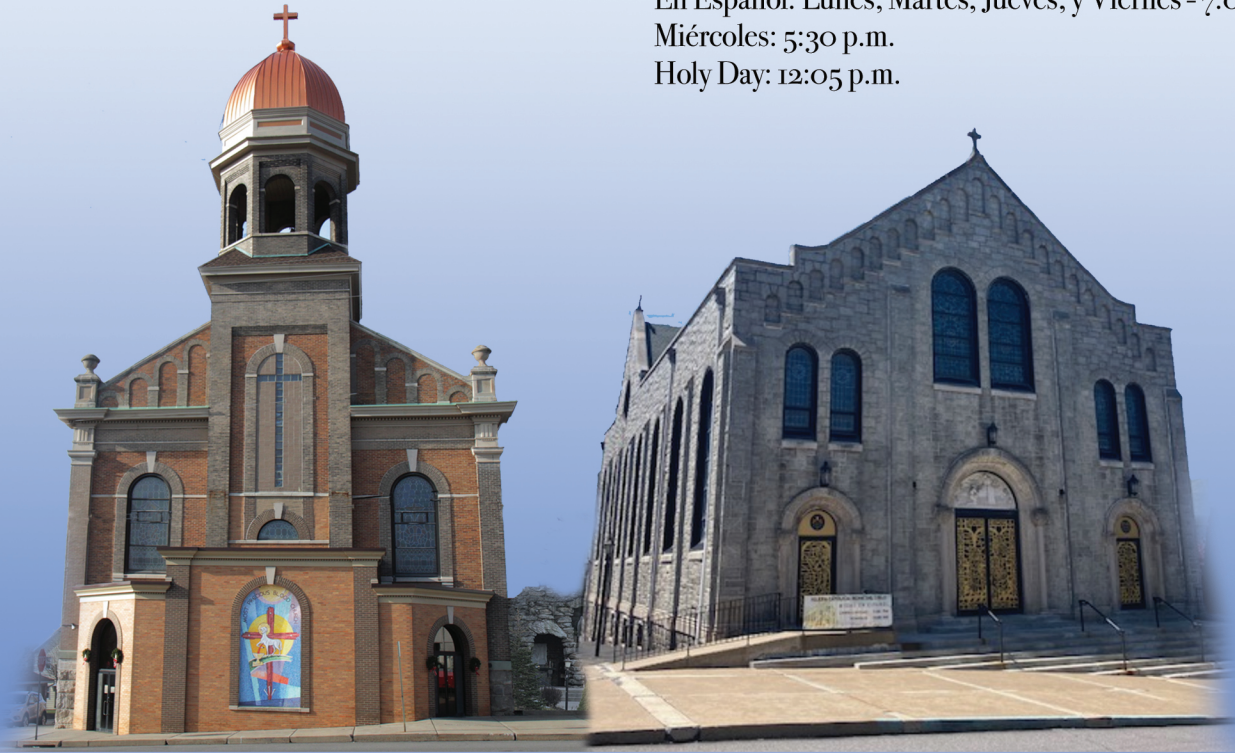

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

It's hard to believe that Easter 2026 is already seven weeks past! Churches were full and families were together for the holiday. But where have we been since that great "holy day?" Tending to life as usual I'm certain. But let's reflect on the "holy day" called Easter which gives rise to holiday traditions. Easter celebrates Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Most of us are very conscious of the fact that Jesus' resurrection came a great price for him. Obviously, the Son of God needed to die to rise from the grave. Oh, but what a death! Death on a cross cannot be considered lightly in and of itself. But Jesus' death on the cross was purposeful: victory over sin and death. Therefore, Jesus' resurrection is the trophy of that triumph as he bears the marks of his death in his risen body to this day. Jesus risen from the dead is the first sign of triumph over sin and death.

The third sign of triumph over sin and death will be our own resurrection from the dead when God will open our graves and draw us to Himself to live in glory. But what is the second sign of resurrection triumph over sin and death? Well, we are that sign. The Church throughout the ages is that sign ever since the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on Pentecost! Jesus our Risen Lord is not some trophy, like a plaster statue, that we take out of storage every year and decorate with Easter flowers. He is living and active in you and me through the power of the Holy Spirit! Sin is still a reality in our world and so is death. So, the final triumph is yet to come. But now we can work with Jesus to win the battles of our day. How so? Saint Paul to the Corinthians says the gifts of the Spirit are for service; different workings of the Lord given to us from God for some benefit.

Sin and death are menaces which can be overcome by the gifts of the Spirit as we use them in works of service for the benefits of others. Sometimes the triumphs over sin and death are miraculous. But more often the gifts of the Spirit we share in faith with one another are small acts of hope in the face of hopelessness. No one has all the gifts of the Spirit, but together we have them all. Just think, for example, how visitors to our parish for Sunday Mass might find hope if we had parishioners welcoming them to our church for Mass. You don't know where they are from or what is going on in their lives. But they will know where they are and who has given them a bit of hope that day!

Querida Familia de Nuestra Señora de la Paz: En este día, que celebramos la Advocación de María Auxiliadora, el corazón creyente se llena de gratitud y esperanza. La Iglesia contempla a la Virgen Santísima bajo esta advocación tan amada, promovida profundamente por San Juan Bosco, quien vio en María una Madre cercana, protectora de los jóvenes, consuelo de los débiles y fuerza de los cristianos en tiempos difíciles. Mucho antes, la fe del pueblo cristiano ya había experimentado la poderosa intercesión de la Virgen en momentos decisivos de la historia, especialmente al recordar cómo, tras acontecimientos que marcaron profundamente a la cristiandad, los Papas impulsaron con renovado fervor la confianza en María y el rezo del Santo Rosario como expresión de auxilio, protección y gratitud. María sigue siendo para nosotros la Madre que acompaña a la Iglesia peregrina y que, silenciosamente, conduce siempre hacia Jesucristo.

La solemnidad de Pentecostés nos recuerda una verdad fundamental: sin el Espíritu Santo, la Iglesia no tendría vida. No sería más que una organización humana, con estructuras, actividades y normas, pero sin alma, sin fuego, sin fuerza interior. El Espíritu Santo es el gran protagonista oculto de la vida cristiana. Está en el origen de la Iglesia, en su misión, en sus sacramentos, en la oración, en el discernimiento, en la conversión y en la capacidad de amar. Está en todo y para todo. Allí donde hay reconciliación verdadera, fortaleza en medio del sufrimiento, perdón sincero, esperanza en la oscuridad o deseo de santidad, allí está obrando el Espíritu de Dios. En Pentecostés, los discípulos estaban encerrados por miedo, heridos interiormente, confundidos y sin claridad sobre el futuro. Pero cuando el Espíritu descendió sobre ellos, todo cambió: el temor se convirtió en valentía, el encierro en misión y la tristeza en anuncio gozoso. La Iglesia nace precisamente cuando el Espíritu transforma corazones débiles en testigos valientes. San Pablo nos recuerda además que el Espíritu distribuye diversos dones, carismas y servicios. No todos somos iguales, pero todos somos necesarios. El Espíritu no divide; une. No uniforma; armoniza. Una parroquia verdaderamente viva no es aquella donde unos pocos hacen todo, sino aquella donde cada bautizado descubre que tiene algo que ofrecer: una palabra, un servicio, una oración, una entrega silenciosa. El Evangelio nos muestra a Cristo resucitado entrando en medio del miedo y diciendo: "La paz esté con ustedes", para luego soplar sobre los discípulos y regalarles el Espíritu Santo. Es profundamente significativo: Jesús no abandona a su Iglesia. Cuando parece que todo está roto, cuando el cansancio, las heridas, las divisiones o la indiferencia amenazan la fe, Él sigue soplando su Espíritu sobre nosotros. Pidamos a María Auxiliadora que nos enseñe a ser dóciles al Espíritu Santo. Que no vivamos una fe fría, rutinaria o superficial, sino una fe llena de fuego interior, capaz de renovar nuestras familias, sanar nuestras heridas y devolverle a nuestra comunidad la alegría de caminar con Cristo resucitado.
