Entries must be electronically submitted by this date.
All Coggins must be uploaded with entry.

Entry Fees: \$150 per competitor
\$190 per qualifying competitor
\$30 per stall (6pm Saturday–Sunday evening) (no stall deposits will be collected, but clubs will be charged for any dirty stalls left by their members.)

Entry fees and stabling fees must be paid via the online form using a credit card or PayPal (a processing fee of 3% will be added to the total amount due.)
All Coggins must be uploaded with entry. Biosecurity Requirements will be in place.

Late Entries: **ENTRIES SUBMITTED AFTER THE DEADLINE WILL BE CHARGED A LATE ENTRY FEE OF \$50.**

Entries will not be accepted after JUNE 5.

Refunds: Refunds will be granted only with doctor/veterinarian excuse, minus a \$10 administrative fee. Requests must be made by the DC or CA in writing and accompanied by a doctor's or veterinarian's excuse. Requests should be sent to the secretary at the address listed above.
Requests must be received by Friday, June 26. Refunds will NOT be made the day of the rally.

Sharing of Mounts: In order to provide a safe and enjoyable competition for our younger members, D-1s and D-2s ONLY may share mounts.



Our Region hosts activities at several local facilities. Collectively, we are committed to the health and safety of all our horses and to educating our riders in Biosecurity Protocols.

Veterinary Requirements at Chagrin Valley Farms:

- Coggins Tests: The Region will collect Coggins tests with club team entries & verify validity
- Vaccinations: Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1/4) no less than 7 days and no more than 6 months before visiting.
- Certificates of Veterinary Inspection/Health Certificates are required by State Law for horses attending from out-of-state and are location specific.

It is *highly recommended* that competitors track and record temperatures for two days prior to arrival to avoid shipping horses with possible health issues.

Team Composition:

Teams will consist of 3 or 4 riding members. It is strongly advised that each team have a Stable Manager; it is the responsibility of the club to provide their team with a Stable Manager. Team members may be of mixed certifications and can belong to multiple divisions.

Individual riders are encouraged to enter—the Organizer will assemble scramble teams to the best of their ability. If there is a preference for scrambling, please note on the entry form, and we will do our best to honor requests.

Note: all riders 18-21 must have the SafeSport™ Trained Course completion on file to participate.

Competition Divisions:

Junior: age 10-17
Senior: 18 years and above

At the Regional level, teams may have both junior and senior members on them. However, any team with both junior and senior members will be required to compete in the Senior Division.

The Junior/Senior Team Formation Release will need to be completed by all junior riders for teams that include a rider that is 18+.

Competition Levels:

At regional rallies a rider may compete in any level offered in which they feel their mount would be able to perform. Their DC/CA must certify that they are safe to compete at the desired level.

Non-Qualifying Levels

8-10 jumps; 3 rounds. Ground Poles thru Intro will be run in the same ring. Riders may choose two consecutive levels, i.e. Ground Poles and X-rails, or X-rails and Intro. If choosing two levels, first two rounds will be the lower height and the third round the higher height. The Very Green level is not included in this option as it is run in a different ring.

To give our newest riders a positive experience, the first rounds in the Ground Poles, X-Rails and Intro levels, the first round will be a "schooling" round; the score for this round will be the average of the first two rounds. The second and third rounds will be scored as usual.

**Ground Poles
X-Rails: max. 1'
Intro: max. 1'6"
Very Green: max. 2'3"**

Qualifying Levels

You do not have to be trying to qualify for championships to ride in these divisions:

- .65m Jumpers: 2'1"-2'3" (8-10 jumps), 3 spreads
- .75m Jumpers: 2'5"-2'7" (8-11 jumps), 3 spreads
- .85m Jumpers: 2'9" – 2'11" (10-12 jumps), 3 spreads
- .95m Jumpers: 3'1" – 3' 3" (10-14 jumps), 4 spreads
- 1.05m Jumpers: 3'5" – 3'7" (10-14 jumps), 4 spreads
- 1.15m Jumpers: 3'9" - 3'11" (10-14 jumps), 4 spreads

Types of Rounds for Qualifying Levels

.65 & .75m Jumpers:

- R1: Knockdown, Optimum Time bonus
- R2: Knockdown, Equitation bonus
- R3: Knockdown, one double

.85m, .95m, 1.05m & 1.15m Jumpers:

- R1: Knockdown; Optimum Time bonus
- R2: Knockdown; Equitation bonus
- R3: Table II, 2(d) Two-Phase Power & Speed (2 courses of 5-7 jumps); *both phases required; bonus points will be awarded to all riders that complete both phases without elimination using the table on pg. 21 of the Rulebook. Not completing phase two results in elimination.*

Intent to Qualify for Championships:

Competitors who wish to qualify for 2026 Festival Championships must be indicated on the Entry Form. Horse and rider qualify as a team.

Competitors who qualified in 2025 can enter Championships at the same level at which they qualified. *To change levels, riders will need to compete at the 2026 Rally.*

Mount substitutions may be granted in extraordinary circumstances. Requests are submitted by the RS and are subject to panel review at the National level. Proof of competition experience (videos, USHJA documentation, etc.) is required.

Championships Information:

Eligibility:

Each individual member who desires to compete at Championships must compete in a regional rally and be judged at the minimum HM level and *same competition level* in which they intend to enter at Championships.*

Age & Certification Minimum Requirements

Must be 10 years old by Jan. 1, 2026

Horse Management Certification: D-2

Mounted Certification: D-2 EV/HSE

Stable Manager: D2-HM

Championships Requirements:

Complete a minimum of two rounds at the competition level showing a numerical score (i.e. not E or R) with 16 or fewer jumping faults. Only jumping penalties (rails, refusals, etc.) count towards the maximum penalties (not time faults.)

Competitors may compete up a level if they intend to complete a certification prior to the closing date for Championships entry submission. If the certification is not completed successfully, the rider can enter at their current certification. **This must be noted on the Entry Form.*

Stabling:

10 x 10 vinyl-sided stalls on clay floor with doors in a permanent barn.

Stalls are required for the day of the competition.

\$30 (6pm Saturday thru Sunday night)

Bedding not provided.

Stalls must be stripped at the end of the competition (hint: bring a tarp to remove your shavings, but **DO NOT** put the tarp underneath the shavings when setting up.

We will not be collecting Stall Deposit Checks. Clubs will be billed \$25 per competitor for any stalls not stripped.

If you are arriving the night before the rally, please plan to overnight your horse according to USPC standards (refer to USPC Horse Management Handbook and Rules for Rallies 2024) You will be checked, but NOT judged until the grounds open on the morning of the rally.

STALL CARDS and FEED CHARTS REQUIRED—both are required even though this is a 1-day rally!

Tack Stalls: Tack Stalls are included & will be available adjacent to team stabling.

Grounds: Warm-up area not enclosed. All competition rings are enclosed.

Awards: Team ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 6th place for Team Overall in each division.
Team ribbons 1st through 6th place for Horse Management in each division
Equitation 1st through 6th place per Level for scores 60 and higher

Written Test: Completion of an open-book written test will be required (one test per team.)

Attire: A Medical Armband with a completed Medical Card or a medical bracelet must be worn at all times while on the competition grounds. Medical cards must be worn on the upper arm only.

Turnout Inspection and first round of competition: All competitors seeking Championships eligibility must turnout and compete in appropriate competition attire (includes a jacket.) For all subsequent rounds, competitors may wear competition attire or basic attire.

Any competitors *not seeking Championships eligibility* may turnout and compete in appropriate competition attire or in basic riding attire.

Refer to the USPC Handbook and Rules for Show Jump Competition – 2026, Article 36 (pg. 10-12) for details on acceptable competition and basic attire.

Equipment: Refer to the 2026 Show Jump Rulebook, Article 37 (pg. 11) for permitted equipment.

Coaches: Coaches are **highly recommended** but not required. All coaches must be designated on Entry Form.

PLEASE NOTE: There will be 3 competition arenas and you may need more than one coach depending on the number and level of riders. Non-qualifying and .65m/.75m competition rings will be adjacent to each other; .85m-1.05m competition ring will be separate.

Note: Coaches cannot be chaperones.

Volunteers: Each club must provide 2 volunteers per team entered. **DO NOT enter the same name multiple times unless submitting a short team (one or two riders.)** A third volunteer would be greatly appreciated! Volunteers will be contacted via e-mail to indicate their position preferences.
