INTRO: WHAT IS EXCELLENCE?

Excellence isn't about being the best. It's about being your best.

Let's talk about excellence. You hear the word all the time in sports, school, and life. But what does it actually mean from a Christian perspective?

1. EXCELLENCE IS LIVING UP TO YOUR GOD-GIVEN POTENTIAL

God created you with a unique set of gifts and purpose. You're not called to compare—you're called to commit.

Colossians 3:23 (NIV): "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters."

Giving your all isn't about perfection—it's about effort. It's about showing up and using what God gave you.

Interactive Question:

Have you ever walked away from a practice or game and thought, "I could've given more"?

That's not about guilt—it's about growth. Excellence asks: "Did I do all I could with what I had today?"

2. EXCELLENCE NEVER SACRIFICES INTEGRITY

Excellence is how you do what you do—not just the outcome.

Proverbs 10:9 (ESV): "Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but he who makes his ways crooked will be found out."

You can be a star athlete and still fail if your character crumbles. Integrity is doing the right thing—even when no one's watching.

Real Talk Moment:

Have you ever felt pressure to cheat, trash talk, or go along with something just because "everyone else is doing it"?

That's the world's definition of winning: "Win at all costs." But God calls you to: "Honor Me at all costs."

3. REFLECT: WHAT ARE YOU CHASING?

2 Timothy 4:7 (NIV): ?I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.?

Paul didn?t say he won every race?he said he finished well. That?s excellence rooted in faith and integrity.

Reflection Questions:

- Am I giving my best effort in sports, school, and relationships?
- Do my choices reflect Christ?
- Where do I need to raise my standard of excellence?
- Where do I need to protect my integrity, even when it?s hard?

CONCLUSION: PLAY FOR MORE THAN THE SCORE

You were made for more than trophies and stats. You were made to reflect Jesus in how you live, train, compete, and lead.

True excellence is becoming who God created you to be?and never compromising integrity to get there.
