Windows made its world debut on March 25th of 2024 at The Town Hall, in New York City. The production was directed by Mitchell Maxwell and starred Avantika, Craig Bierko, Tony Danza, Jeffrey Donovan, Erin Darke, Tovah Feldshuh, Adam Kantor, Carolyn McCormick, Jesse Nager and Tonya Pinkens.

Windows is being presented by special arrangement with the play's author, Ms. Tawni O'Dell. Big Dawg Productions is the first company to present Windows outside of that run, and presently the only company in the country to hold production rights, due to our financial support for the play's premier.

We are most grateful to Ms. O'Dell for her reciprocating our support of her work and allowing Big Dawg to deliver a first look to our audience.

Bios

Tawni O'Dell (Playwright) is a critically acclaimed, New York Times bestselling novelist who opened her first play, When It Happens to You, to strong reviews off-Broadway in 2019. She's the author of six novels including Back Roads, which was an Oprah Winfrey Book Club selection and a motion picture that premiered at the 2018 TriBeCa Film Festival with a screenplay adapted by Tawni. She also wrote and co-produced the popular audio drama, Rewrites. Her highly acclaimed podcast Closing the Distance featuring Kathleen Turner, William Hurt, Tony Danza, Jason Alexander, and Kelli O' Hara is in pre-production for a Broadway engagement in 2022-2025 retitled Windows. Her novels have been published in over thirty countries and her writing has appeared in anthologies, magazines, and newspapers throughout the world. She's the mother of two, a native of western Pennsylvania, and a graduate of Northwestern University.

Holli Saperstein (Director) is an actor, director and producer. She has been seen on stage in Misery, Funny Girl, Becoming Dr. Ruth, Erma Bombeck: At Wits End, Shakespeare in Love, Parallel Lives, The Laramie Project, Night Mother, The Diviners, Vanya, Sonya, Masha and Spike, Good People, and The Guys. She was the Director of The Diary of Anne Frank, Crimes of the Heart, The Explorers Club, and The Cake. Her production company, Panache Productions, has won awards for their outstanding productions in Wilmington including Fun Home and Lizzie. Holli has appeared on film and television in Are You There God, It's me Margaret, Stranger Things, Halloween Kills, The Act, Vice Principals, as well as other upcoming roles.

Jennifer Opresnick (Assistant Director) is excited to be shadowing Director, Holli Saperstein in Big Dawg's presentation of Windows. Jennifer has also shadowed Director Steve Vernon on Waiting for Godot and was involved with Big Dawg on The Chinese Lady. Jennifer has worked in the film industry in Wilmington for 20 years and is grateful for the opportunity to also be involved in Wilmington's theater community.

Terri Hsu (Backstage Superhero and Sam's Voice) is jazzed about *Windows*. She's directed and managed stages from Savannah to Wilmington, including a double take on *Every Christmas Story Ever Told* with Big Dawg Productions. To be one of eleven chosen out Wilmington's deep pool of actors is an honor for all of us. Lastly, Kent is both excited and honored to share the stage with his scene partner, Kevin Green, one of the first names he heard when joining the community and a driving force of Wilmington Theater.


