SUNDAY MONTHLY MEETING

PETROL and DIESEL PHASE-OUT

At the October meeting I introduced one of our members, Edward Pipon, who wished to share his concerns over the "Petrol and Diesel phase-out" which the States are proposing to help the island reach net-zero carbon emissions by 2050. Edward has been in the motor trade for over 40 years, 33 of these self employed. The importation and registration of all new fossil-fuelled cars and





small vans will end from 2030 under the Governments proposals. I have attached the report that Edward has compiled and gave to us at the meeting. There will also be public meetings that islanders will be invited to attend to meet the consultation team as follows:

Monday December 8th 2025, 11am to 2pm Charing Cross, St Helier

Monday January 8th 2026, 11am to 2pm Charing Cross, St Helier

Separate events will also be held for members of the motor trades, motor sport organisations and vehicle owners' clubs. Dates are yet to be confirmed and those interested in attending are asked to email climateemergency@gov.je

These proposals will have a significant effect on all vehicle clubs and organisations on the island, it is of great importance that we voice our concerns on the propositions otherwise we shall be owning a vehicle that will not be allowed to go anywhere.

The October Vehicle of the Month Award was presented to Steven Hunt for his beautiful 1959 Singer Gazelle IIIA convertible. Congratulations Steven!





J111959 is a 1959 Singer Gazelle IIIA convertible. The model was manufactured only between 1959 and 1960. Just 12,491 such cars were built at Ryton-on-Dunsmore.

It is a two door convertible with a four speed manual floor change with the addition of overdrive.

It runs on a 1494 cc 4 cylinder ohv high compression engine and was first sold from Rootes London, Piccadilly on registration 974 WMY. The cost then was £848 including purchase tax. I found the car through the Singer Owner's Club, having been taken to school in my father's 1966 Singer Gazelle series VI, which he still owns and runs, he always hankered after the convertible version.



The car had been laid up for twelve years following the death of the previous owner and my brother Ian and I went across to look at it. Miraculously, Ian got it running and so began a lengthy journey of restoration over six years.

Once the body was stripped it was evident how much filler had been used. Fully committed, I then used two garages to restore it, the first going into liquidation early on. The sec-

ond garage in Hertfordshire then undertook the full body, engine, chrome, interior and soft top restoration. The original colour scheme has been maintained of pearl grey with pippin red and red interior.



Having entered the Jersey Concours event in 2024, the engine became lumpy and the car was laid up for almost a year until engine wizard, Frank Laurens agreed to take a look. Frank entirely stripped the twin Solex carburettors (which were a special feature on this model only), and bathed them for weeks, cleaning them thoroughly. Reassembling them, he then by touch and ear brought them back to life and today the car starts on the button and ticks over as it would have in the showroom.

The car has taken part in Singer rallies in France and the UK and may make an appearance next year at the NEC, as did its sister car in 2014.

The three position hood gives it great elegance and it even has a full tonneau.

It is thanks to enthusiasts and the skills of people like Frank who ensure motoring history is kept going.
