## Faith, Freedom, and the American Experiment

As the United States approaches the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence next month, many churches are reflecting on the relationship between faith and the nation's founding.

Presbyterians, in particular, played an important role in the era surrounding the American Revolution.

That history is remembered not only in textbooks, but also in the rituals Americans continue to share every Fourth of July. Families line small-town streets for parades. Neighbors gather for picnics, concerts, and fireworks. Flags wave from porches, children ride decorated bicycles, and veterans are honored alongside civic leaders and first responders. For all our divisions, these traditions still bring people together around a shared story of freedom, gratitude, and hope.

Many early American Presbyterians would have understood the importance of those civic bonds. Descendants of Scottish and Scotch-Irish immigrants, they were shaped by long struggles over freedom, conscience, and the limits of political power. Influenced by the theology of John Knox and the Scottish Reformation, Presbyterians believed that no ruler possessed absolute authority and that human power must remain accountable to God and moral law. Ideas such as representative government, liberty of conscience, and resistance to tyranny became deeply woven into Presbyterian thought.

By the 1770s, many Presbyterian ministers and congregations supported independence from Great Britain. Sermons connected biblical themes of covenant and freedom with the colonies' desire for self-government. One prominent Presbyterian leader was John Witherspoon, president of Princeton University and the only ordained minister to sign the Declaration of Independence.

Historian David L. Holmes, in *The Faiths of the Founding Fathers*, notes that the founders represented a wide range of beliefs—orthodox Christians, Deists, Unitarians, and skeptics alike. What united many of them was not agreement on doctrine, but the conviction that religious liberty and freedom of conscience were essential to the health of both church and society.

That insight resonates strongly with Presbyterian tradition. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Book of Order declares that "God alone is Lord of the conscience." In F-3.0101b, it further teaches that the right to private judgment in matters of religion is universal and that no religious group should receive special privileges from the government beyond equal protection under the law.

In contemporary language, the principle is simple: faith must remain free. The government should neither impose religion nor favor one faith tradition over another. At the same time, all religious communities should be equally protected in the free exercise of their beliefs. These Presbyterian convictions closely echo the ideals later expressed in the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.

These historic principles also offer an important contrast to contemporary forms of Christian nationalism. Early Presbyterians supported liberty not because they believed America was uniquely chosen by God, but because they believed freedom of conscience belongs to everyone. They valued civic engagement while remaining wary of concentrated political and religious power.

The Presbyterian tradition still offers wisdom for a divided nation. It encourages Christians to participate in public life thoughtfully and faithfully while remembering that no political party, ideology, or nation fully embodies God's kingdom. It calls us to love our country without idolizing it, to seek justice without demonizing opponents, and to hold conviction together with humility.

As we approach this national anniversary, Presbyterians have an opportunity not only to remember history, but also to model a deeper kind of patriotism—one rooted in conscience, liberty, humility, and the common good.

## The HEAT is on!

Thank you for your continued support of the First Presbyterian Church of Naples and our mission over the summer months!

During these warmer months we will be taking advantage of the lower attendance to do some updates to make things more comfortable and safe for all. One of our big projects is installing a new air handler (AC system) for the sanctuary. We will also finalize the work on our updated security system.

We have a YTD profit of \$68k through the end of April. However, our YTD Offerings are about \$34k less than the same time last year. We continue to monitor expenses, which are tracking slightly under the same time last year. Despite summer typically having lower attendance for services and being a slower time in Naples, it's still a busy time in the Finance office. As we work on projects around campus over the summer and disburse payments from our Deacon Benevolence fund and from our Missions' Outreach budget to support our local partners, we expend quite a bit of cash.

For those of you that have traveled to cooler summer locations, please continue to live stream our services, leave comments and stay in touch with us. Your comments are valuable and will help bridge the distance gap!

## Letting Go

Letting go is a very difficult thing for most of us. As inexplicable as it is, we often seem to prefer the “comfort” of a known trouble or challenge over the risk of exploring and accepting change for the better.

Fr. Thomas Keating authored a simple prayer to help us understand and accept the reality that Christians are called to let go of their sufferings, their desire to control their own lives, and to turn over control of everything to God. This is the essence of what Stephen Ministry seeks for our care receivers.

Fr. Keating’s Welcoming Prayer presents a method of recognizing and consenting to God’s presence and action in our physical and emotional reactions to events and situations in daily life. The purpose of the Welcoming Prayer is to deepen our relationship with God through consenting to God’s will, rather than our own, in the ordinary activities of our day.

Please read this out loud when you are alone and at rest and consider its message:

*Welcome, welcome, welcome.*

*I welcome everything that comes to me today because I know it’s for my healing.*

*I welcome all thoughts, feelings, emotions, persons, situations, and conditions.*

*I let go of my desire for power and control.*

*I let go of my desire for affection, esteem, approval and pleasure.*

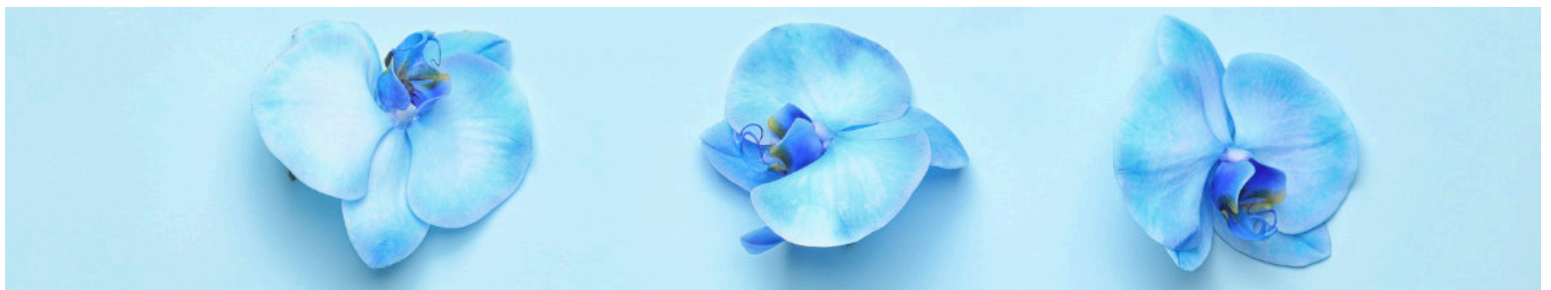
*I let go of my desire for survival and security.*

*I let go of my desire to change any situation, condition, person or myself.*

*I open to the love and presence of God and God’s action within.*

### With Love and Gratitude from Sharman Pfaus

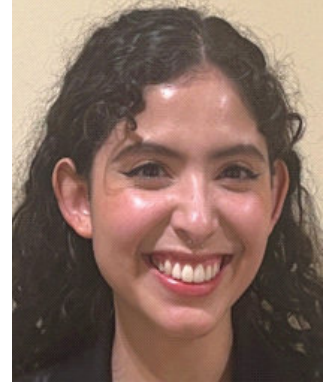
To my dear FPCN friends,

As we prepare for our Montreat trip in early June, I am thrilled to share some wonderful highlights from the past month! First of all, I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who participated in the 144 fundraiser; your generosity helped us raise an incredible \$9,380! We ask for your continued prayers for six youth and one adult (along with myself) as we get ready for this trip from June 5 to June 13.

This past May was a beautiful celebration as we honored the milestone of graduation, recognizing 21 graduates (from preschool to graduate school), with 14 of them attending our service. It was a joy to see the students flourishing and marking this significant transition in their lives.

This summer, we will also hold Vacation Bible School with the exciting theme of "Snowball Mountain Challenge." Additionally, we will host our Summer FunDay School, themed around winter, utilizing decorations from VBS. This program is a deliberate invitation for our preschool families, who might not attend church on Sundays, and will take place during the church service.

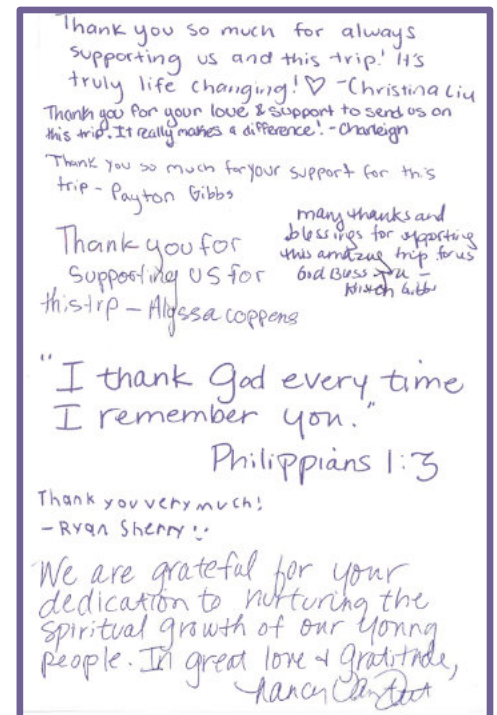
Recently, we presented our best practices at the "Rooted Conference" in Scottsdale, Arizona, from April 29 to May 1. During this conference, we showcased our Sacred Seasons Boxes, along with other faith-at-home practices, designed to encourage faith at home and equip parents as primary faith formers—the key objective of our Fourth Soil Parenting Initiative. It was an honor to share our insights and have been invited into another grant project for next year—the Raising Faithful Kids Initiative. 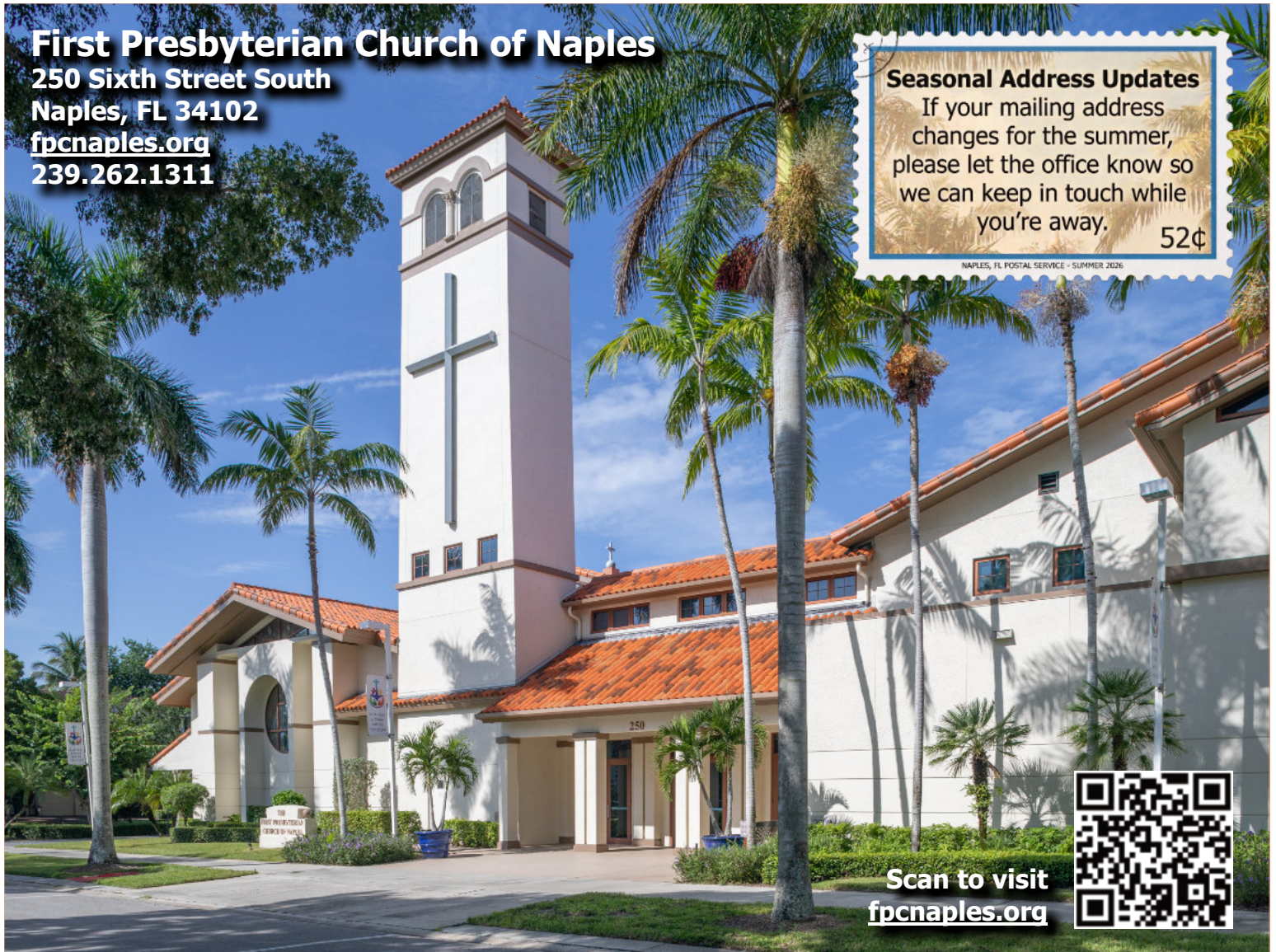
