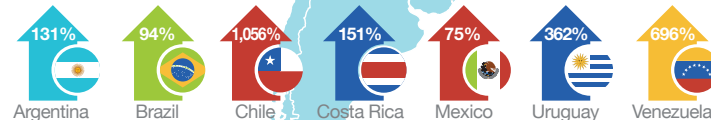
Latin America trade through PortMiami saw a 12% decline in volume in Q1 FY2026, totaling 78,308 TEUs compared to 89,267 TEUs in Q1 FY2025. Despite the drop in volume, total cargo value rose significantly from \$5.91 billion to \$7.58 billion, indicating a shift toward higher-value goods. Trade remained predominantly import-driven, with approximately 74% imports and 26% exports.
