He is known for building strong teams and serving the community through board roles with organizations such as Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida.

"I'm honored to continue the important work Allison and this team have built," said Butterstein. "The Coalition's mission is close to my heart, and I look forward to helping even more people reclaim stability and hope."

Dr. Amy Donley will step into the role of Board Chair. An Associate Professor of Sociology at the University of Central Florida and Director of the Institute for Social and Behavioral Science, Dr. Donley is a leading researcher on homelessness, poverty, and related social issues. She has partnered with numerous agencies and nonprofits to turn research into solutions that shape policy and strengthen communities.

"As we look ahead, I'm honored to support the Coalition's mission in this role," said Dr. Donley. "I look forward to working alongside Brad and this incredible team to build on our impact."

Krall and Butterstein will work closely together in the coming months to ensure a smooth transition. The Board and staff remain dedicated to the Coalition's mission of helping individuals and families regain stability, dignity, and hope.
