## **Support Service/Emergency**

#1---Life skills (budgeting/bill paying)

#2---Transportation services

#3---Meal programs & Emergency financial assistance services

## Top priorities in other categories

**Education**---Lack of post-secondary education (vocational skills/college education), Lack of affordable high-quality childcare, Lack of certificate/degree programs offered locally

**Employment**---Lack of affordable childcare during work hours, Lack of jobs with better pay and benefits, Lack of affordable transportation to and from job

**Health**---Lack of income to pay for adult dental, hearing and/or vision services, Lack of affordable transportation for health care services, grocery, and/or food pantries, Lack of community focus on preventative healthcare

**Civic Engagement**---Lack of education on how to join neighborhood associations, community boards, advisory groups or similar organizations, Lack of leadership development for volunteer and civic engagement activities for seniors and youth
