

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

La luz que vence la sombra, la unidad que sana la Iglesia. La Palabra de Dios en este Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario nos conduce a una certeza que sostiene la fe cuando el corazón se siente agotado: Dios no abandona a su pueblo en la oscuridad, sino que entra en ella para encender una luz que no se apaga. Las lecturas de hoy presentan un movimiento espiritual claro: de la opresión a la esperanza, de la dispersión a la comunión, de la rutina a la misión. El profeta Isaías anuncia que "el pueblo que caminaba en tinieblas vio una gran luz" (Is 9,1). Este texto no es poesía ingenua: es una proclamación profética nacida en un contexto de crisis, cuando la vida parecía reducida a sobrevivir. La "tiniebla" no es solo ausencia de luz exterior, sino símbolo de desorientación interior, miedo colectivo, pérdida de sentido y cansancio del alma. Sin embargo, Dios promete que esa región humillada será la primera en ser visitada. La lógica divina sorprende: Dios comienza por donde otros terminan, y levanta precisamente lo que parecía despreciable. Por eso la luz en Isaías no solo ilumina: libera, restaura y devuelve alegría, como cuando se rompe el yugo que oprime y el pueblo vuelve a respirar. Esa promesa se cumple cuando el Evangelio nos presenta a Jesús iniciando su misión en Galilea (Mt 4,12-23). No es un detalle geográfico: es una declaración teológica. Jesús se coloca en la periferia para revelar que el Reino no es privilegio de unos pocos, sino gracia ofrecida a los heridos, a los cansados y a los que viven en sombras. Su primer anuncio es contundente: "Convírtanse, porque el Reino de los cielos está cerca" (Mt 4,17). Convertirse no es sólo "cambiar de conducta", sino cambiar de dirección, permitir que Dios reoriente la vida desde dentro. Es dejar que la luz de Cristo toque las zonas que escondemos: el orgullo, la doble vida, la indiferencia, la mentira, el resentimiento, la dureza del corazón. La conversión verdadera no es un maquillaje espiritual: es un retorno al centro, y el centro es Cristo. Luego Jesús llama a los discípulos: "Síguenme". La vocación nace de una mirada que alcanza el corazón. Ellos dejan redes, porque cuando Cristo llama, no invita a decorar la vida, sino a entregarla. Ser "pescadores de hombres" significa entrar en la dinámica del Reino: rescatar vidas, levantar caídos, acompañar procesos, anunciar esperanza, sanar heridas. La misión no se reduce a un templo: se extiende a la vida cotidiana, donde Cristo sigue caminando, enseñando, proclamando y sanando. San Pablo, en la carta a los Corintios, toca una herida que atraviesa todas las épocas: la división en la comunidad (1 Co 1,10-13,17). Cuando la Iglesia se fragmenta en bandos, cuando el orgullo gana espacio, cuando el "yo" pesa más que el "nosotros", se oscurece el testimonio y se debilita la misión. Pablo no discute por estrategias humanas: defiende el corazón del Evangelio. Cristo no está dividido. Y donde Cristo reina, la comunidad aprende a reconciliarse, a hablar con verdad, a caminar con humildad y a construir unidad sin uniformidad. Este domingo el Señor nos vuelve a decir: hay luz, hay camino, hay Reino cercano. Y esa luz no es teoría: es Cristo vivo, que nos llama a salir de la oscuridad, a sanar divisiones, y a caminar como comunidad misionera, unida, humilde y encendida por el Evangelio. 


