Marking Milestones



May is a month of thresholds that invite us to reflect on our shared journey. Caps and gowns appear, symbolizing new beginnings. Families gather to capture moments of growth. The church is called to pause and recognize these life

transitions that shape our community and faith together.

The Christian tradition has always honored such moments. Scripture is full of crossings—Israel through the sea, Joshua across the Jordan, Jesus stepping into baptism, the disciples sent out two by two. These are not just events; they are transitions. They mark the movement from what has been into what might be, from formation into calling.

Frederick Buechner once wrote that vocation is found where “your deep gladness and the world’s deep hunger meet.” Graduations and rites of passage are not just about achievement; they are moments to listen for God’s call. What gifts are emerging? What joys are taking root? Where might these young people sense God calling them into lives of meaning and service?

Parker Palmer reminds us that vocation is not something we invent but something we listen

for—“before I can tell my life what I want to do with it, I must listen to my life telling me who I am.” Milestones give us a chance to practice listening together. When we bless graduates, confirm youth, or celebrate transitions, we are saying: your life matters, and we are paying close attention to what God is revealing in your journey.

That is why the presence of older generations matters so deeply. Wendell Berry often writes about the wisdom of communities that hold memory and hope together. When elders show up—at ceremonies, in pews, at receptions—they embody continuity and support. They remind younger people that they do not step into the future alone, inheriting stories, faith, and a sense of belonging that sustains us all.

The church is one of the few places where generations regularly share space. In May, that becomes a gift. A handshake from someone who has lived decades. A word of encouragement. A quiet prayer. These small gestures form a bridge between past and future.

This month, let us notice the thresholds among us. Celebrate the graduates. Bless the transitions. Show up for the young. And remember: every milestone is not just a finish line but a beginning—another step in the long, shared journey of faith.

Retirement plans now account for 36% of household wealth; so IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, or other defined contribution plans are excellent options to consider for estate gifts. It is simple to arrange such a gift, as you only need to complete a change of beneficiary form that can be obtained from your plan administrator. You have the option for your estate to donate the full remaining balance or simply a percentage of the account. This is a cost-effective way for your estate to make a charitable gift, as there is no tax liability when assets are donated to a charitable organization.

It was inspired by Master Corporal Mark "Izzy" Isfeld, a Canadian Military Engineer who lost his life while clearing the landmines in Croatia. He often carried these dolls made by his mother, to distribute to the children in war-torn areas. The dolls bring comfort and joy to children who have experienced trauma and loss.

Loneliness as a Christian



How many times have you heard someone say, "Yes, I am a Christian, but I do not go to church?" Without going into any of the possible reasons why many people consider themselves to be unchurched Christians, I am

reminded yet again that there is no such thing as a solo Christian. We know that God wants us to love one another as we love ourselves (the Maundy Thursday commandment), and we also know that we are the hands and feet of God in the world to serve others who need our help.

Helping others can become complicated when those others appear to choose to separate themselves from the church or from community in general. First of all, how do we find others who may need us but who have chosen to be apart? And, even if we can find them, how do we convince them to accept spiritual companionship when they have become depressed or isolated as a result of their choosing to be separate? Many people have felt some sense of loneliness at some point in their

lives, and we as Christians need to do a better job of finding them and helping them to reconnect with the Christian community, and better access God's saving and healing grace as a result.

As Christians, we are reminded throughout all of Scripture, in sermons, in hymns, and through discipleship, that we are not alone and to cast loneliness and depression unto the Lord. The same handful of verses that we have memorized since youth we keep trying to access in times of difficulty, often despite paralyzing waves of sadness and intimate moments with darkness. We are resolute that we should be able to handle loneliness and despair on our own without accepting help and support which could bring God's healing love into our lives more fully. We may feel that we are abandoned by God, and we may not accept spiritual help from others because we do not want to be a bother or draw others into our loneliness. So, we remain lonely, disassociated, and without hope.

Matanzas, Cuba Mission Trip

Our partner church, Central Reformed Presbyterian Church in Matanzas, Cuba, sends its greetings! Parishioners Scott Jacobs and Tim Stover visited from April 17-20 in a trip that was reduced both in the number of travelers and length of stay. Originally, seven planned on traveling for six days, but due to the current lack of gasoline and electricity, it was decided to reduce our footprint and stay only three nights. It was abundantly clear that daily life in Cuba is extremely challenging with limited resources.

We spent a great deal of time with the newly installed Pastor, Adriana Guerrero. She is a dedicated, passionate minister with excellent communication skills and appears to be working 24/7. The many needs of the people are her focus, and her Christian enthusiasm is infectious. She sends her heartfelt thanks to all at First Presbyterian Church of Naples for their generosity and compassion.

Our last visit from First Presbyterian of Naples occurred in May of 2023 and it was important to reconnect with our brothers and sisters in Christ. We were able to hand deliver much needed supplies including medication, toys and games for children, a Bluetooth microphone, a guitar amp, printer cartridges, 64 rechargeable flashlights, solar lanterns, medical supplies, communion trays, two HP laptop computers, and monetary support. In addition, we have renewed our 3 year partnership agreement with them.

Life in Cuba is challenging now more than ever. The country has a failing electrical grid that can be out for 30+ hours at a time. Gasoline is prohibitively expensive resulting in roads without cars, no public transportation, and almost no trash pickup.

The FPCN Mission Committee has recently explored alternative ways to deliver much needed supplies to our partner church without physically flying to Cuba. In the last four months, two separate shipments, (one of medications and one of exterior solar lights) have been successfully shipped directly to Matanzas from Naples. A website named SuperMarket23 can deliver food supplies to their door once an order is placed and paid for online from here in Florida; these supplies are used in their vital food program.

The hospitality of the Cuban people fills the soul and one leaves with a tremendous respect for how they cope relying on their faith and perseverance all while maintaining their grace and sense of humor.

FPC Wellness: A New Pilot Program for Family Support

On Friday, April 17, we launched our pilot program, FPC Wellness, which aims to support our parents in navigating the demands of daily life. This initiative has been generously funded through Vibrant Faith Ministries, leveraging resources from a Lilly Grant.

In our journey to better understand the needs of our families, we are always asking parents one pivotal question: "How can we, as a church, better support you in your daily lives?" A common theme that emerged was the overwhelming stress many parents feel amidst their day-to-day responsibilities, along with a deep yearning for reprieve and self-care.

In response to this feedback, we hired a breath coach, whose services were recommended by one of our parents. During our wellness session, she introduced us to elemental breathing rhythm exercises at the beach, accompanied by a tranquil meditation focused on gratitude. This experience lasted one hour, allowing our participants to relax and recharge.

To put parents' minds at ease, we provided child

care for all participating children, ensuring they were in a safe environment while their parents engaged in this much-needed self-care session. Upon returning from the beach, we gathered for a mindful and healthy meal prepared by Susan Pratt, enjoyed outdoors in our courtyard, where we took a moment to reflect on the previous hour.

The feedback we received from our parents was overwhelmingly positive, with the event earning a five out of five stars in our surveys. One parent even rated us a six out of five, emphasizing that "God's timing is perfect."

We're excited to share some of the wonderful photos from this event (on the following page), showcasing the joy and connection experienced by all involved. As we continue to listen to our young parents, we trust they will guide us toward a bright future, filled with blessings, peace, and every good thing.

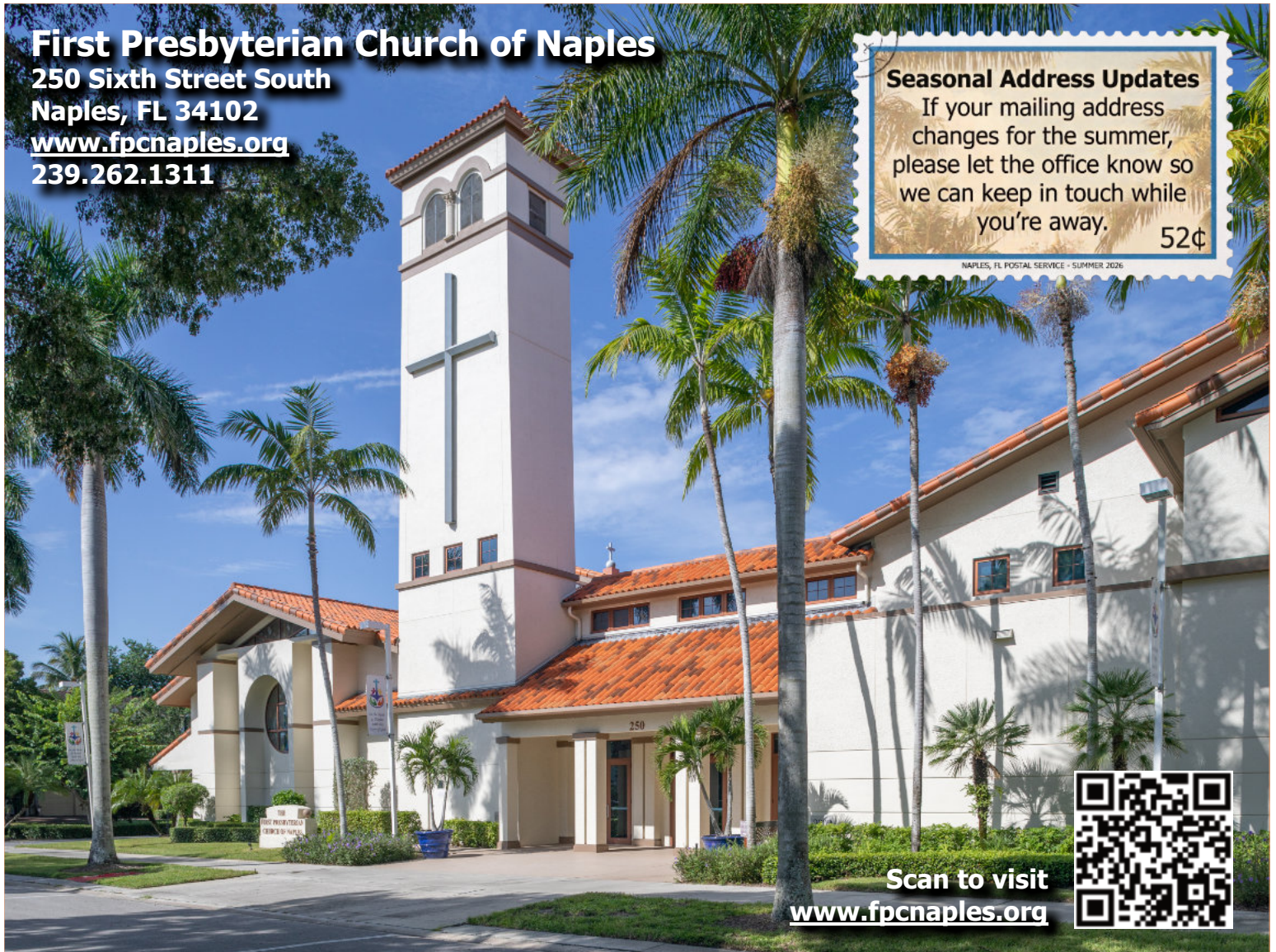
