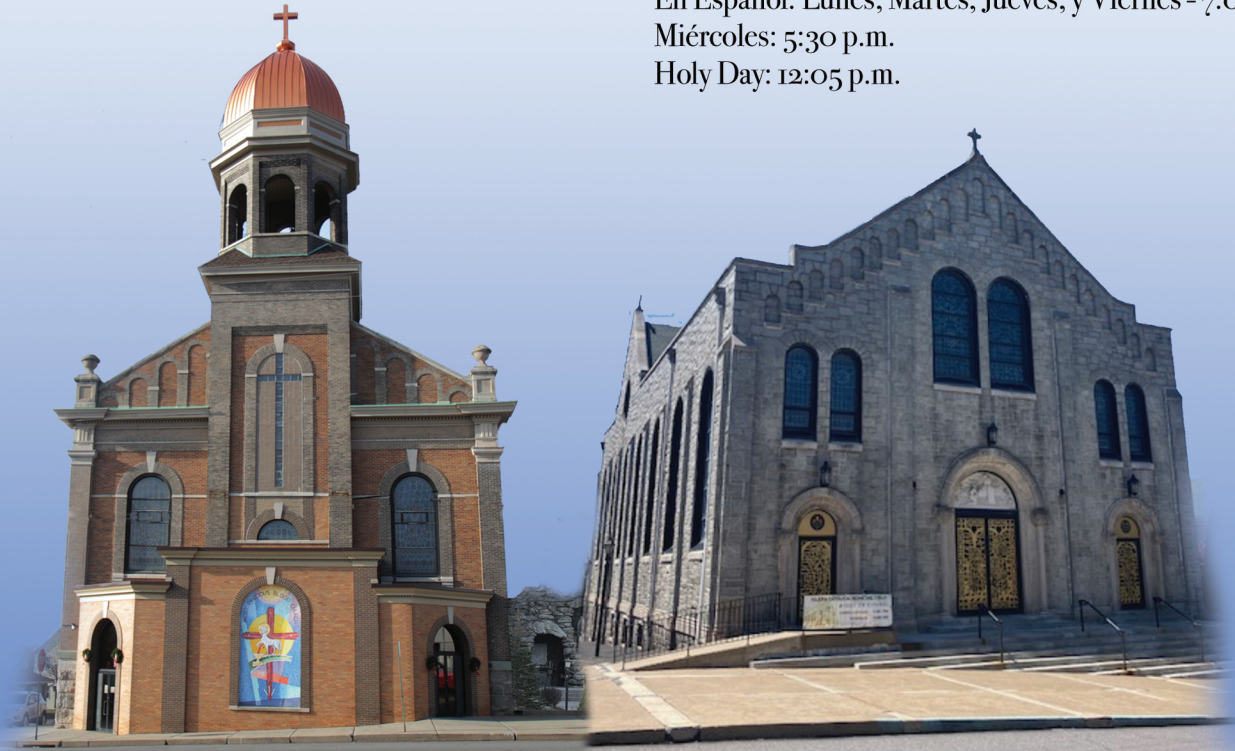

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

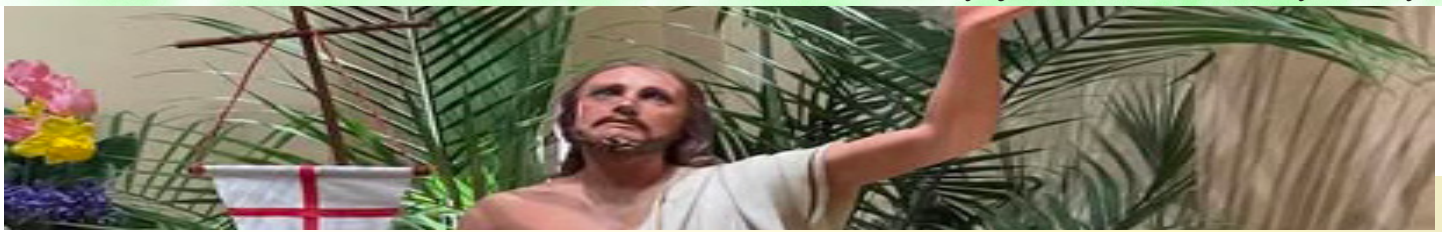

The Code of Canon Law of 1983 recognizes two types of parishes: territorial and personal. Most parishes are territorial, meaning, if a person lives within the territorial boundaries of a specific parish, he or she is understood to be a parishioner of that parish. Therefore, the parish in which one lives is understood to be his or her own "proper" parish.

More recently, however, people "shop" for a parish or participate more frequently in a parish which is not his or her proper parish according to church law. There are many reasons motivating folks to join a particular parish other than the one prescribed by law. Is the request to be honored is the question. Though the preference for territoriality remains solid on juridical and theological footings, there are also justifiable exceptions to norm of law.

Whether or not to honor such a request begins with the understanding that parishes are established to provide for the spiritual and temporal needs of the faithful. And while the obligations to be fulfilled by the faithful are not specific to a particular parish, the "familiarity" of parish life also gives rise to an individual's "identification" with a particular community of faith. Clearly, the matter of the exchange of rights and obligations between the "parish priest" and the faithful belonging to his or her "proper" parish comes into full view. A parish priest is obliged to provide for the spiritual needs of the faithful entrusted to his care, and to visitors to a lesser degree according to the condition of the individual's having a proper parish. Therefore, if a parish priest receives an individual other than his parishioners defined by territoriality and expects the individual to contribute from his or her own time, talents and treasure for the life of the parish, a moral obligation for that person's pastoral care is understood to become operative.

Great care must be taken then to discern the competing values which give rise to one's desire to participate in the life of a parish other than his or her own proper parish. That discernment would have to include the participation of an individual's proper pastor in the discernment. Such decisions do require more attention be given to the ability to provide pastoral care and the identification of the faithful with a local congregation which may be overlooked in immediate reception of a person or a family into a parish which is not their own.

Querida familia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz:

El segundo Domingo de Pascua, conocido como la Fiesta de la Divina Misericordia, no es solo una prolongación de la alegría pascual, sino una revelación profunda del corazón de Dios: un Dios que no se cansa de salir al encuentro del hombre herido, incrédulo y temeroso.

El Evangelio nos sitúa en un ambiente cargado de miedo: puertas cerradas, corazones paralizados, discípulos marcados por la culpa y la confusión. Y sin embargo, allí mismo, donde todo parece bloqueado, Jesús se hace presente y pronuncia una palabra que no condena, sino que reconstruye: "La paz esté con ustedes." No es una paz superficial. Es la paz que nace del perdón. Por eso, inmediatamente muestra sus llagas. No las oculta. No las borra. Las convierte en fuente de misericordia. Las heridas del Crucificado son ahora el lenguaje con el que Dios habla al hombre: no para recordarle su pecado, sino para ofrecerle una nueva oportunidad. Luego sopla sobre ellos y les confía una misión inmensa: "A quienes les perdonen los pecados, les quedan perdonados." Aquí se revela el corazón de la Iglesia: una comunidad no perfecta, sino reconciliada y enviada a reconciliar. La misericordia no es una idea; es una experiencia que transforma y que se comunica. Pero aparece Tomás. No estaba. No vio. No creyó. Y su reacción no es distinta a la nuestra: quiere pruebas, quiere tocar, quiere asegurarse. En el fondo, no se fía fácilmente del amor cuando ha sido herido. Ocho días después, Jesús vuelve... solo por él. No lo rechaza por su duda. No lo humilla. Se acerca y le dice: "Trae tu mano... y no seas incrédulo, sino creyente." Es un momento decisivo: Tomás toca las llagas... y en ellas descubre no solo la realidad de Cristo, sino la verdad de Dios. Y entonces brota la confesión más profunda del Evangelio: "Señor mío y Dios mío." La misericordia ha vencido la incredulidad. La primera lectura nos muestra el fruto de este encuentro: una comunidad perseverante, unida, generosa, centrada en la enseñanza, la comunión, la fracción del pan y la oración. Cuando la misericordia es acogida, la vida cambia. Se rompen los egoísmos, se comparte, se vive en alegría sencilla. No es idealismo; es el efecto real de haber sido tocados por la gracia. Y la segunda lectura nos recuerda que esta fe no elimina las pruebas, pero les da sentido: "Aunque ahora tengan que sufrir un poco, se alegran con un gozo indescriptible." La fe pascual no es evasión... es una fuerza interior que sostiene en medio de la dificultad. Hermanos, hoy la pregunta no es si creemos en la misericordia... sino si nos dejamos alcanzar por ella. Porque podemos estar dentro, con las puertas cerradas... o como Tomás, resistiendo... y aun así, Cristo sigue viniendo.

Él entra donde hay miedo.

Se queda donde hay herida.

Y ofrece paz donde hay culpa.

Que en esta Pascua no nos quedemos en una fe de palabras, sino que, tocados por su misericordia, podamos vivir como testigos: con corazones reconciliados, manos abiertas y una fe que, aun sin ver, se atreve a creer. Señor mío y Dios mío... en Ti confío.
