

Lent is a season of penance, prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and reflection—a time of preparation for Easter. These practices are countercultural in a society that prizes

self-fulfillment and consumption. And they are voluntary. No one compels us to observe Lent; we choose to enter into its disciplines.

In the Roman Catholic Church tradition, Lent often meant fish on Fridays. The fish—an ancient Christian symbol (ICHTHYS) representing Christ—is not classified as meat under Catholic canon law, making it a permitted substitute during abstinence.

With the exception of our Episcopal and Lutheran siblings, many mainline Protestant churches only began regularly observing Lent in recent decades. I remember when Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations began observing Ash Wednesday services in the 1980s—sometimes amid controversy. This shift grew out of the liturgical renewal movement, which

encouraged Protestant churches to reclaim early Christian worship practices as a visible sign of unity in Christ. It also brought Protestant worship into closer conversation with Catholic tradition while maintaining denominational distinctives.

Lent mirrors the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness after his baptism, facing temptation. The season runs from Ash Wednesday to Easter, not counting Sundays. In the early church, Lent prepared new converts for baptism at Easter. Over time, it became a season for all Christians to prepare their hearts. Protestants often take an eclectic approach to Lent: daily devotionals, prayer practices such as labyrinth walks, and charitable giving that expresses solidarity with those in need. Lent helps us practice privately what we profess publicly.

I encourage you to adopt a Lenten practice that fits your life—whether giving something up or taking something on. These disciplines remind us who—and whose—we are as followers of Jesus.

I invite you “to observe a holy Lent,” as we say in the Ash Wednesday liturgy.



The spectacular Ruffatti pipe organ is featured in six Lenten organ recitals offered by our Director of Music, Brice Gerlach. In these informal concerts Brice takes the time to explain some of the mechanical workings of the organ and offers some musical insights about the pieces on the program.

Each concert opens with a piece that highlights the magnificent horizontal trumpets protruding from the front of the organ case.

A work by J. S. Bach is always featured and arrangements of Lenten hymn tunes are presented, allowing for some of the diverse solo stops and softer sounds of the organ to be heard. The concerts will end with a rousing toccata, allowing the audience to hear the full power of the organ.

After the recital, the audience is invited up to the console, to ask questions and to see the beautiful woodwork and craftsmanship of the Ruffatti. Tours of the pipe chambers are also offered each week.



February, a time for love and kindness... March, a time for new beginnings.



February may be one of the shortest months of the year, but it is always full of meaningful moments in the preschool! Even though we experienced so much cold, the sunny winter weeks were still rich with learning, friendship, and creativity as we

continued to nurture each child's growth in a loving, relationship-centered environment.

Throughout February, our classrooms were filled with conversations about kindness, friendship, and caring for one another. Around Valentine's Day, we focused not simply on cards and treats, but on what it truly means to show love: using kind words, helping hands, and thoughtful actions. In age-appropriate ways, our teachers guided children to practice empathy, cooperation, and gratitude as they strengthened their classroom community.

February gave us many opportunities for rich process art, sensory exploration, early literacy activities, and math experiences woven naturally into play. Whether children were building spacecrafts together, experimenting with paint and texture, counting and sorting hearts, or listening to new books about dragons who love tacos, they learned through joyful engagement.

Looking Ahead to March

March brings with it a sense of anticipation. The days grow longer, the weather starts to heat up, our butterflies on the playground begin to appear, and our classrooms naturally shift toward themes of growth, new life, and change. Children are wonderful observers of the world around them, and we look forward to exploring seasonal changes through science investigations, nature walks, planting activities, and lots of outdoor play.

Spring break will also take place during March. This provides our families and staff time to rest, travel, or simply enjoy slower days together. Breaks offer children a chance to recharge and we love welcoming them back refreshed and ready for new discoveries.

March may also include celebrations such as St. Patrick's Day, which we approach as a fun cultural exploration of color, patterns, rainbows, and simple traditions. As Easter approaches later in the spring, our hearts and classrooms will continue preparing for that joyful celebration.

As always, we are grateful for the partnership we share with our families and church community. Each month in preschool is a beautiful reminder that early childhood is not something to rush through but is instead something to cherish. Thank you for allowing us to walk alongside the children as they grow, learn, and discover their God-given gifts.

We look forward to all that March will bring!



Ms. Madi's two-year-old class spread the love as they created unique collages for Valentine's Day using shredded paper, Styrofoam, and paper hearts. During this engaging activity, they built finger strength by squeezing the glue bottles, and practiced critical thinking as they decided how to carefully place each material in glue – how much glue does it take to hold

one piece of paper vs. a whole handful? They were also creative as they made their own choices and planned their finished project.



Ms. Sheridyn and Ms. Viviana's two-year-old classroom learned all about chemical reactions as they added vinegar to heart molds made of baking soda. This is such a good example of play and relationship-based learning in action! Notice the engagement and focus of children as they experiment with a variety of materials and observe the results - in this case, fizzing!

Ms. Claudia's class stopped along their buggy walk route to check out the little free library in our neighborhood, hosted by one of our former preschool grandparents! In addition to books, they also add seasonal goodies for the neighborhood children. Walking through the neighborhood is so good for the children, as it gives them the chance to learn more about their community, and experience the beauty that downtown Naples has to offer.

Family Ministry News

This past January in Session, I shared, along with Amy Agnew, about the exciting growth we're seeing in Family Ministries and our deepening connections with the Preschool. I wanted to pass those updates along to the whole congregation—because it's encouraging, and because your support and prayers make a real difference.

Growing Participation

- We currently have 60 families actively connected to the church.
- We count 103 children, youth, and young adults who are part of our church life.
- We're thrilled that 21 of our former Preschool students are now actively engaged in the church. That's an amazing blessing from years of relationship and care.

Note: These numbers do not include the whole Preschool population, though some Preschool families are counted when they participate in our broader programming.

It's important to note that before the pandemic, *Pew Research* noted that when families say they're "regular churchgoers," that often means attending about once a month. We're seeing that frequency can be even less now. Still, the hope we hold—and the reality we celebrate—is that these families are here, connected, and growing. We're grateful.

We're committed to offering creative, life-giving opportunities for our young people. In February, we hosted "Improv for Life," a session led by Craig Price - one of Naples' 100 most influential business leaders from The Naples Players. It was an improv class for our youth group designed to equip them with practical language and tools for navigating peer-pressure situations. We reflected on Proverbs and the truth that "the power of life and death is in the tongue," practicing words that build courage, kindness, and wisdom in real-life moments.

Please continue to pray for this ministry. Your support, presence, and prayers are planting seeds that are bearing fruit across generations. Some Session members weren't aware of these numbers, so we wanted the whole church to be encouraged and informed.






