

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

OUR LADY OF PEACE PARISH REV. ANTHONY GENEROSE PASTOR

Of all the New Testament literature, the Letters of Saint Paul to the Thessalonians are the earliest written. One of the themes Saint Paul addresses to this



early community of believers is the expectation of the second coming of the Christ. The Parousia, or the Rapture, as other Christian communities of today refer to Jesus' second coming, was expected to be an immediate conclusion to the new age established in Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

Soon we will celebrate the first coming of the Christ as a baby born to Mary in Bethlehem. But the Thessalonians, however, were more decided on preparing for Jesus' immediate return in glory that they preoccupied themselves for its happening at any moment. Ordinary living for the Christians of Thessalonica seemed to grind to a halt. As the minutes and hours ticked by, preoccupation with Jesus' coming again in glory began to break down the social fabric and structures necessary for sustaining human life. In today's short passage from his second letter to the Thessalonians, Paul says, if you don't work, you don't eat. Some simple, yet sound advice that it hardly needs to be given. But apparently, Paul thought it necessary to state it clearly and succinctly. And the reasons are more than the obvious. Saint Paul is very conscious of the potential demise of society, of course. Yet, he understands the second coming from the perspective of faith. And that faith is testified to by Jesus himself who said in no uncertain terms that his coming again will come like a thief in the night; on a day and at an hour no one, not even he, knew. So, living your life must occur all the while we wait in anticipation of Christ's return in glory at a moments notice. How so?

Well, for one, Saint Paul says that he and his fellow ministers of the gospel are an example to imitate. He and his friends were not idle but productive in procuring for their own needs to not be a burden on anyone. If they are anything given to them it was because they earned it by working hard. Think of it this way: the kingdom of God is being built up by the hard work of every member of the community in the caring for one another's needs. Also, the old saying applies, "Idle hands are the devil's workshop." If you don't occupy yourself with building up the community by working for the common good, you will occupy yourself with business of other people. In other words, many Thessalonians became gossips and there's no greater danger to the stability of the community than gossiping. Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Querida familia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz, Hemos llegado al penúltimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En palabras sencillas, estamos concluyendo un año



litúrgico. La Palabra nos invita a revisar muchos aspectos fundamentales de nuestra vida. El primero, como enseña el apóstol Pablo, es comprender que hemos venido con la misión de servir y no de ser servidos, aunque esto último nos resulte más cómodo. Por eso, el Apóstol dice: "Una de las tareas que asumí fue no ser una carga para ustedes, ganándome el pan con dignidad, con el propósito de darles ejemplo."Pero, como bien se dice: "Hasta en las mejores familias hay ovejas negras", personas que prefieren no hacer nada, pero se entrometen en todo. Y sin embargo, hay tantas cosas en las que deberíamos ocuparnos para no ser engañados por el mundo, y mucho menos devorados por él.

Para no caer en esa desgracia, el Señor nos habla de realidades muy claras, de carácter escatológico, que no deben asustarnos, sino más bien fortalecernos como hijos de Dios. De este modo, se hace realidad lo que el mismo Señor nos dice en San Juan 17,14-16: "Yo les he dado tu palabra, y el mundo los ha odiado porque no son del mundo. No te pido que los saques del mundo, sino que los guardes del maligno. Ellos no son del mundo, como tampoco yo soy del mundo."

Y para no ser del mundo, lo primero es que el mundo deje de impresionarnos, ya sea por lo que vemos, escuchamos o poseemos. Así les ocurrió también a los discípulos en el Evangelio: estaban maravillados por la solidez del templo, su belleza y las riquezas de las ofrendas. Pero Cristo les dijo: "Todo esto se acabará; no quedará piedra sobre piedra." Y así fue. En el año 70 d.C., los romanos destruyeron el templo por dos grandes razones: la primera, para robarlo todo, y la segunda, para acabar con la fe del pueblo, romper su unidad e imponerles otras creencias. Una práctica muy actual, como sucede en los países donde se quiere borrar la fe o la historia de los pueblos. Pero el Señor Jesús es claro: lo que deben hacer es lo siguiente:

1. Que nadie los engañe, porque vendrán muchos, incluso usurpando el lugar de Dios. Desde el primer mandamiento se nos dice: "Amarás a Dios sobre todas las cosas."

2. Que no los domine el pánico, pues sucederán muchas cosas y ustedes serán testigos.

3. Manténganse firmes. Este es el mensaje más importante, porque no podemos flaquear, ni ante el miedo, ni ante la tentación, ni ante la pobreza, ni ante la riqueza. ALABADO SEA JESUCRISTO EL SEÑOR For a translation in English please visit our website, https://www.olpphazleton.org/PastorsCorner
