



history of the city




Hickory, NC, has a rich history that dates back to the mid-19th century. Originally known as "Hickory Tavern," the town was founded in the 1850s. Legend has it that the town's name came from a log tavern built under a large hickory tree by Henry Robinson, one of the first settlers in the area. The town was officially established in 1870 as "Hickory" and rapidly grew as a hub of commerce and transportation due to its strategic location along the Western North Carolina Railroad.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Hickory became known for its burgeoning furniture industry. The area's rich natural resources, particularly timber, and the skilled craftsmanship of its residents helped it become one of the major furniture manufacturing centers in the United States, a reputation that continues today. This industrial boom laid the foundation for Hickory's economy, drawing in workers and leading to significant population growth.

Hickory is also known for its role in healthcare history. In 1944, during the height of the polio epidemic, the city responded by establishing the Hickory Emergency Infantile Paralysis Hospital in just 54 hours. The hospital was hailed as a model of community effort and medical care, providing treatment to children affected by polio from across the region.




INCOME TAXES

In Hickory, NC, the cost of living is relatively affordable compared to the national average, with income tax rates being a significant factor. North Carolina has a flat income tax rate of 4.75% for all taxpayers. This tax structure, combined with lower housing costs and reasonable living expenses, makes Hickory an attractive option for residents.

PROPERTY TAXES

In Hickory, NC, property tax rates are low, ranging from \$0.38 to \$0.455 per \$100 valuation, which is lower than the national average. SALES TAX

AVERAGE TEMPERATURE:

The average temperature in Hickory, NC, varies by season. Summers are warm, with average highs in the mid-80s°F, while winters are mild, with average lows in the 30s°F. Spring and fall offer comfortable temperatures, ranging between 50°F and 70°F. Overall, Hickory experiences a moderate climate with four distinct seasons, making it ideal for outdoor activities year-round.

PRECIPITATION LEVELS:

Hickory, NC, receives an average of about 44 inches of precipitation annually. Rainfall is spread fairly evenly throughout the year, with the wettest months typically being July and August due to summer thunderstorms. Snowfall is relatively light, averaging around 5 inches per year, mostly occurring in the months of January and February.

EXTREME WEATHER EVENTS:

These seasonal transitions offer diverse outdoor experiences throughout the year.

WALKING TRAILS

Hickory and its surrounding areas offer great walking opportunities for nature lovers and fitness enthusiasts. 
