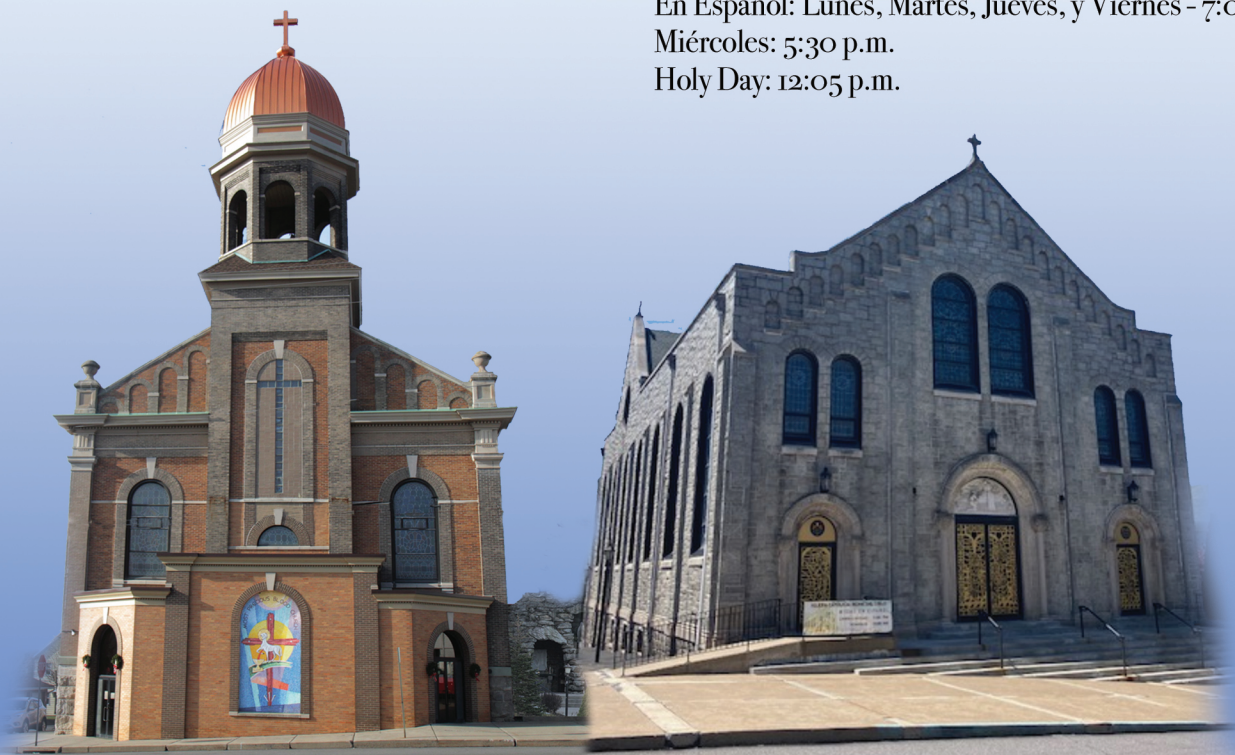

**CCD Classes:** are held every Sunday morning from 8:45 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at Most Precious Blood.

**Sacrament of Matrimony:** In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

**Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor:** It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at [www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis](http://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis).

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

We prayerfully recite the “Hail Mary” every day. The words following immediately in the prayer are “full of grace.” These words, spoken by the angel Gabriel to Mary at the Annunciation, indicate Mary’s privileged status as a human being having been conceived without sin.

For centuries, the Church in the East celebrates Mary as “the All Holy” Mother of God as much as she was “free from any stain of sin, as though fashioned by the Holy Spirit and formed as a new creature.” In the Latin Church, the dogma of the Immaculate Conception was confessed by Pope Pius IX in 1854, one of the only two dogmatic teachings of the Church arising from the sensus fidelium and declared on the principal guarantee of the Pope’s infallibility when teaching on faith and morals. The Immaculate Conception, then, does not refer to Mary’s conceiving of Jesus in her own womb, but Mary’s conception in her mother’s womb. In the words of Pope Pius IX, “The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin.”

The Church established December 8th the feast day of the Immaculate Conception in order to celebrate the prevenient grace which prepared her for conceiving the Savior of the World in her own womb. December 8th is a holy day with the obligation of all the Catholic faithful to participate in the liturgy on that day not only to honor Mary, the Mother of God’s most unique status, but also to remind us of the great privilege we have as her children redeemed by her Son’s passion and death.

Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception, revealed herself to Bernadette Soubirous during the Lourdes apparitions and Mary is celebrated widely around the world under this title as patroness of churches, shrines and, yes, even the United States of America.

“Prepárense, porque viene el que renueva todas las cosas” Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

El Adviento avanza, y hoy la Palabra nos invita a mirar hacia adelante, hacia aquel que viene a renovar la vida desde la raíz. No se trata de un cambio superficial, sino de una transformación profunda, como la que anuncia Isaías: “De un tronco talado brotará un renuevo”. Cuando todo parece seco, agotado, sin futuro, Dios hace brotar vida nueva.

Así obra el Señor: no desde lo espectacular, sino desde lo pequeño, lo humilde, lo que nadie imagina.

Ese renuevo ese pequeño brote es “Cristo”. Sobre Él descansa el Espíritu que trae sabiduría, fortaleza, consejo, ciencia y temor de Dios. Si dejamos que ese Espíritu toque nuestra vida, también en nosotros puede surgir un renacer: un corazón más pacífico, menos violento; una familia más unida, menos dividida; una comunidad que transforma las espadas en herramientas de paz.

San Pablo, en la carta a los Romanos, nos recuerda que la Palabra sostiene, consuela y da esperanza. Adviento tiempo para volver a la Palabra con más hambre, con más silencio, con más obediencia interior. Allí descubrimos que Cristo ha venido para reunir, no para separar; para abrir puertas, no para cerrarlas; para que glorifiquemos a Dios con un mismo corazón y una sola voz.

Y aparece Juan el Bautista con su voz firme, directa, sin maquillaje espiritual: “Conviértanse, porque el Reino de los Cielos está cerca.”

Juan no suaviza el mensaje. Él sabe que no hay Adviento verdadero sin conversión. No basta con preparar la casa por fuera; es el corazón lo que necesita ser enderezado.

Juan habla de cambiar de rumbo, de cortar de raíz aquello que no da fruto: el orgullo, la indiferencia, las palabras que hieren, las actitudes que destruyen la unidad, la religiosidad vacía que no toca la vida.

El Bautista nos hace una pregunta decisiva:

¿Queremos de verdad que Cristo renazca en nosotros este año? Si la respuesta es “sí”, entonces hay que dar frutos: humildad, reconciliación, paciencia, oración sincera, obras concretas de caridad. Porque viene el más fuerte, el que bautiza con Espíritu Santo y fuego, el que purifica y ordena, el que separa lo que es de Dios de lo que es pura apariencia. Hermanos, que este segundo domingo de Adviento sea un llamado a despertar, a volver al Señor de corazón, y a permitir que el Espíritu Santo haga brotar en nuestra vida un renuevo nuevo, fresco y lleno de esperanza.

Que cuando Cristo llegue, nos encuentre vigilantes, en camino, y con frutos que glorifiquen su nombre.

Amén.

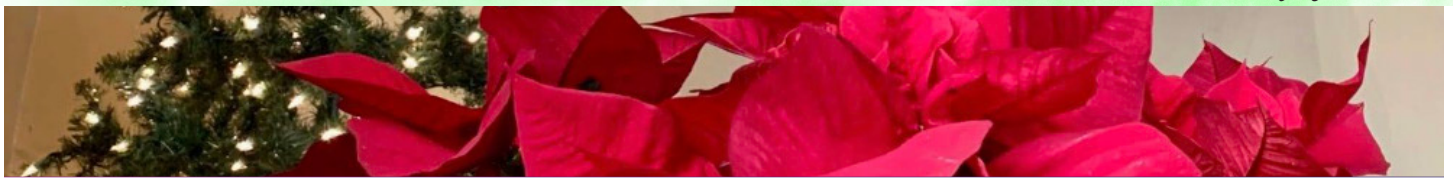
