

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Wednesday begins our Lenten journey. The distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday will occur during the 8 am Mass at MPB church, during the 12:05 pm Mass at OLG church and following a Liturgy of the Word at 4 pm at MPB church.

The imposition of ashes has its roots in Old Testament penitential practices of putting on sackcloth and sitting in ashes. The Old Testament practices were signs of our humility and mortality before the eternal God, as well as a symbol of our repentance for sinful transgressions before the all-holy Lord. The practice of a 40-day period of fasting began in the Church in the 4th century. The practice of Ash Wednesday and the 40-day period of fasting and abstinence was formally established for the universal Church by Pope Gregory I in the 6th century. A conscious effort on the part of the faithful toward a daily practice of humility and repentance is the takeaway from having ashes made from the burnt palm blessed and distributed on Palm Sunday during the celebration of Jesus' passion the previous year. As the ashes are placed on our foreheads in the sign of a cross, we hear the admonition, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return."

The practices of the imposition of ashes and the entire 40-day journey of Lent also help us prepare to renew our baptismal promises at the Easter Sunday Masses. The renewal of baptismal promises occurs at the time of the Creed, when we do not recite, but reply, "I do" to the celebrant's requests to renew our faith in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We can say that the 40-day Lenten journey is about self-denial in preparation for a greater commitment in word and deed to our God.

The practices of fasting and abstinence are regulated in the 1983 Code of Canon Law. The days of abstinence from meat are Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Those obliged by the norms of Lenten abstinence are all who have achieved the age of 14. The days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday on which days the faithful not only abstain from meat but also only consume one full meal and two partial meals. Those obliged by the norms of fasting are all who have achieved the eighteenth year of age until the beginning of the sixtieth year of age. The faithful are also encouraged to take up other penitential practices involving fasting, prayer and alms giving. May God bless our Lenten journey and our resolve to commit our lives to the Lord.

Vivir la Cuaresma: sentido, propósito y tarea

La Cuaresma no es solamente un tiempo litúrgico; es una oportunidad de volver al corazón de Dios y al corazón propio. Su sentido es la conversión: reconocer dónde estamos y hacia dónde debemos caminar. Su fin es la Pascua, es decir, la vida nueva que brota de Cristo. Su propósito es restaurar nuestra relación con Dios, con los demás y con nosotros mismos.

Las tareas concretas son claras: oración más profunda, ayuno que eduque el deseo y limosna que ensanche el corazón. No se trata de cumplir prácticas externas, sino de permitir que Dios transforme nuestras decisiones, sane nuestras heridas y fortalezca nuestra fidelidad. Cuaresma es tiempo de revisar prioridades, reconciliarnos, ordenar la vida y caminar con esperanza hacia la Resurrección.

Sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La Palabra nos recuerda que Dios pone delante de nosotros la vida y la muerte, el bien y el mal. No somos marionetas del destino; somos responsables de nuestras elecciones. El Señor respeta nuestra libertad, pero también nos muestra el camino que conduce a la plenitud. San Pablo nos habla de la sabiduría de Dios, una sabiduría que no es superficial ni pasajera, sino profunda y revelada por el Espíritu. No se trata de una fe infantil, sino madura, capaz de discernir y de optar por lo que edifica.

En el Evangelio, Jesús no viene a abolir la Ley, sino a llevarla a su plenitud. Nos invita a pasar de lo externo a lo interior, del simple cumplimiento a la coherencia del corazón. No basta con evitar el mal visible; es necesario purificar las intenciones, sanar las palabras y ordenar los afectos. La verdadera justicia nace de un corazón convertido. Que esta Palabra nos impulse a elegir la vida, a buscar la sabiduría del Espíritu y a vivir una fe coherente, profunda y luminosa en medio de nuestra comunidad.

"You go straight to Heaven if you participate in the Mass each day." - St. Carlo Acutis
 At a young age, he developed exceptional skill as a self-taught computer programmer. Carlo asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages – to the places of the saints, and to the sites of Eucharistic miracles. During a two-and-a-half period, Carlo created a portable exhibition and a related website documenting and promoting 187 Eucharistic miracles such as bleeding hosts and transubstantiation from around the world. He created the website <https://www.miracolieuaristici.org/en/liste/list.html> to catalog his research and share his findings with others. (The easiest way to access this site is by Googling "Carlo Acutis website".) His website is a virtual museum of the Eucharistic Miracles of the world categorized by country and locale, a list of saints and mystics, and apparitions of Our Lady, and is recognized by the Church as an important tool for religious instruction. His official association address is www.carloacutis.com. His integration of faith and technology serves as a powerful reminder for the potential for technology to be a force of good in the world. Carlo is often referred to as "God's Influencer" and is commonly known as "the patron saint of the internet." On Monday October 2, 2006, Carlo fell ill, thinking he was suffering from a common flu. By Sunday, October 8th his condition deteriorated dramatically, and he was diagnosed with a very aggressive form of acute promyelocytic leukemia. On Tuesday October 10th he received the Anointing of the Sick and Communion. The following day, Carlo lapsed into a coma due to a cerebral hemorrhage triggered by the leukemia and passed away on October 12th at the age of fifteen. His family was unable to donate Carlo's organs because they were compromised by the leukemia. At his request he was buried in Assisi because of his love for St. Francis. His last words were "Mama, don't be afraid. Since Jesus became a man, death has become the passage towards life, and we don't need to flee it. Let us prepare ourselves to experience something extraordinary in the eternal life."
