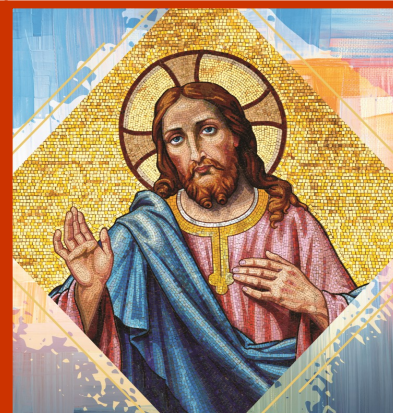

## All for Jesus

**T**oday's gospel passage is challenging. If anyone other than Jesus told you that if you love your own family "more than me," you are "not worthy of me," you would laugh in their face! Or, is this what scholars call a "semitism"—a culturally conditioned exaggeration used for effect? What about you are "not worthy of me" unless you "take up [your] cross and follow me," or "whoever finds his life will lose it"? Does Jesus mean these literally, or are these metaphors? And what is "a prophet's reward"?

A friend of mine tried an experiment. He took the Gospel of Matthew and read it through from start to finish as if he had never seen it before. He was astonished! Jesus was serious. He meant it—all of it. Try it yourself without looking for loopholes.

The key in the reading today is "for my sake." The standard, the rule, that absolute mark is "me," that is, Jesus himself, only Jesus, always Jesus. And Jesus sets that mark very high. Take up your cross? Jesus was abandoned on the cross. Jesus gave away his Mother from the cross. Jesus lost his life on the cross. But he found that life: resurrection! That is "a prophet's reward," is it not?

I have to love Jesus' promise, a special "reward" for just sharing "a cup of cold water" with a "little one."

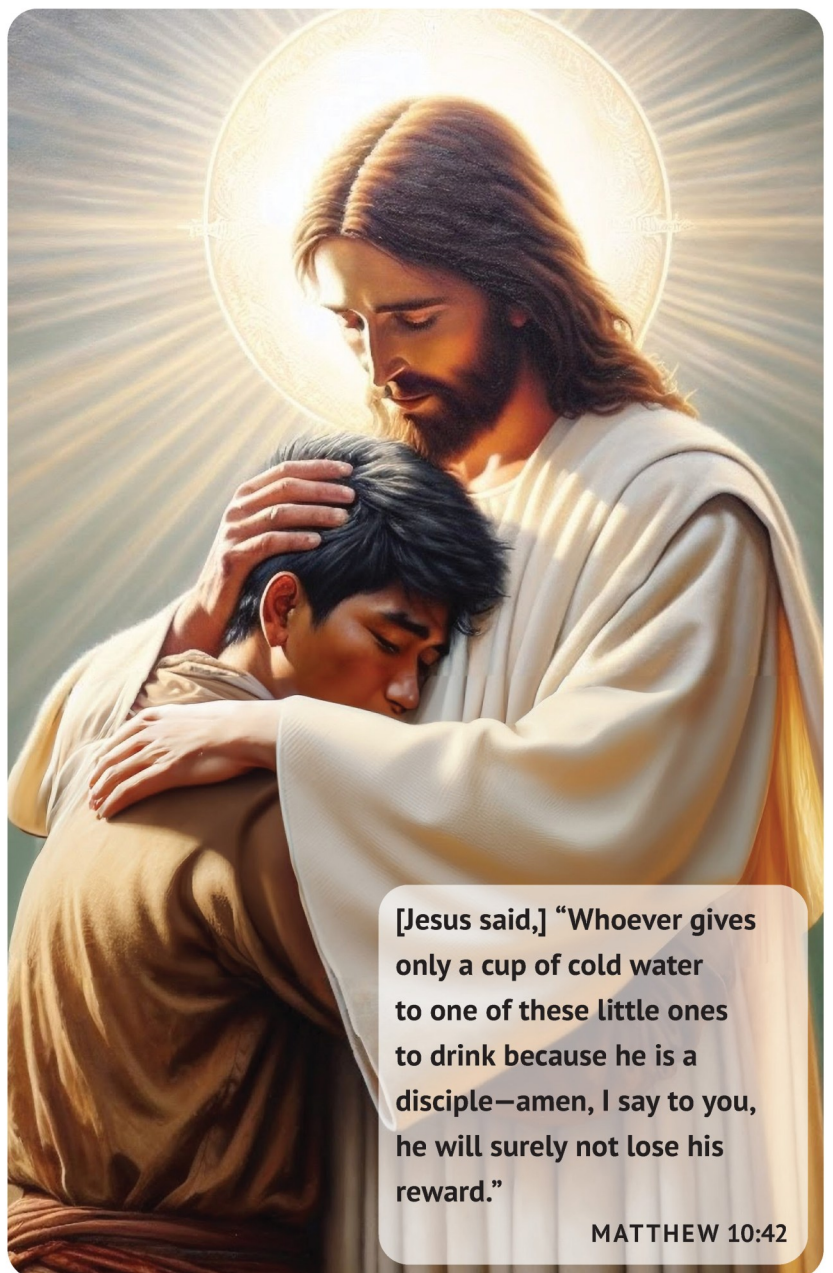
It reminds me of Honduras, where I live. Here, a cup of cold water can make the difference between life and death. And that is no exaggeration! ●

# Priest Retirement and Seminarian Education Collection

This important collection supports our 16 retired priests, including Fr. John O'Shea, who have faithfully served our community for many years. Forty-five priests are actively serving in the Diocese of Yakima. Ten of the active priests are 65 years of age and older

There will be up to 14 men studying for the priesthood in the fall of 2026. These men will serve us in the diocese.

This Special Collection helps support the annual operating costs for the retired priests and seminarians' education.

## 1. Total Annual Operating Budget for Seminarian Education: \$1,025,100

- 14 Seminarians @ ~\$73,200/each
- Annual Operating Costs for each student include tuition, room and board, fees, books, health insurance and medical expenses.

## 2. Total Annual Operating Budget for Retired Priests: \$863,100

- 16 @ ~\$53,900 each
- Annual Operating Costs include retirement, health insurance, medical expenses, and retreats.

We are blessed to have Javier Castro and Ramses Yates, seminarians for the Diocese of Yakima, with us this weekend to talk about the impact of this collection.

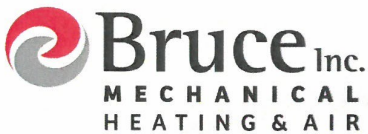

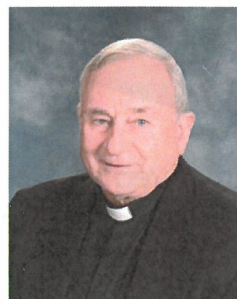

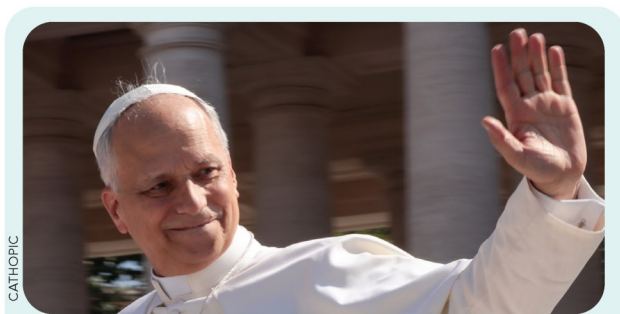
Your experience is not unknown to many Catholic parents. Many mothers and fathers could probably carry on a good conversation with you about their concerns for the faith lives of their children.

The journey of faith has many paths. An individual may think more deeply about the meaning of life or may find religion after a momentous experience or in the process of gathering with a community in which they find support, clarity, shared beliefs, or guidelines for living morally. For those of us who grew up believing, chances are, we were not introduced to religion through logic. Children are brought to church long before they are aware of their need for God.
