Prior to qualifying as an SLT, Kayleigh worked as a support worker and learning support assistant in Loughborough. She worked with young people who had a diagnosis of Learning Disability, Autism and/or Visual Impairment.

Throughout her career, Kayleigh has worked with both adults and young people who have mental health needs and/or behaviour that challenges associated or alongside their Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN). In order to understand and support their communication more effectively, Kayleigh works alongside and integrally with other disciplines to provide better outcomes for the individual.

Kayleigh has a special interest in understanding and maximising the capacity of individuals subject to the Mental Capacity Act (2005), and the role of Speech and Language Therapy within this. Kayleigh is studying for a Master of Law (LLM) at Nottingham Trent University alongside her clinical work.
