High School Club Constitution

Article I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the **Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA)** at ____ High School.

Article II – Purpose

The purpose of this club is to provide students with opportunities to:

- Grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Encourage one another through prayer, fellowship, and Bible study.
- Share the love and hope of Christ with classmates, teammates, coaches, teachers, and the community.
- Develop student leaders who model Christ-like character.
- Live out the FCA values of Integrity, Serving, Teamwork, and Excellence.

Mission Statement

To lead every coach and athlete into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ and His church.

Article III – Statement of Faith

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes is founded upon the Bible as God's inspired Word and believes:

- There is one God eternally existing as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
 - Jesus Christ is the Son of God who died for our sins and rose again.
 - Salvation is found by grace through faith in Jesus Christ alone.
 - The Bible is God's authoritative truth for faith and life.
 - Christians are called to love God and love others.

Article IV – Membership

Membership is open to any student enrolled at ____ High School regardless of athletic participation.

Members are encouraged to:

- Attend monthly meetings.

- Participate respectfully.
- Invite friends.
- Support club activities.
- Demonstrate good character on campus.

No student shall be denied participation based on race, ethnicity, gender, disability, or religious background. Attendance does not require agreement with FCA beliefs.

Article V – Faculty Advisor

The club shall have at least one faculty advisor who shall:

- Supervise meetings.
 - Ensure school policies are followed.
 - Encourage student leadership.
 - Assist officers with planning.
 - Serve as liaison with school administration.

Article VI – Student Officers

The officers shall consist of:

President

- Preside over meetings.
- Set meeting agendas.
- Lead the officer team.
- Represent FCA before school administration.
- Coordinate with the faculty advisor.

Vice President

- Assist the President.
- Lead meetings in the President's absence.
- Coordinate special events and outreach.
- Oversee committee work.

Secretary

- Record meeting minutes.
- Maintain attendance records.
- Communicate meeting reminders.
- Keep club documents organized.

Treasurer

- Maintain financial records.
- Work with the advisor regarding fundraising.
- Report finances to the club.
- Assist with budgeting for activities.

Prayer Coordinator

- Organize prayer requests.
- Lead prayer during meetings.
- Coordinate prayer teams for students, coaches, and school staff.

Outreach Coordinator

- Promote meetings.
 - Manage social media (if approved by the school).
 - Encourage student invitations.
 - Coordinate service projects and outreach events.

Article VII – Officer Elections

- Officers shall be elected each spring for the following school year.
 - Any active member in good standing may run for office.
 - Elections shall be conducted by secret ballot unless there is only one candidate.
 - A simple majority vote shall determine the winner.
 - Officers may be re-elected.

Article VIII – Meetings

The FCA Club shall meet **once each month** during the school year.

A typical meeting shall include:

1. Welcome and announcements
2. Prayer
3. Icebreaker or team-building activity
4. Worship (optional)
5. Bible study or testimony
6. Small-group discussion
7. Prayer and challenge for the month

Officer meetings may be held separately as needed.

Article IX – Committees

The President may establish committees including:

- Events Committee
- Prayer Committee
- Service Committee
- Campus Outreach Committee
- Hospitality Committee

Committee chairpersons shall report to the officers.

Article X – Activities

The club may sponsor activities including:

- Monthly FCA Huddles
- Campus prayer gatherings
- See You at the Pole
- Fields of Faith
- Community service projects
- Athlete and coach testimonies
- Leadership training
- Food drives
- Fellowship events
- Sports outreach activities

All activities shall comply with school district policies.

Article XI – Finances

The club may receive donations and conduct fundraising activities with approval from school administration.

Funds shall be used solely to support the mission of the FCA Club.

All financial procedures shall follow school policies.

Article XII – Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendments have been presented at the previous meeting and approved by the faculty advisor.
