From the Pastor's Heart: A Season of Renewal and Gratitude

I want to begin by expressing my deep gratitude for the gift of time away for Spiritual Renewal Leave. What a blessing it has been to step aside for a season; to breathe, to listen, and to allow God to renew my spirit. Your support and prayers made this time possible, and I return to you with a heart filled with peace and gratitude.

During these past weeks, I experienced renewal in so many ways. I enjoyed intentional time with my family, finding a new rhythm of prayer and quiet with God. I even began horseback riding lessons, something that was both exhilarating and deeply therapeutic. Those moments in the saddle became a tangible lesson in faith: learning what I could control, letting go of what I could not, and trusting the gifts that God has already placed within me.



I have learned there is something sacred in the art of horseback riding—a rhythm of trust and grace shared between humans and horses. This season also brought moments of deep grief and grace. I walked with families through the loss of our beloved members **Mrs. Evelyn Wolff** and **Connie Doyle**, and I continued to grieve the passing of my dear friend, **Wetherly Kennedy**. In each of these sacred moments, God reminded me again that faith is not passive—it is a movement. It is trust in the unseen, and it is gratitude even when our hearts are tender.



One of the greatest blessings of this time was traveling to Kericho, Kenya to teach at the Pastors Conference hosted by Gateway to Victory School. Standing alongside fellow ministers and sharing God's Word was a humbling and joy -filled experience. I went to pour out what I could, but I returned feeling that I had received even more than I gave.

I carried Wetherly in my heart, as she had planned to go with me to help the teachers at Gateway. I honored Wetherly in my teaching to the pastors and celebrated Wetherly by loving everyone and sharing joy.

Wetherly left so much joy with the children and families of Gateway last

February and I am forever grateful for Chuck & Cris Darsey who not only introduced me to the ministry and family of Gateway to Victory School but have also traveled with me each time. 

"The Book of James" BY: FRANCES CHAN



True faith produces fruit. A faith without action and without life change is ultimately a dead faith. The book of James speaks to the realities of a living faith in Jesus—the kind of roll-up-your-sleeves and get-your-hands-dirty discipleship that is borne out of an authentic relationship with the risen Lord. James writes to believers who know suffering, who've faced trials, and who ultimately desire a deep relationship with God.

Francis Chan unpacks the dense truth contained in the book of James in front of the iconic backdrop of San Francisco, the city where he lives and ministers. Through 6 weeks, Francis works through James verse-by-verse, challenging followers of Christ to move beyond a private, intellectual knowledge of God and His Word, to a vibrant faith that impacts every square inch of life.



Gateway to Victory is dedicated to serving the children of Kenya. Their mission is to love, teach, feed, and nurture them in every way possible. They strive to shape their future, transforming them into happy, healthy, and self-sustaining adults who seek God in all they do.

The school is in Kericho, Kenya and educates, feeds, and ministers to students grades PreK – 8<sup>th</sup>. Gateway to Victory is a non-profit organization that is run by volunteers who have a heart to serve God through helping the Orphans and Vulnerable children of Kenya. They can attend school through the generous donations of Gateway to Victory Supporters.

Gateway to Victory's sole income comes from donations and student sponsorship. Student sponsorship is only \$420 per year. Below you will find links to our payment platforms.
