



Learn More About Northern Red Oak!

Scientific Name: *Quercus rubra*

MATURE SIZE: Height 60–75 ft Width 60–75 ft

Northern red oak is a Midwest native and is one of the faster growing oaks for the home landscape. Their large crowns provide excellent shade, reducing surface and air temperatures, and lowering energy costs for nearby buildings. The leaves are handsome throughout the year, emerging pinkish-red, turning lustrous dark green in summer, and changing to russet-red to bright red in autumn. Its tolerance of salt and air pollution makes it a good tree for more exposed areas. Northern red oak prefers a well-drained, rich, woodland site. It grows best in sandy, loam soil. This tree is tolerant of air pollution and salt. Prune oaks in the dormant season to avoid attracting beetles that may carry oak wilt.
