Scripture Readings, Music and Mass Parts for Funerals



Holy Family Church 23 Forest Drive Nazareth, PA 18064 When a loved one dies a member of our Bereavement Ministry will contact you to plan the funeral mass. You may choose the readings, the music and to be involved in the Mass. Please look over the choices given to you so that when you meet with a member of the Bereavement Ministry you will have your selections finalized.

READINGS: The readings that are offered for funerals are available in this book. One Old Testament Reading and one New Testament reading should be chosen. Readers must be of the Catholic faith.

MUSIC: You may choose music from the list of songs that our Paradise Choir sings. The song titles are listed on page 14 of this booklet.

EULOGY: Because a eulogy is not part of the mass families who would like to briefly speak about heir loved one should do so at the funeral home during the time of calling hours. Eulogies are not permitted during the mass.

On the following page you will find the different ways your family/friends can be involved in the Mass. Our Bereavement Ministry will collect this information from you at the time of your meeting.

Placing of the Pall: The pall is placed on the casket or coffin as soon as it arrives at the church and will remain on the coffin during the remainder of the Mass. This is a white cloth, representing the white garment used at Baptism. This is usually done by the immediate family who accompany the casket to church with the undertaker.

Christian Symbol: This is a crucifix placed on top of the casket once the pall is placed.

Readers: You may choose two people to do the readings in church. If you choose one person to do both that is fine also. Readers must be of the Catholic faith. The first reader will come up after the priest sits down for the first time. Then there is a responsorial psalm. The second reading is done immediately following the responsorial psalm.

The readings you choose will be in a binder on the lectern/podium. Readers do not need to bring a copy of the reading with them. However, the reader should review and practice the reading before it is read that day. Please read slowly and clearly.

Gift Bearers: You may choose three people to bring up the gifts: the water, the wine and the Eucharist. They will do this when the song for the presentation of the gifts is announced.

Pall Bearers: A pallbearer is one of several participants who help carry the casket out of the church at the end of the funeral. You should choose approximately 6 people to do this.

Cremains: When a loved one is cremated the placing of the pall, the Christian symbol and the pall bearers are omitted. We will have a table at the front of the church where the cremains will be placed before Mass. You may choose to have a photo or a small vase of flowers there as well. Please notify the undertaker assisting you, of what your intentions are.

Old Testament Readings (1st Reading)

Isaiah 41: 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

You whom I have taken from the ends of the earth and summoned from its far-off places,
You whom I have called my servant,
whom I have chosen and will not cast off.

Fear not, I am with you; be not dismayed; I am your God. I will strengthen you, and help you, and uphold you with my right hand of justice.

Yes, all shall be put to shame and disgrace who vent their anger against you;

She obtains wool and flax and makes cloth with skillful hands. Like merchant ships, she secures her provisions from afar. She rises while it is still night, and distributes food to her household. She picks out a field to purchase; out of her earnings she plants a vineyard. She is girt about with strength, and sturdy are her arms. She enjoys the success of her dealings; at night her lamp is undimmed. She puts her hands to the distaff, and her fingers ply the spindle. She reaches out her hands to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy. She fears not the snow for her household; all her charges are doubly clothed. She makes her own coverlets; fine linen and purple are her clothing. Her husband is prominent at the city gates as he sits with the elders of the land. She makes garments and sells them, and stocks the merchants with belts. She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs at the days to come. She opens her mouth in wisdom, and on her tongue is kindly counsel. She watches the conduct of her household, and eats not her food in idleness. New Testament Readings (2nd Reading)

2 Corinthians 4:16-18, 5:10

A reading from the 2nd letter to the Corinthians

Therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day.

For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.

For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

A reading from the first book of John

See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

1 Corinthians 13:1-13

A Reading from the book of the Corinthians

If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal.

And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing.

If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, (love) is not pompous, it is not inflated,

it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth.

It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never fails. If there are prophecies, they will be brought to nothing; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be brought to nothing.

For we know partially and we prophesy partially,

but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.

When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things.

At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known.

So faith, hope, love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

1 Corinthians 15:20-23, 24-28

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead came also through a human being.

For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power.

For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet.

The last enemy to be destroyed is death, for "he subjected everything under his feet." But when it says that everything has been subjected, it is clear that it excludes the one who subjected everything to him.

When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will (also) be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all.

Peter 1:3-9 (Accompanies Wisdom 3:1-6,9)

A Reading from the letter of St. Peter

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you

who by the power of God are safeguarded through faith, to a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the final time.

In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Although you have not seen him you love him; even though you do not see him now yet believe in him, you rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, as you attain the goal of (your) faith, the salvation of your souls.

Romans 6:3-9

A Reading from the letter to the Romans

Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.

We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin.

For a dead person has been absolved from sin.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him.

We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

The Word of the Lord.

Romans 14:7-12

A Reading from the letter to the Romans

None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself.

For if we live, we live for the Lord, * and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's.

For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why then do you judge your brother? Or you, why do you look down on your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of God;

For it is written:

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall give praise to God."

So (then) each of us shall give an account of himself (to God).

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

A Reading from the book of Thessalonians

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep.

For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first.

Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord.

Therefore, console one another with these words.
