1. **Global Membership Highlights:** Five new Chartered Clubs in Districts 2 - NY, Ontario, Quebec, Canada, 17 - Hong Kong; Macau; Malaysia; Philippines; Singapore; Thailand, 24 - Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales (except Albury-Wodonga Inc. and Northern Rivers Inc.), Australia, 26 - Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales (except Albury-Wodonga Inc. and Northern Rivers Inc.), Australia, & 30 - Bulgaria; France; Germany; Italy;

Monaco; Romania; Switzerland. There are 48 more in formation, however a few may need to renew their Authorizations as they are only good for 2 years.

- 3. Golden Z Club Only Resolution from Brisbane Convention, see below, Working on coding & website piece. Launch in February. We can add our GZ members to the Sponsoring Clubs' Membership. Training will be held on 2/4/25 and 2/15/25. Jeanie Beccue and I will attend as will the sponsor from LaSalle Peru and Lincoln Clubs who sponsor GZ Clubs in District 6. ZCO Joliet was considering a Charter although we need to follow up with them given this great news.
- 4. **Membership Core Values:** Work is underway on creating a values statement for Zontians from the Core Values and Code of Conduct Working Group. Information has been sent to district, area and club leaders to start discussions with members now about their root beliefs and drive to build a better world for women and girls. Governors and Lt. Governors were messaged on 12/3/24 by the Working Group. We were asked to begin discussions in our Area Meetings. A PowerPoint will be presented at each workshop.
- 5. **Affiliation Agreements:** This document must be signed by each District, then by each Club within the District. I must sign and submit the District Agreement by 2/28/25. It is on our February Board Meeting Agenda. I will then need to discuss this with each President as there will be little time for their compliance (3/5/25-5/15/25).
 - 15 January: Email to governors with instructions to sign and return district affiliation agreement.
 - 28 February: Deadline for districts to return district affiliation agreement to ZI Headquarters.
 - 5 March: Email to club presidents with instructions to sign and return club affiliation agreement.
 - 15 May: Deadline for clubs to return club affiliation agreement to ZI Headquarters.





The NGO CSW Forum is organized by and for global civil society, non-governmental organizations, and feminists to connect them with the official <u>United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UN CSW)</u> process. With hundreds of events, the NGO CSW Forum informs, engages, and inspires grassroots efforts and gender equality advocacy around the world. While the NGO CSW Forum runs parallel to and complements the UN CSW, it is a separate process with separate organizers.

Without the ERA, the U.S. and Wisconsin State Constitutions do not explicitly guarantee that the rights it protects are held equally by all citizens without regard to sex. The first — and still the only right — that the U.S. Constitution specifically affirms and applies equally to women and men is the right to vote.



SPOTLIGHT ON DISTRICT 6'S NEWEST Z CLUB, HOSTED BY THE ZONTA CLUB OF MILWAUKEE

On Tuesday, January 28, district 6, and the ZONTA Club of Milwaukee welcomed the University School of Milwaukee Z Club during their chartering ceremony.

Over 20 students were present, said the oath and received Z Club pins and yellow roses. The Club leadership approached the Milwaukee Zonta Club asking if a Z club would be possible. They have already done some amazing advocacy projects, and we expect to see a lot from these young women and men. Join us in welcoming them to District 6.

Report from Kate Gay, the Z Club Academic Sponsor and new member of the Zonta Club of Milwaukee:

One of their first projects is to establish a relationship and communication on topics with the young women and teenage girls from Gashora "Voices of Hope", at Journey House Actions in Rwanda Here are some of the topics:

- Breaking Stereotypes about Girls Challenging beliefs that limit girls' potential, such as the idea that girls can't excel in leadership or STEM fields.
- Menstrual Health Addressing the stigma around menstruation and discussing access to menstrual products, which remains a challenge for many girls here.
- Girls' Education & Career Dreams Sharing stories of girls who have pursued unique careers to inspire one another and challenge the idea that certain roles are "for boys only."
- Menstruation Cycle: learning how to count safety days

The Z Club has exchanged introductory videos about themselves and their aspirations. Now the USM girls are making videos on these topics. They hope to share more resources with the group in the future and to make a fundraiser to help them purchase cloth to sew reusable sanitary napkins. We have a good relationship with the Milwaukee AFJHAR group and could possibly send materials, books, etc, in June when we know they are making a trip to Gashora. They generously took five suitcases of sports jerseys over for them in January.
