health. Witnesses claim that minutes after her death, her scars vanished and her face appeared radiant and beautiful.

We are very blessed to continue having our small church doors open, as well as, the service of our priest, Father Augustin in these tough financial times. We are certainly blessed.




BeTcHa DiDn'T KnOw...

- 1) The first printed Bible was printed under the supervision of the Catholic Church. It was printed by the Catholic inventor of the printing press: Johannes Gutenberg.
- 2) It was the Catholic Church that added modern-day chapters and numbered verses to the Bible.
- 3) The magical term "hocus pocus" comes from the most sacred moment in Catholic ritual: the consecration of the bread as the body of Christ by the priest speaking the words "This is my body," which in Latin is Hoc est enim corpus meum.
- 4) The first black person to be documented as a saint in the Roman Catholic Church was known as Saint Maurice (a.k.a. St. Mauritius or St. Moritz). He was a 3rd-century Roman soldier born in Egypt who was martyred when he refused to massacre Christians for the Roman Empire.
- 5) The tradition of honoring saints actually came from the Jews who had a long-standing tradition of honoring prophets and holy people with shrines.
