WOMEN PLAYING HAMLET by William Missouri Downs March 30-April 2 and April 6-9

Hamlet is a challenge for any actor, but when Jessica is cast as the titular character, it sends her into an existential tailspin. It doesn't help that her acting coach is borderline abusive, or that every Starbucks barista with an MFA tells her she's too young for the role. Or that she's somehow managed to make Sir Patrick Stewart her nemesis. Or that she's a woman. How can Jessica figure out "to be or not to be," when she can't even figure out herself? Featuring an all-female cast performing multiple roles.

THE CHINESE LADY by Lloyd Suh June 8-11 and 15-18

Inspired by a true story, 14-year-old Afong May is brought to America in 1834, the first Chinese woman to set foot on U.S. soil. She is put on display for the paying public, who are mesmerized by her exotic ways, and unnerved by her bound feet. As the decades wear on, her celebrated sideshow comes to define and challenge her very sense of identity. The Chinese Lady is a dark, poetic, yet whimsical portrait of America, unearthing our hidden history with humor and insight.

THE DOG LOGS by CJ Johnson August 10-13 and 17-20

From a tough Rottweiler with neighbor problems to an aging mongrel who discovers love late in life, this collection of hilarious and heartbreaking monologues examines the lives of dogs from every breed, age, and situation. Telling stories of friendship, romance, and revenge, THE DOG LOGS is a refreshing take on canine life that is touching and surprisingly human.

WAITING FOR GODOT by Samuel Beckett October 12-15 and 19-22

The story revolves around two seemingly homeless men waiting for someone—or something—named Godot. Vladimir and Estragon wait near a tree, inhabiting a drama spun of their own consciousness. The result is a comical wordplay of poetry, dreamscapes, and nonsense, which has been

interpreted as mankind's inexhaustible search for meaning. Beckett's language pioneered an expressionistic minimalism that captured the existential post-World War II Europe. His play remains one of the most magical and beautiful allegories of our time.

BAD JEWS A Comedy by Joshua Harmon December 7-10 and 14-17

Set in Manhattan, the night after their grandfather's funeral, a family's younger generation battles over a precious heirloom, with intense debates over who is most deserving of the inheritance. Will it be volatile and self-assured Daphna, who considers herself a "real" Jew, with an Israeli boyfriend to prove it; or cousin Liam, who Daphna calls a "bad" Jew, with his secular ways and non-Jewish girlfriend? Stuck in the middle is Liam's brother, Jonah, who desperately tries to stay out of the fray. The vicious and occasionally hilarious brawl over family, faith and legacy is must-see theatre.




