Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

The word “Advent” derives from the Latin, Adventus. The term Adventus refers to a celebratory occasion marking the arrival of the Roman emperor to a city. Of course, an Adventus required pulling out all the stops with splendid decorations, music and great crowds to welcome the emperor. Upon reception, the emperor received praise from noble citizens with speeches on behalf of the citizens in gratitude for the imperial presence which guaranteed the security of the city and its inhabitants. Festivals and games also occurred during the imperial visit of the Adventus. Not only the emperor, but also Roman provincial governors and bishops received such welcome. How far out from the city's limits the welcoming party went to receive the dignitary depended on the guest's rank and status.

The Catholic season of Advent has much the same sense. “The coming of the Christ” into the world demands a period of preparation in anticipation of the yearly celebration of Christmas. Our cities already beam with decorative lighting, and our stores play the Christmas favorites of old. But what about our hearts? This is where the Christ wishes to reign. How far out from ourselves are we willing to go to welcome Jesus? Perhaps we can reflect on the style in which Jesus came in making our personal rendering to the Lord of Lords, and the King of Kings fruitful. Let's remember three things for our reflection:

- Jesus came the first time almost unnoticed. The first inkling of his coming came to a young girl with the visit of an angel from heaven. Then at his birth the angels of heaven sang to shepherds watching their sheep. His humble coming among us shows us where to begin this advent preparation – with humble hearts.

- Then there's Jesus' Adventus into Jerusalem in which he demonstrates humility. On Palm Sunday we recall this moment solemnly, but also humbly, knowing that by the end of the week it would be a different story.

- Jesus' final Adventus in human history will be the glorious one. Then he will come to judge the living and the dead. All the more reason the Advent season should occur every year as a practice in heartfelt humility for you and me.

El Nacimiento y el Espíritu del Adviento

Queridos hermanos y hermanas: Hoy iniciamos el Adviento, ese tiempo en que la Iglesia abre de nuevo la puerta del corazón para recibir el misterio del Nacimiento del Señor. El Adviento no es simplemente un “recordar” que Jesús nació; es un tiempo de despertar, de convertirnos, y de caminar hacia la luz que viene de Dios. Adviento es un tiempo para “ponernos de pie por dentro”, para alinear la vida con la Palabra y para permitir que Cristo vuelva a nacer en nosotros. La primera lectura (Is 2,1-5) nos ofrece una visión maravillosa: todas las naciones suben al monte del Señor, atraídas por su luz, buscando su palabra que juzga, sana y une. Isaías anuncia un nacimiento: el nacimiento de un mundo nuevo, donde las espadas se transforman en arados y donde los pies cansados aprenden a caminar en caminos de paz. Es Dios diciéndonos: “No sigan viviendo de noche; suban al monte, pongan a Dios en el centro, y encontrarán dirección, fuerza y paz.” Adviento es precisamente eso: levantarnos y caminar hacia la luz. San Pablo, en la segunda lectura (Rom 13,11-14), lo dice con urgencia: “Es hora de despertar del sueño.” San Pablo habla de un sueño espiritual, de esas zonas en las que nos hemos acostumbrado a la mediocridad, al pecado pequeño, a la rutina que apaga el fuego interior. Adviento es una alarma espiritual: la noche se está terminando y ya está amaneciendo el día nuevo que trae Cristo. Por eso San Pablo nos pide despojarnos de las obras de la oscuridad y revestirnos de Cristo. El nacimiento que celebramos no es solo el de Belén, sino el de un corazón renovado, limpio, vigilante y dispuesto a amar. El Evangelio (Mt 24,37-44) completa la enseñanza recordándonos que el Hijo del Hombre llega siempre de manera inesperada. Así como en tiempos de Noé muchos vivían distraídos, hoy también hay quienes viven sin mirar a Dios, sin dejarlo nacer, sin preparar el corazón. Pero Jesús nos invita a la vigilancia. Pues vigilar no es vivir con miedo, sino vivir despiertos, atentos, conscientes, disponibles. Podemos reafirmar vigilar es “cuidar la gracia”, es no permitir que la rutina espiritual, la tristeza o el pecado apaguen lo que Dios quiere encender en nosotros. Por eso, este Adviento no es solo una espera: es una preparación activa. No esperamos pasivamente, sino abriendo caminos al Señor: reconciliándonos, orando más, sirviendo mejor, sanando relaciones, y dejando que la Palabra nos levante y nos transforme. Si queremos celebrar bien el nacimiento de Jesús, necesitamos permitir que Él nazca en nuestras decisiones, en nuestras prioridades y en nuestros pasos diarios. Queridos hermanos, caminemos en la luz del Señor. Que este Adviento sea un tiempo de gracia en que volvamos al monte de Dios, despertemos del sueño espiritual y vivamos vigilantes, con un corazón encendido, para que cuando llegue el Niño Dios en Navidad pueda encontrar un hogar limpio, abierto y lleno de fe. Amén.
