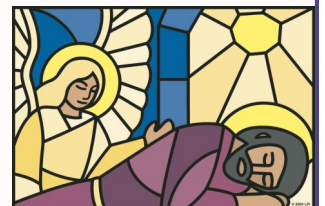

An Opportunity ... to Assist a Holy Spirit Parishioner, Soon to Embark on a Mission Trip to Honduras

Dear Parish of the Holy Spirit,

My name is **Dylan Howard**. I am a freshman at Washington State University (WSU) this year. I grew up in Kennewick my entire life and graduated from Kamiakin High School in June of 2025. When I was still living in Kennewick, I attended 5:00 p.m. Mass every Sunday from around 4th grade. I return to the Parish of the Holy Spirit for Mass whenever I am back home.

At WSU I have been blessed to find a wonderful Catholic community at the Newman Center on campus, Saint Thomas More. Over the last four months I have been able to really get to know the missionaries from St. Paul's Outreach on campus. In October I was asked by one of the second-year missionaries, Max Karas, if I would be interested in serving on a mission trip to Trujillo, Honduras over the upcoming Spring Break in 2026. Something came across my heart to jump at this opportunity, so I did.

I am planning on serving at **La Finca in Trujillo, Honduras** from March 21-29 of 2026 with 10 other students and 2 missionaries from WSU. La Finca is an orphanage for children from abusive, neglectful, and traumatic households. Tias, "aunts", along with residents, are the regular caretakers serving at La Finca. On the grounds there is a school and a health clinic. The services of the school and clinic aren't just for children of La Finca, but also for the people who live in the surrounding towns.

At La Finca our main goal will be to create a positive relationship with the children there. Most of them don't have a positive representation or experience of adults in their lives because of their traumatic pasts. We would also be helping in the classroom: Gym, Math, English, and with any improvement projects around La Finca: painting, replacing floors or fences.

I'm asking for your support as I prepare to embark on this mission trip. As you can imagine, it isn't cheap to fly from the United States to Central America. My goal is to raise \$2,100 dollars. Any financial help towards that goal is extremely appreciated. And if I go over that goal, the money will go to supporting the good work being done at La Finca and the collective efforts of my fellow students going on this trip.

The Gift of Questions

We sometimes imagine that a sign of a strong faith is firm conviction and freedom from doubt. However, despite our imaginings, the authentic experiences of saints and ordinary people alike seem to point in another direction. The question of John the Baptist today—“Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?” (Matthew 11:3)—suggests that John is filled with questions, and these are important questions because they are asked from the depths of King Herod’s prison, which is not exactly the place of idle musings or concerns.

If John, who is a great saint and a man who encountered Jesus and witnessed the powerful manifestation of the Holy Spirit at his baptism, can have a question, doesn’t it suggest that questions are acceptable—perhaps even needed? Perhaps questioning is an indication of faithfulness, not a lack of faith. Questions do not suggest that something is missing; rather, they confirm that something is growing and developing. The Baptist could just have easily said, “Jesus, you are doing and saying more than I ever imagined possible. Please help me to understand,” or, to quote an unnamed saint, “I do believe, help my unbelief!” (Mark 9:24).

God will not shatter, and faith will not collapse, because you have questions or doubts.

Experience suggests that questions and doubts strengthen our belief and our commitment to a life of faith. ●

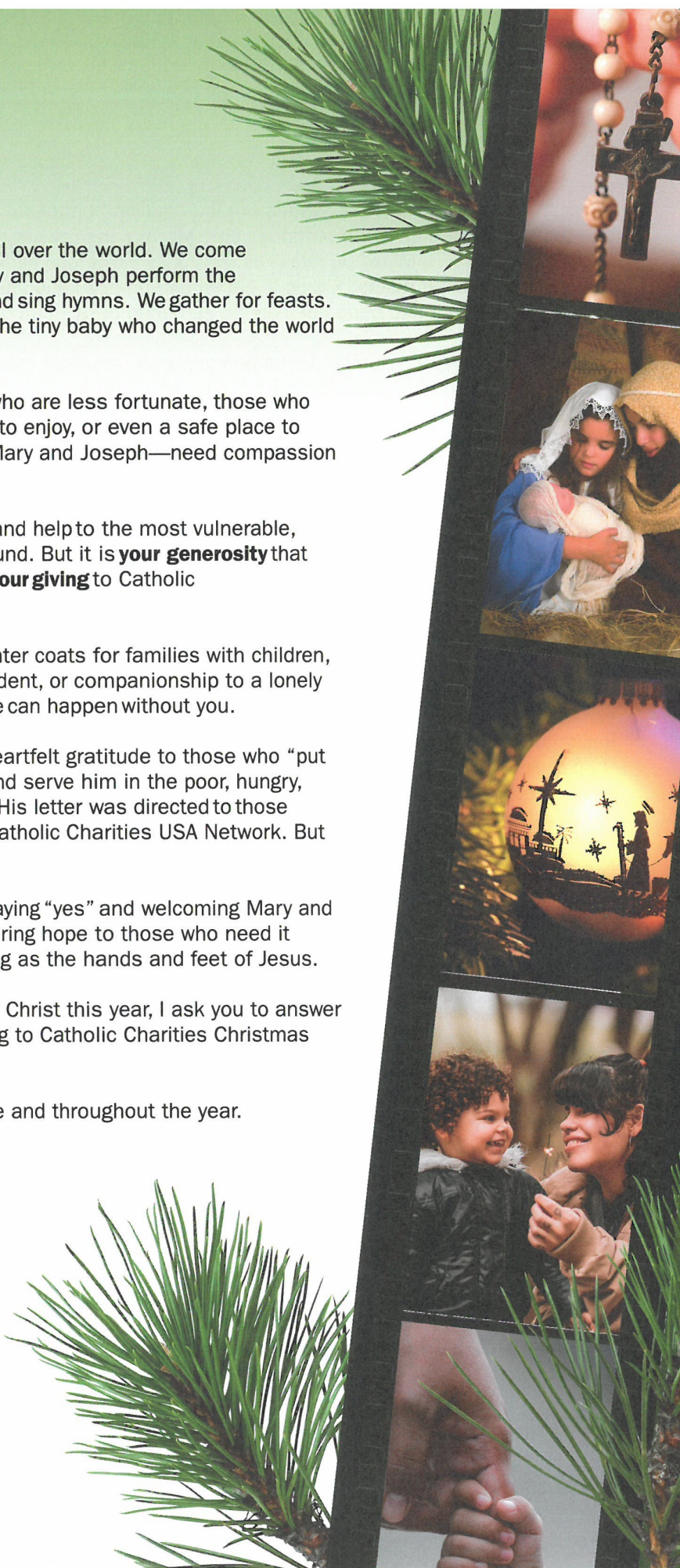
As you and your family celebrate the birth of Christ this year, I ask you to answer the Lord's call to help those in need by giving to Catholic Charities Christmas Collection.

Dear Padre,

Does the Bible say that Mary was in her sixth month of pregnancy at the Annunciation?

The announcement of Jesus' birth in Luke begins, "In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph...and the virgin's name was Mary" (Luke 1:26-27). This Scripture passage taken out of context could possibly give the impression that "in the sixth month" refers to Mary. However, it refers to Mary's cousin Elizabeth, who was in the sixth month of her pregnancy with John the Baptist. The proper context is a few verses before this one that reads, "Elizabeth conceived, and she went into seclusion for five months" (Luke 1:24).

Regarding Mary's pregnancy, at the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel tells her, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus.... The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God" (Luke 1:31, 35). Gabriel also informs Mary, "And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren" (Luke 1:36).

In general, women already in their sixth month of pregnancy would likely be aware of their condition, and it would not be easy to conceal from others. ●
