

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

OUR LADY OF PEACE PARISH REV. ANTHONY GENEROSE PASTOR

Today's selection of readings for Sunday Mass reminds us once again that faith in God is tested in hardship. In the second book of Kings, Naaman is a

high-ranking court official from a non-Jewish country who suffers from the hardship of leprosy. In the gospel of Luke, Jesus receives an appeal for pity from 10 Israelites also suffering from leprosy. I can't imagine the human suffering of such a disease, can you? Add to that the hardship of being alienated from the community because of leprosy. Leprosy was a disease that medical science would only be able to handle more effectively much later in human history. And if you encountered lepers in biblical days, perhaps you could contract the disease. But more to the point, contact with lepers made you ritually unclean and unable to fulfill your duties according to Hebrew law.

Certainly, the weight of a serious medical condition had been compounded having to live on the margins of society. Under such conditions, anyone suffering these things would conclude that they deserve a remedy; especially deserving of a miraculous recovery from leprosy which would restore integrity of life on all levels. Naaman is asked to take a mud bath by the prophet Elisha after one of his servants thought Elisha's God might help him out. But Naaman is at first insulted at the suggestion thinking his status deserved a more dignified process for healing. The 10 lepers in Luke's Gospel only did what their faith in God proposed according to the law of Moses. So, they seek out the healer named Jesus, despite the great risk to their welfare because of social ostracization, to have God look mercifully upon them.

In the end, we discover that faith in God is proven in gratitude. Naaman and one leper return giving thanks. Normally, we are grateful for small and large miracles. The question is how do we avoid the ingratitude demonstrated by the nine lepers? How do we not think and believe we are deserving because of our hardships whatever they may be? Perhaps it's being grateful in our need that prevents our hearts from becoming coldly ungrateful? After all, we've all been in the situation when we think we have it bad, until meet someone who has it worse. We may have to look long and hard to see how the Lord keeps us afloat amid the trials that come our way. We only hit rock bottom when our hearts become stone cold with entitlement. Jornada Mundial de las misiones en la iglesia católica ¿Qué es la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Misiones? (Domingo Mundial de las Misiones). Es una jornada anual en la Iglesia católica dedicada a la oración, reflexión y solidaridad con las misiones del mundo, así como al apoyo material de territorios misioneros. Se celebra cada año el domingo penúltimo de octubre. En ese día o más bien ese fin de semana, las diócesis, parroquias y comunidades católicas participan en oraciones, lecturas, homilías, actividades misioneras y una colecta especial para sostener la misión universal. Está vinculada administrativamente a las Obras Misionales Pontificias (las cuales coordinan el trabajo con las Iglesias locales pobres o emergentes). Origen histórico: ¿Cuándo empezó y quién lo instituyó? La idea tiene raíces en la labor misionera y en organizaciones de apoyo a las misiones. Una figura clave es Pauline Jaricot, la laica francesa del siglo XIX, fundadora de la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe, una de las cuatro Sociedades Misionales Pontificias. Formalmente, el Papa Pío XI instituyó la jornada en 1926. La decisión vino luego de una petición de la Asociación para la Propagación de la Fe (APF, en inglés "Association for the Propagation of the Faith"), que en una asamblea plenaria había solicitado al Papa un día universal de oración y apoyo a las misiones.La primera colecta mundial tuvo lugar en octubre de 1927. Desde ese momento, se ha mantenido como fecha fija en el calendario litúrgico, evidenciando la dimensión universal y solidaria de la misión. El impulso original pretendía: 1. Fomentar la conciencia sobre la magnitud de la tarea misionera. 2. Estimular el celo misionero entre los clérigos y el pueblo fiel. 3. Hacer más conocida la Asociación para la Propagación de la Fe y fomentar donaciones para las misiones. Enfasis del Papa para 2025 (tema y mensaje). Para 2025 el tema elegido es: "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples" (en español: "Misioneros de esperanza entre todos los pueblos") Algunas líneas centrales del mensaje papal. El Papa Francisco invita a que cada bautizado sea mensajero y constructor de esperanza, especialmente en un mundo marcado por incertidumbres, sufrimientos y sombras.La esperanza cristiana no es algo abstracto, sino vivida a través de la oración, el testimonio de vida y la cercanía con los pobres, los marginados y los más vulnerables. "La oración es la primera actividad misionera y al mismo tiempo la
