



Learn More About Swamp White Oak!

Scientific Name: *Quercus bicolor*

MATURE SIZE: Height 50–60 ft Width 50–60 ft

Swamp white oak is a striking tree with attractive peeling bark, which is especially prevalent on young trees. The lustrous, lobed leaves have a two-tone appearance, dark green on top with a silvery-white underside. Fall color is an orange-gold to yellow in mid-autumn. An excellent shade tree for any landscape. Swamp white oak is one of the easiest oaks to transplant and is more tolerant of poor drainage than other oaks. Plant in full sun. Avoid high pH soils or plants may develop chlorotic (yellowing) leaves. Prune oaks in the dormant season to avoid attracting beetles that may carry oak wilt.
