












A Season of Music

Winner of the First Prize and Audience Prize at the 2022 American Guild of Organists' National Young Artists Competition in Organ performance (NYACOP), James Kealey is a young artist of great distinction who has appeared in recital in England, the United States and in Europe. A native of Great Britain, James came to the U.S.A. having held positions at notable English Cathedrals. In the spring of 2020, James completed his Master of Music degree from the Eastman School of Music in Organ Performance and Literature. In 2021 he was honored to be named one of The Diapason's "20 under 30", an accolade awarded to the most successful young artists in the field. In the summer of 2023, his debut CD "Rhapsodic" was released on the Pro Organo recording label. Currently, James serves as full time Interim Director of Music/Organist at

position, James is a

International competition winning ensemble Duo Beaux Arts was formed in 2008 by world renowned husband and wife concert pianists and recording artists Catherine Lan and Tao Lin. Known for its adrenalized performances, this dynamic Duo has performed in France, Switzerland, Spain, Estonia, Finland, the Netherlands, China, and the United States to both critical and audience acclaim. As guest soloist, the Duo has performed Mozart's Concerto for Two Pianos in Eb major with South Florida Symphony Orchestra, as well as guest artist at Romanza Festivale, Swan City Piano Festival, Beethoven for Miami Festival, and Bowdoin International Music Festival. Season highlights include a debut recital at Bartók Hall at Buda Castle in Hungary.

The theme for the concert is A Kaleidoscope of Expression and features works by Chopin, Mendelssohn and Strauss.

Seraph Brass

Sunday, March 17, 2024 4:00 p.m.

Celebrating its tenth anniversary season,
Seraph Brass was founded by trumpet soloist
Mary Elizabeth Bowden with the mission of
showcasing the excellence of female brass
players and highlighting musicians from
marginalized groups both in personnel and in
programming. Winners of the American Prize
in Chamber Music, the group has been
praised for their "beautiful sounds" (*American*Record Guide), "fine playing" (*Gramophone*),
and "staggeringly high caliber of
performance" (*Textura*). Seraph primarily
performs as a quintet, with a dynamic roster
drawing from America's top brass musicians.

Seraph performs a diverse body of repertoire, ranging from original transcriptions to newly commissioned works and core classics.

Members of Seraph Brass are passionate about music education, and hold teaching positions at the University of North Texas, Shenandoah Conservatory, and the University of Wisconsin -Madison. Don't miss the chance to hear these incredible brass musicians!



Lenten Organ Concerts

Wednesdays February 21, 28, March 6, 13, 20, 27, 2024 12:00 - 12:30 p.m.

The spectacular Ruffatti pipe organ is featured in six Lenten organ recitals offered by our Director of Music, Dr. Brice Gerlach. In these informal concerts Brice takes the time to explain some of the mechanical workings of the organ and offers some musical insights about the pieces on the program. Each concert opens with a piece that highlights the magnificent horizontal trumpets protruding from the front of the organ case. A work by J. S. Bach is always featured and arrangements of Lenten hymn tunes are presented, allowing for some of the diverse solo stops and softer sounds of the organ to be heard. The concerts will end with a rousing toccata, allowing the audience to hear the full power of the organ.

After the recital, the audience is invited to the console to ask questions and see the beautiful woodwork and craftsmanship of the Ruffatti.





Tours of the pipe chambers are also offered each week. These concerts have become very popular and we hope that you will consider coming to one or all of them and bringing a friend or two. Brice is an evangelist for the organ and makes these short concerts educational, exciting and entertaining. He will also share the keyboard with some of his up and coming students!

A noon-time service recognizing the crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary.


