




MSGR. GONZALES FUND Honoring Msgr. Gabe Gonzales' Legacy

Msgr. Gabe Gonzales was deeply passionate about education and had a genuine heart for families in need. He frequently voiced his concerns regarding the escalating costs of Catholic education and the challenges it posed for those with limited resources. In tribute to his legacy of service, compassion, and dedication to accessible quality Catholic education, St. Anastasia Parish has established the Msgr. Gonzales Scholarship Fund.

This year, the Fund raised over \$4,000, and provided \$9,000 in tuition assistance to families experiencing financial difficulties, ensuring their children can access a Catholic education at St. Anastasia School. Additionally, the fund awarded one St. Anastasia student a \$1,000 scholarship to attend a Catholic High School.





MSGR VADAKIN ARTS & EDUCATION FUND



The Arts & Education Fund was established in the fall of 2001 under the guidance of Msgr. Royale M. Vadakin. This initiative was created to honor the 50th "Golden Anniversary" of St. Anastasia and serves as a legacy fund aimed at expanding parishwide activities in both arts and education for adults and students.

This year, the Fund collected over \$4,000 in donations and the Board of Trustees approved funding of \$21,803 in various parish needs, which includes:

- Commissioned artwork of St. Anastasia
- TACSC leadership conferences
- Parent Education Night
- The portrait of Christ's crucifixion
- · Bible Study

The Msgr. Vadakin Arts and Education Fund is a restricted fund, guided by the appointed Board of Trustees and managed at the discretion of the Pastor.
