

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Yet another Sunday liturgical celebration focuses on something other than a seasonal Sunday observance. This Sunday marks the anniversary of the dedication of the

marks the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of Saint John Lateran in the city of Rome. Interesting!! A world-wide celebration of a Roman basilica's dedication on a Sunday of Ordinary Time! Why would that be?

Well, for one, it's one of the oldest sites of Catholic worship in the Western Christendom. In fact, it is the papal archbasilica of the four papal basilicas in Rome. I'll leave it to you to name the other three. Anyway, the original footprint of the Basilica of Saint John Lateran is a palace given by the Laterani family to Constantine in 311 A.D.

Pope Sylvester I was the first to establish his cathedral at the Lateran palace and dedicated it in 324 A.D which means Saint John Lateran celebrated its 1700 anniversary in 2024! Thus, Saint John Lateran is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. It happens that the Bishop of Rome is also the Pontiff of the Universal Church and the Patriarch of the Latin Church. For that reason, Saint John Lateran is the mother church of all the churches of the Catholic world.

Also, of the 21 ecumenical councils, the first being in Jerusalem during the time of the apostles, Saint John Lateran is the site of five of those 21 councils.

And, finally, who is Saint John Lateran? Truth be told, Saint John Lateran was not a person. Really, it's just a simple way to refer to this beautiful site of worship because if you think our new parish, Our Lady of Peace Parish at Most Precious Blood and Our Lady of Grace Churches is a mouthful, how about this: the official name of Saint John Lateran is "The Papal Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in the Lateran." Gee whiz!!! Why is that? Good question! First, every papal basilica is dedicated to the Most Holy Savior. Second, years of deterioration, floods and a couple of fires necessitated reconstruction and renovation of the basilica over the course of nearly 2 millennia. Hence several dedications have taken place in that span of time, the first to the Most Holy Savior, the second to Saint John the Baptist and the third, to Saint John the Evangelist.

¿Qué conmemora la Dedicación de la Basílica de Letrán?

1) La Basílica de San Juan de Letrán en Roma es la catedral del obispo de Roma, es decir, del Papa, y por lo tanto tiene un lugar privilegiado como la iglesia madre de toda la Iglesia Católica.

2) En el año 324, el Papa Silvestre I dedicó (consagró) esta iglesia como Casa de Dios, bajo el patrocinio de Cristo Salvador, y con el tiempo también le fueron añadidos los santos Juan Bautista y Juan Evangelista como copatronos.

3) La dedicación significa consagrar el edificio santo para el culto divino, para que sea lugar de encuentro de Dios con su Pueblo.

4) Con el tiempo esta conmemoración se hizo universal no sólo en Roma como signo de la unidad de la Iglesia bajo la cátedra de Pedro. En 1726, el papa Benedicto XIII la extendió para que toda la Iglesia la célebre.

5) En el calendario litúrgico en latín se llama Dedicatio Basílica Lateranensis.

6) Así el 9 de noviembre de cada año se recuerda esa dedicación original y se actualiza en cada celebración litúrgica no sólo la memoria del edificio histórico, sino el significado espiritual de que cada comunidad cristiana y cada fieles "templo vivo de Dios".

¿Por qué ese día "sobre sale" al domingo ordinario? ¿Por qué se celebra aun siendo domingo? Para entender esto, es necesario conocer cómo clasifica la Iglesia los días litúrgicos: domingos, solemnidades, fiestas, memoriales, etc., y qué celebraciones tienen prioridad.

a) Jerarquía litúrgica: solemnidades, fiestas y memoriales I: En la Iglesia católica, los días litúrgicos tienen distintos rangos o niveles de importancia: solemnidad, fiesta, memorias obligatorias y memoria libre.

II) Una solemnidad es el rango más alto de celebración como Navidad, Pascua, etc. En una solemnidad se incluye el Gloria, a veces el Credo, y suele tener prefacios propios y bendiciones especiales.

III) Si una solemnidad cae en domingo fuera de tiempos litúrgicos que tienen prioridad como Adviento, Cuaresma, Pascua, la solemnidad reemplaza la celebración del domingo. Es decir, se celebra la solemnidad en lugar del domingo "ordinario".

IV) En la Tabla de días litúrgicos según su orden de precedencia, aparece que la solemnidad de la dedicación de la iglesia propia (o de su aniversario) es un tipo propio de solemnidad, y por eso tiene prioridad sobre el domingo ordinario.

- B) En el texto del calendario litúrgico se indica que este día es "una fiesta del Señor" una solemnidad del Señor y por eso tiene prioridad litúrgica sobre el domingo.
- C) En otras palabras: aunque sea domingo, esta solemnidad litúrgica se cumple en lugar del domingo ordinario, de modo que la liturgia del día será la de la Dedicación de Letrán y no la del domingo correspondiente.
- D) Por eso, se puede decir que es de "precepto" obligación litúrgica, puesto que las solemnidades tienen ese peso y no se suprimen en caso de que coincidan con domingos ,salvo en algunos casos con excepciones, pero no aplicables aquí.
