

MEMBERSHIP

MEMBER ACCOUNTS AND STATEMENTS

Your membership privileges allow you to conveniently charge your purchases in our food and beverage outlets, as well as the golf shop, to your member account. This means that you can make one payment each month, instead of paying each time you purchase from our outlets.

We currently (snail) mail monthly paper statements to all of our members. Statements list your itemized purchases and payments that occur within each calendar month. If your payment arrives after due date shown on the statement, it will be posted on the <u>next</u> statement that follows.

How To Pay Your Monthly Account Balance

1. By personal or bank-generated check (mail or drop off)

- Please always include your correct membership number on your check; you can always find that number on your monthly statements and on your membership card
- If you change the type of membership you have, your membership number will also change and you should update that information on your own - as well as your bank direct - checks
- Please also indicate the first and last name of the primary member; so that we can be sure the payment is applied to the correct account.
- Summary: Many of our accounts have the same last name; some have the same first and last name, so it will help us apply payment to the correct members if you show both the primary member name and the account number on your checks!

2. By phone with a credit-card

- You can phone Nancy in our membership services / accounts receivable office 209-795-1000 ext. 8 and give your credit card information over the phone.
- The membership services office is available Thursday through Monday (usually out on Tuesdays and Wednesdays). Your voice messages will always be returned as soon as possible.
- ♦ We'll be happy to help with any questions or issues you might have!

3. Leave credit-card info on file for automatic payments

For the convenience of not having to write and mail a check each month, or not having to phone us each month, you may want to leave a credit card on file, that we will automatically charge in a monthly batch. The cards will charge your account balance that's on your most recent statement (the month prior to the batch run.) Just give us a call to set this up!

To avoid the possibility of an interruption or suspension of your charge privileges, we kindly ask for full payment of your account balance each month

Etiquette for the Love of Golf

Here at Sequoia Woods we have quite a diversity of members that play golf. They differ greatly not only in their age and ability but, in the reasons why they play the game as well. Some are true competitors at our club, but most are not. Others play for exercise and the love of the outdoors, while most enjoy the social aspects of the game and the occasional "shot of your life". One thing that we do have in common is that we all play the same golf course on a daily basis. In order for this to happen it is important that we all have a basic knowledge of golf course Etiquette.

What is **Etiquette**? Well, the dictionary describes it as: **The forms prescribed by custom or authority to be observed in social, official, or professional life.** In more simple terms, it is the polite way in which we act and conduct ourselves as a courtesy to others. In golf, this not only pertains to other golfers, but to the course as well. As children, most of us were taught to have good table manners. As we grew up we learned how to behave in certain social settings. Now as golfers, we must take what we have learned to show good manners and etiquette to our course and those around us.

When I was first learning the game of golf I had no clue when it came to the subject of etiquette. I thought I was learning how to play golf and didn't realize I was learning manners as well. We have all been there! Especially those of us who were self-taught. Remember the first time you stepped on someone's putting line and they asked you not to? Chances are you probably didn't even realize it was a breach of etiquette.

I could probably write a small book when trying to explain and teach every aspect of golf etiquette, so instead; I'm going to make a few suggestions.

<u>Learn from others</u>; friends, family, spouses and playing partners. Don't be afraid to ask questions. Pay attention to their actions and how they behave.

Read information; do a search on the internet by typing in "golf etiquette". You will be amazed at the amount of information on this subject that is available.

<u>Teach others</u>; for those of us that play the game and know what is expected, it is important to present a good example. Don't be afraid to let someone know when a mistake has occurred but make sure you are polite when doing so.

Most of all; it is important that we teach our children golfing etiquette. Not only by what we say, but by what we do as well.

Here is a good example of how to be tactful when teaching your peers. "Hey Frank, I know you probably didn't see it so I went ahead and fixed that ball mark for you".

These are just a few examples on ways that we can learn and teach good golfing etiquette.

One universal thing that we all have in common is the love of the game. It can be frustrating and sometimes maddening, yet we continue to come back for more. We all at times, probably think, "why do I even play this goofy game"? Well, I guess the answer to that question is, because it's **fun!** So let's continue to keep it fun, for ourselves and those around us, by using good **Etiquette**. Something I always try to remember when thinking of etiquette is, The Golden Rule: "**Do onto others as you would have them do onto you**".

PLAN AHEAD

Golf members may book tee times two weeks in advance.

Social members may book tee times one week in advance (limited to four rounds per year)

If planning to play at the last minute, please call ahead to check on course availability. Walk-ons are allowed however, when showing up to play unannounced, you may have to wait longer than expected or not be able to play at all. We'll always do our best to accommodate all members, when possible.

PLEASE FOLLOW CLUB POLICIES & DRESS CODES

Protocols for Reciprocal Golf Play

When planning to play at other private golf facilities, here are some guidelines to get you started:

#1: Call the other golf facility first and let them know you are a member of a private club and are interested in reciprocating with their club.

#2: Verify that they will in fact reciprocate with our facility, and ask what days and times are available, whether you can bring guests, what are the dress code requirements and what can you expect to pay in fees.

#3: Generally at this point they will ask for a call from your Head Golf Professional to set it up. The staff at the SWCC golf shop will be happy to take over from here and make that call.

#4: During the winter months, when our facility is closed and you need a call from us to set up a reciprocal round, just leave a message on our golf shop phone (209-795-2141). We check for messages every other day and will get back to you as soon as poss.

By following these steps ahead of time we can eliminate the frustration of phone tag scenarios. There are many great private clubs out there, so take advantage of the benefits of being a member at Sequoia Woods!

Pace of Play

- Always keep pace with the group in front. If your group is keeping up, then no one can say you're playing too slow or holding them up.
- Play from the appropriate tees based on skill level. With young children, have them tee off from a distance from which they can reach the green within four shots. (Junior tees can be from the 200, 150 and 100 yard markers in the fairways)
- If you are intimidated from a forced carry or tee shot over water, it's ok to drop a ball and tee it up from the other side.
- Play ready golf. Don't stand around and watch each other. Be ready and focused for your next shot.
- If you're having a bad hole and have reached a large number of shots before getting to the green, pick up and move to the next hole. You will avoid frustration and have time to regroup for the next hole.
- Plan on making tee times based on your group's skill level. Beginners, families with young children and groups or couples that enjoy a slower and less pressured pace are encouraged to make inquiries with the golf shop staff as to the best times to play.

Golf Carts

- All members and guests must have a valid driver license in order to operate a golf cart on SWCC property. Private carts are not exempt from this rule.
- Fees are required for all motorized golf carts when used on SWCC property.
- Seasonal SWCC golf cart leases are available.
- All private cart owners must pay a day use fee or a yearly trail fee.
- SWCC cart rental rates are per person: \$12 for nine holes; \$20 for 18 holes.
- A member riding in another member's private cart must pay the appropriate cart fee.
- A member's guest does not have to pay to ride in the member's private cart.

Tee Times

- Members may make tee times two (2) weeks in advance.
- Please make it a point to cancel a tee time 24hrs in advance. As a courtesy to others if a time cannot be utilized please let us know the day before. If a member continues to ignore this policy, once warned, they may lose their two-week privilege.
- Tee time reservations are on a first call basis.
 Monthly standing times will not be allowed.
- Only the members themselves may make a tee time for a guest or relative. A member may call the shop in advance to "ok" a call from a friend or relative that will be playing as a guest of theirs.
- Season-long midweek time blocks will only be held for the Men's and Women's Clubs.
- Member/Guest outings occurring Friday, Saturday, Sunday and holidays will be limited to 24 players. Advance reservations are required.
- When making times for one (1), two (2), or three
 (3) players, be prepared to have other players assigned to your group.
- Single, walk-on players are welcome but may have to wait until a spot becomes available.
- Five (5) players in a group are only allowed Monday through Friday, or at the discretion of the pro shop staff. If a five-some cannot keep up with the pace of play, they will be asked to split up.
- Junior golfers may play without adult supervision only with the approval of the golf shop staff.
- Always make a point to call ahead when coming to the course without a scheduled tee time.
- Reciprocal guest play times at our club may only be made one week in advance.



Booking Tee Times at SWCC:

Full Golf Members:

- Parties of up to eight (8) players: can book any day and time, two weeks in advance
- Groups of 12 to 24 players: mid-week, any time.
- Groups of 12 to 24 players: weekends or holidays after 11:00am only, unless authorized by the head professional or first assistant.
- Large groups or outings scheduled in advance of two weeks must be made through the head professional or first assistant.
- Golf member may call and book times for up to four (4) un-accompanied guests, two weeks in advance, weekdays any time, weekends after 11:00am

Partial/Weekday Golf Members:

- Parties of up to eight (8) players: Monday through Friday, any time, with two weeks advance booking
- May play on Sundays after 12:00 noon, if available, with one week advance booking only
- ♦ Saturdays, Holidays and Sundays of a three-day weekend are not allowed.
- May book up to four (4) players on a weekend, one week advance booking, and pay regular fees.
- Golf member may call and book times for up to four (4) un-accompanied guests, one week in advance Monday through Friday only. No weekends or holidays.
- Groups of 12 to 24 players: Monday through Friday, after 10:00am, unless authorized by the head professional or first assistant.

Social Members:

- Must pay regular guest fees; limited to four (4) foursomes, per year
- May book a tee time one week in advance.
- ♦ Any time Monday through Friday and after 11:00am on weekends or holidays.
- Cannot book tee times for un-accompanied guests.


