Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian Church of Naples,

I am honored that the Pastor Nominating Committee has invited me to be presented to you as its candidate to serve as the next Senior Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Naples. I am excited to meet each of you in person, and in the meantime, I hope this letter conveys a sense of who I am and why I feel called to this church.

First Presbyterian Church of Naples is a congregation with vital and meaningful ministries. Biography of Rev. Dr. Aaron Janklow

The Rev. Dr. Aaron Janklow is currently Senior Pastor and Head of Staff at Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City. Born in Fort Lauderdale, FL, Aaron grew up in New Jersey. While he always considered himself a Christian, Aaron says that the most pivotal moment in his life was a mission trip to the Dominican Republic with the youth group of the Presbyterian Church in Westfield, NJ. Working on the reconstruction of a school and community hub led to the strengthening of his faith and an emphasis on mission and service, which, in turn, led to weekly volunteering at the Agape Soup Kitchen in Elizabeth, NJ, and fostering a significant aspect of his ministry today.

Aaron attended Temple University in Philadelphia, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude and Phi Beta Kappa from the Honors Program. Throughout his time at Temple, he also served as a volunteer tutor for Citywide Youtharama, an organization that brought elementary school students to Temple's campus to receive tutoring. While at Temple, he received the McFarland Scholarship of the St. Andrew's Society of Philadelphia to study at the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. This experience is where he first sensed his call to ministry, and it inspired him to return ten years later to pursue a Ph.D.

Aaron attended Princeton Theological Seminary, where he earned his Master of Divinity, and was awarded a Presbyterian Leadership Award, recognizing potential for leadership in the PC(USA). He completed multiple internships with churches in Iselin, Cranford, and Westfield, NJ, as well as an international placement in Fortaleza, Brazil. A significant experience was serving as a Chaplain Intern at New York Presbyterian Hospital in New York City, where he developed numerous meaningful pastoral relationships. Pastoral care remains an important, ongoing trait of his ministry.

Aaron was ordained in 2007 and served as a Lilly Resident/Pastoral Resident at the First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor, MI. In 2009, he became Associate Pastor at the First Presbyterian Church of Delray Beach, FL, where he helped grow the youth program, while also being involved in all areas of ministry and helping the church

through an interim period. After exciting ministries in both places, Aaron returned to Scotland in 2012 to serve at St. Giles' Cathedral and begin work on his Ph.D.

In 2017, Aaron earned his Ph.D. in Practical Theology and Christian Ethics from the University of Edinburgh, while serving as an Assistant Minister at St. Giles' Cathedral. St. Giles' Cathedral, located on the Royal Mile, is where John Knox led the Scottish Reformation during the 1500s, and welcomes over one million visitors a year. With four Sunday worship services and numerous midweek services, St. Giles' has an integral role in the civic and religious life of Scotland and the United Kingdom. In Edinburgh, Aaron gained tremendous experience in a public ministry role, and serving as a minister throughout his academic studies, facilitated additional growth as both a theologian and pastor.

While earning his Ph.D., Aaron became an Associate Fellow of the Higher Education Academy and presented at academic conferences around the United Kingdom, including Aberdeen, Durham, Edinburgh, and Oxford Universities. Aaron was also a

Tutor (British term for Teaching Assistant) for numerous university courses at the University of Edinburgh. Additionally, he volunteered weekly with Best Buddies for five years, a program that provided fellowship opportunities for adults with disabilities.



Returning to the United States in 2017, Aaron became the Executive Pastor of the Royal Poinciana Chapel in Palm Beach, FL. In this role, Aaron gained experience in virtually every facet of church life, including the intricacies of a large congregation. The Chapel experienced continued growth in membership and participation, as well as increased financial giving which supported new programs, community outreach, and building projects to accommodate the church's growth. Aaron also served on the Board of Directors of CROS Ministries, which seeks to serve the hungry in Palm Beach and Martin Counties.

As Senior Pastor and Head of Staff of Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City, Aaron has provided spiritual and administrative leadership to a large, historic congregation of financial and organizational complexity. Through biblical preaching, he has sought to help people become ever more faithful followers of Jesus Christ while navigating the world around them with courage and hope. Aaron is excited to bring all his experiences to First Presbyterian Church of Naples and, together with its staff and congregation, to help deepen faith in God and share the love of Christ within the church, throughout the community, and around the world.

Aaron Janklow: Statement of Faith

God created the world and continues to be at work within it. Understanding God as Creator and ourselves as a part of creation, how do we, sinful humanity, approach the perfect, almighty God? The answer is Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord and Savior, is the clearest demonstration of God's love and is the heart of the church. Evidenced when prayers conclude with "In Jesus' name," it is through Jesus that imperfect humanity can approach the perfect God. The crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ demonstrate the awesome extent of God's love for us. By overcoming the powers of sin and death, Jesus shows us that nothing, not even death itself, can separate us from the love of God. The Holy Spirit reveals and illuminates the same love of God shown in Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit binds the church to God, and us to one another as we live in communities based on God's love.

In the church, we learn more about who God is and how we can live as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ amid the challenges and joys of our lives. The church witnesses to the love of the Triune God and is formed through the many gifts God has given each of us. The ultimate gift is Jesus Christ, whose presence is continually confirmed by the sustaining presence of the Holy Spirit. Knowing this, we seek to use our own skills and passions, distributed throughout the body of Christ, to be God's light in the world.

Scripture is the Word of God. From beginning to end, the Bible teaches us truths that shape and give meaning to our lives. With the help of the Holy Spirit, the Bible speaks to all generations to give comfort, encouragement, and guidance. In the Gospels, Jesus commands and performs two sacraments, baptism and the Lord's Supper. Demonstrated in baptism, God's love claims us before we even know how to respond. Infant and adult baptism are both the sealing of God's love granted through divine mercy and grace, the difference being one of timing. The Lord's Supper is the sign and seal of our participation in Jesus Christ. Eating the bread and drinking from the cup are important acts of remembrance, as stated when Jesus told his disciples, Do this in remembrance of me (Lk. 22:19). The Lord's Supper, however, is more than

remembrance. At the Lord's Supper, we not only remember Christ but are reconciled to God and to one another.

In the church, people should not only learn about the love of Christ, but experience that love. While not a sacrament, we follow a command and example of Christ whenever we love others through our actions. As an outpouring of our faith, mission is how we embody God's love through service in the community and world. Mission is also a powerful way to experience God, thereby helping us grow in faith by serving others. Through a diversity of gifts, we preach, teach, visit, serve, and do so much more, as we seek to share the love of Christ in the world and invite more and more people to become a part of the body of Christ.



Pastoral Transition Process

The journey that led the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to recommend Rev. Dr. Aaron Philip Janklow began in early 2025, when Rev. Craig Goodrich announced his plans to retire in May.

In March 2025, Peace River Presbytery authorized First Presbyterian Church to begin the important work of completing a Mission Study. After completing its work in April, the Interim Pastor Hiring Committee invited Rev. Dr. Scott Kenefake to serve as our Interim Senior Pastor, beginning in June 2025. Craig Goodrich retired in May, and the Session approved the Mission Study in June.

As with all things Presbyterian, we have faithfully followed the prescribed and orderly pastoral search process. In August 2025, the congregation elected the seven members of the Pastor Nominating Committee. We began our work almost immediately, receiving training from our Presbytery Executive, Rev. Melana Scruggs. Since then, we have met weekly—and often several times each week.

Our first major task was completing the Minister Discernment Profile (MDP), essentially the position description for our next Senior Pastor. After approval by the Session, it was posted on the PC(USA) website on November 13, 2025.

Over the next six months, the PNC dedicated itself to a thorough and prayerful discernment process. We reviewed applications, listened to sermons, conducted Zoom and in-person interviews, and checked references—all in an effort to discern whom God was calling to serve as the next Senior Pastor and Head of Staff of First Presbyterian Church of Naples.

Our search was intentionally broad. We reached out to more than 45 respected pastors, seminary presidents, and church leaders across the denomination and beyond to identify potential candidates. We also received applications through the PC(USA)'s national Church Leadership Connection database.

Our search ultimately became international in scope. We received materials from and interacted with more than 172 candidates. As we evaluated each individual, we focused on three primary areas: experience, education, and service to the Church; alignment with the leadership qualities identified in our Mission Study and MDP; and preaching.

When a candidate emerged as particularly promising, we conducted an initial Zoom interview with a smaller group of the PNC, followed by an interview with the full committee. Approximately 20 candidates advanced to deeper consideration, and six finalists participated in multiple rounds of extensive interviews and evaluation.

Throughout this process, Aaron consistently distinguished himself. As we continued our discernment, the committee experienced an increasing sense of unity that God was leading us toward Aaron. We spoke with dozens of his references, all of whom spoke enthusiastically about his character, leadership, preaching, pastoral heart, and readiness to serve First Presbyterian Church.

We then invited Aaron to Naples for a two-day visit. During that time, he toured our campus and community, shared meals with the PNC, and participated in extensive conversations about our congregation, our hopes for the future, and the opportunities before us as we approach our 75th anniversary in 2027. Aaron led us in meaningful devotions and shared his vision for long-term

ministry at First Presbyterian Church, as well as his family's excitement about becoming part of the Naples community.

We also had the privilege of meeting Aaron's wife, Laurel, and learning more about their family and their shared commitment to Christian ministry.

Throughout the process, we provided Aaron with detailed information about our congregation, including financial reports, organizational charts, and other important background materials. He carefully studied everything we shared and asked thoughtful, insightful questions. We also learned that from the moment he first reviewed our MDP, Aaron had been walking alongside us—regularly worshiping with us through our online services, learning our history, exploring our mission partnerships, reading about our youth ministries, and appreciating the deep spiritual engagement of our congregation, particularly through our Bible studies and discipleship ministries.

Throughout our months of discernment, many trusted voices reminded us that God had already called our next pastor before we ever began this search. Over time, we came to share that conviction. We believe the Holy Spirit has faithfully guided this process and led us to Aaron. We believe he is an exceptional leader whose wisdom, preaching, pastoral gifts, and vision will serve both our congregation and the Naples community for years to come.

On June 18, the PNC held a final Zoom meeting with Aaron to address any remaining questions from both sides. Aaron shared that the sense of God's call he felt when he first read our materials had only grown stronger throughout the process. The excitement within the committee was unmistakable.

Following that meeting, the PNC met privately for prayer and final deliberation. With great joy and complete unanimity, we voted to extend a call to Rev. Dr. Aaron Philip Janklow to serve as the next Senior Pastor and Head of Staff of First Presbyterian Church of Naples.

Following the committee's recommendation, Marc Miller, serving as Chair of the PNC and a member of the Personnel Committee,

presented Aaron with the proposed Terms of Call, including the compensation package. After the discussion, both parties reached an agreement.

On July 6, the Committee on Ministry of Peace River Presbytery examined Aaron regarding his faith, theology, and readiness for ministry. Members of the PNC participated in that examination. At the conclusion of the meeting, Aaron's call to First Presbyterian was approved by Presbytery, with great excitement and support.

That brings us to today.

The Pastor Nominating Committee is grateful for the prayers, patience, and support of this congregation throughout this journey. We are excited about the possibility of Aaron leading First Presbyterian Church with faithful preaching, thoughtful leadership, a deep love for Jesus Christ, and a passion for serving every generation of our church family.

If the congregation affirms this call today, Aaron and his family will begin their relocation to Naples, with his official start date on September 1 and his first Sunday leading worship anticipated to be September 13.
