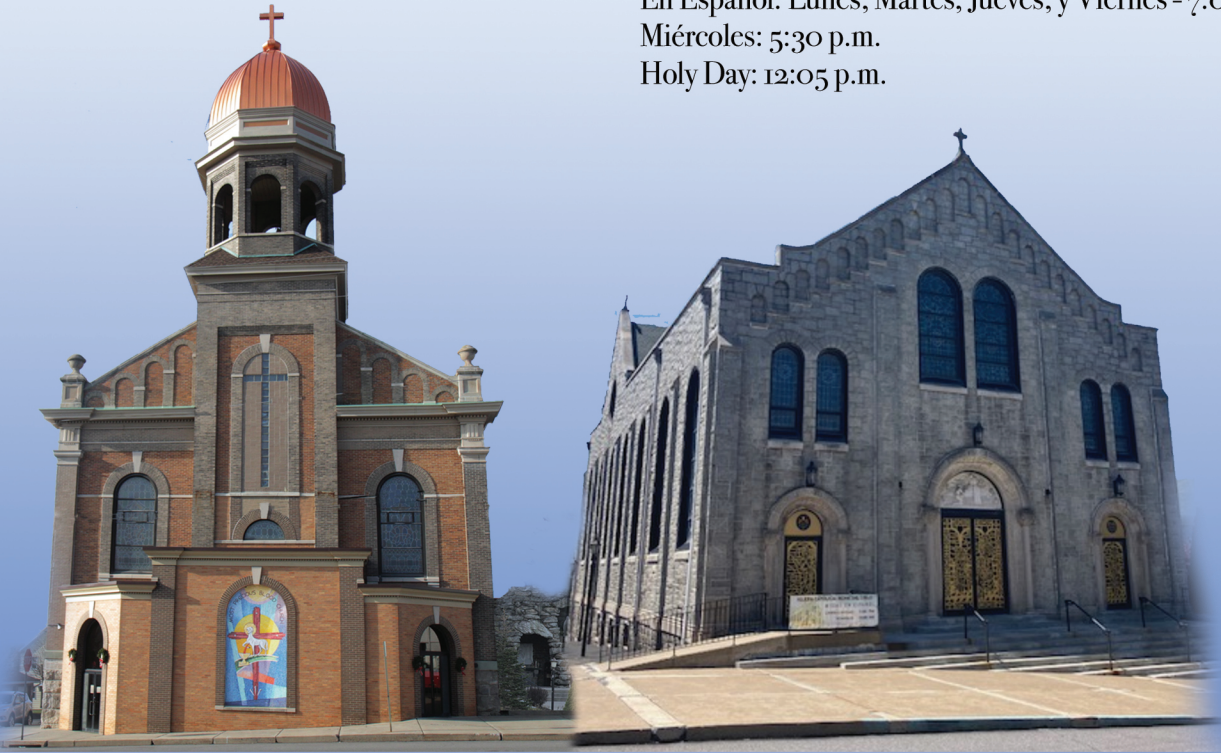

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

It amazing that only three or four days after the Last Supper, the two disciples on the road to Emmaus already have knowledge about what went on in the upper room.

Do you suppose the apostles were just sitting around waiting in fear before Jesus appeared to them risen from the dead? Or is it more likely they were already evangelizing one another as they sat in their confusion and disbelief?

I think the apostles were talking about all that had happened in the last several days among themselves, of course, but also with others close to the group who were not at the Last Supper, in the Garden of Gethsemani or even beneath the cross. That's how we process our experiences, especially the traumatic kinds of experiences we have endured. We take what we've experienced, and we hand it on to others in order to find some meaning. And even though they are paralyzed by fear, I cannot help but think that in the sharing of the experience of Jesus' death, they could not help but view it through the experience of being with Jesus for three years before Good Friday. That's the message from Acts of the Apostles today.

It's also very much a part of the Gospel passage today. The two disciples are now processing the last several days' events looking for meaning. Then a third person joins in the conversation. But it's all being viewed through lens of the Sacred Scriptures. They were evangelizing one another before they even recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. And at once there was no need to see him any longer. He was alive in their hearts like a warm fire on a cold winter's night.

Have you noticed how we do the very same thing? We sit around, sometimes seemingly paralyzed by something that's happened to us or to someone we know and care about. And while we wrestle with the meaning of it all, we do so in view of our faith. We ask for prayers, and we offer them. We evangelize ourselves even before we glimpse the presence of the Lord in our midst.

If you've ever searched for a reason to participate in Mass frequently, or to extend an invitation to another person to join you at Mass, maybe you've found one in today's message. We spend our lives in search of meaning. We also evangelize one another in search of meaning. But things become clear when Jesus sets the table and is not only the host for the feast. He also reveals himself in the very food we eat!

Querida familia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz: En este Tercer Domingo de Pascua, la Palabra de Dios nos conduce por un camino profundamente humano y, al mismo tiempo, divinamente transformador: el camino de los discípulos de Emaús. Es el camino de quienes han creído, han esperado... y, de repente, sienten que todo se ha derrumbado. El Evangelio nos presenta a dos discípulos que se alejan de Jerusalén. No solo se están moviendo geográficamente; están huyendo interiormente. Se alejan del lugar donde Dios actuó, porque no entendieron cómo actuó. Llevan consigo una fe herida, una esperanza rota y un corazón confundido. Y, sin embargo, es precisamente ahí en ese estado de crisis donde el Resucitado se hace presente. Cristo no irrumpe con imposición, sino que se acerca caminando con ellos. Escucha, pregunta, permite que desahoguen su frustración. Luego, con paciencia, les abre las Escrituras y les muestra que el sufrimiento no fue el final, sino el camino hacia la gloria. Aquí hay una clave fundamental para nuestra vida: cuando no entendemos a Dios, no es que Él esté ausente, sino que aún no hemos aprendido a leer su obra en profundidad. El testimonio de Pedro en los Hechos de los Apóstoles confirma esta verdad con fuerza: Jesús, a quien muchos rechazaron y entregaron, ha sido resucitado por Dios. La historia que parecía un fracaso es, en realidad, el cumplimiento del plan divino. Lo que el hombre torció, Dios lo redimió. Lo que parecía derrota, se convirtió en victoria. Por su parte, la carta de Pedro nos recuerda que hemos sido rescatados no con cosas pasajeras, sino con la sangre preciosa de Cristo. Esto significa que nuestra vida ya no puede seguir anclada en la superficialidad o en la desesperanza. Hemos sido llamados a una vida nueva, sostenida por una esperanza viva que no defrauda. El momento decisivo del Evangelio ocurre al partir el pan. Allí se les abren los ojos. No fue en el camino, ni en la explicación intelectual, sino en el gesto eucarístico donde reconocen al Señor. Y esto nos interpela profundamente: podemos caminar con Cristo, escuchar su Palabra, pero si no entramos en una experiencia viva de encuentro especialmente en la Eucaristía nuestros ojos pueden permanecer cerrados. Después de reconocerlo, los discípulos no se quedan en Emaús. Regresan a Jerusalén. El encuentro verdadero con Cristo siempre nos devuelve a la comunidad, nos reintegra, nos envía. El que ha experimentado al Resucitado no puede seguir huyendo, no puede seguir encerrado en su dolor; necesita anunciar, compartir, testimoniar. Hoy, el Señor también camina con nosotros. En nuestras dudas, en nuestras heridas, en nuestras decepciones... Él no se escandaliza de nuestra fragilidad. Pero nos invita a dar un paso más: a dejarnos iluminar por su Palabra, a reconocerlo en la fracción del pan y a volver con un corazón ardiente a la vida de fe y de comunidad. Que este Domingo no sea solo un recuerdo, sino un punto de inflexión. Que podamos preguntarnos con sinceridad: ¿estamos huyendo como los discípulos o estamos permitiendo que Cristo transforme nuestro camino? Porque cuando el corazón arde... ya no hay noche que nos detenga.
