ASSIGNMENT SUMMARY

Responsible for providing instruction to fixed-route transit operators on the safe operation of fixed-route transit vehicles, including familiarization of routes and schedules and other transit related matters. Assignments include preparation for and classroom instruction, curriculum development, CDL instruction, and on-road training. Maintain records, prepare reports, and submit daily progress reports to the training supervisor, as required. Attend training as needed.

COMPENSATION

The hourly base wage of the selected candidate will be paid during the training period. Upon successful completion of the training period, compensation shall be 115% of the employee's current wage, at the appropriate step, for all hours worked as a fixed-route transit operator instructor.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Works under the direction supervision of the operations supervisors and the general direction of the operations manager.
- Provides for instruction of safe operation of CTS transit vehicles including the familiarization of routes, schedules, and other transit related matters to fixed-route operators.
- Prepare and maintain records and reports as required, including trainee daily progress reports.
- Attends training sessions as required.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Experience: Current CTS employee who has successfully completed the probationary period as a fixed-route operator.

Licensures and Certifications:

- Maintain a valid Washington State class B driver's license with passenger endorsement and air-brake restriction removed and a U.S. DOT Medical Certificate.
- Ability to obtain a Driver Training School Instructor License from the Washington State Department of Licensing including:
 - 1. Being a licensed driver for at least 5 years.
 - Holding a CDL of the same (or higher) class and with all the endorsements necessary to operate the CMV for which training is to be provided and has at least two years of experience driving a CMV requiring a CDL of the same or higher class and endorsement.
