



- 5 things about St. Bridget you need to know:
- 1. St. Bridget experienced her first vision at age. At 10 years old, Bridget had a vision of Christ on the cross in his agonizing suffering. In her vision, Bridget saw Christ with his wounds from Good Friday, with the wounds of "The Man of Sorrows" in Isaiah 53. She asked Jesus who hurt him, and he responded: "Those who despise me and refuse my love for them." 2. Bridget served in the royal court of Sweden. 3. Bridget was a mother to eight children, and one of them became a saint.4. Bridget founded a religious order, the Bridgettines, after her husband died.5. St. Bridget is the copatroness of Europe.
