Housing

#1---Families need housing they can afford/lack of affordable housing.

#2---High cost of rent/utility deposits.

#3---Lack of enough subsidized housing.

Employment

#1---Lack of jobs with better pay and benefits.

#2---Lack of skills to obtain jobs.

#3---Lack of affordable transportation to and from job.

Health

#1---Lack of income to pay for adult dental, hearing and/or vision services.

#2---Lack of affordable transportation for health care services, grocery, and/or food pantries.

#3---Lack of health resources in the community.

Top priorities in other categories

Education---Lack of affordable high-quality child-care

Income and Asset Building---Lack of education on how to budget assets

Civic Engagement---Lack of youth programs/activities

Support Services---Elderly Services; Transportation Services; Life Skills

- All 3 counties identified the top 3 areas of concern as Housing, Health & Employment
- All 3 counties had consistent responses for priorities in Income/Asset Building and Civic Engagement
 - Income & Asset Building-Lack of education on how to budget assets
 - Civic Engagement- Lack of youth programs/activities
- Oldham ranked lack of post-secondary education (vocational/college) as highest education concern
- Trimble identified transportation as a priority for employment (to and from job).
