

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

PASTOR'S REFLEXIÓN CORNER DEL PASTOR

Querida familia, hoy Cristo desea que nos conozcamos personalmente, donde desde la vida humana no logramos nada seguro ni seremos felices y por lo tanto nunca nos vamos a realizar. Ya que el hombre está expuesto a vivir de pensamientos inseguros, por mucho que razone, sino lo hace con la ayuda de Dios, está sujeto a equivocarse, porque la misma materia del cuerpo es corruptible, que asfixia el alma y entorpece el entendimiento.

Por eso HOY, se nos propone un camino de radicalidad. ¿Quieres ser discípulo del Señor? ¿Sabes cuál es su costo? ¿Que necesitas para ser discípulo? ¿Necesitamos cosas materiales?

Vayamos a responder un poco y auto ayudarnos: el evangelio comienza presentando una muchedumbre que lo busca, porque quiere que Jesús les solucione la vida, haciéndoles milagros. Pero Jesús muestra el camino para solucionar, por medio de los que ha elegido para estar con Él. Los discípulos. Y lo primero es un seguirle PERMANENTEMENTE, no ocasionalmente ni por visitas únicas en la vida. - 1) Ponerlo a Él, por encima de los demás, así sea mamá, papá, esposa, hijo etc.
- 2) Entender que El, es el más importante y necesario en nuestra vida y que nuestra misma vida.
- 3) Que hay que tomar la Cruz y seguirlo, que eso es estar dispuesto a morir cada día, desde nuestras comodidades, apetencias etc. Es morir con conciencia por su causa. Es por eso por lo que hoy, El propone dos reflexiones en forma de parábolas. Sobre dos aparentes necesidades que encontramos: la económica en la torre que se propone a construir el hombre. Y que, al quedar sin dinero, mejor seremos el hazme reír, de la gente. Pero la torre principal es la de nuestra vida. Que no seas tú, quien la construya, sino que sea Cristo quien te eleve. Y REPITO: que sea Cristo quien te eleve, arrebatándote del mundo, de tus dudas y temores, a como arrebato con poder al profeta ELÍAS.

Y segunda situación la apariencia de fuerza y poder, como la imagen del rey que posee 10,000 soldados, y se cree poderoso, pero cuando encuentra a uno con 20,000 y mejor armado, la solución no está en la fuerza, ni en la obstinación. Sino en saber dialogar con uno mismo, para enfrentar a nuestros adversarios internos, que nos desestabilizan, robándonos la alegría y La Paz. Por lo tanto, te invito que le digas a Jesús que llene nuestras vidas y corazones, que a veces están llenos de ansiedades y queriendo declararse depresivos. Olvidando lo que el mismo Jesucristo le dijo a Pablo: TE BASTA MI GRACIA. ALBADO SEA JESUCRISTO EL SEÑOR.

REV. RAFAEL O'FARRIL. ASSISTANT PASTOR/ OUR LADY OF PEACE PARISH

Dear family, today Christ desires that we know each other personally, since in human life we cannot achieve anything certain or

be happy, and therefore we will never be fulfilled. Since man is exposed to living with uncertain thoughts, no matter how much he reasons, if he does not do so with God's help, he is prone to error, because the very matter of the body is corruptible, suffocating the soul and clouding the understanding. That is why TODAY, we are offered a path of radicalism. Do you want to be a disciple of the Lord? Do you know what the cost is? What do you need to be a disciple? Do we need material things?

Let's respond a little and help ourselves: the Gospel begins by presenting a crowd that seeks Him because they want Jesus to solve their problems by performing miracles. But Jesus shows the way to solve them through those He has chosen to be with Him. Disciplines. And the first thing is to follow him PERMANENTLY, not occasionally or through visits in life. Therefore, in order to follow him permanently and have strength, courage, security, and clarity, we must take the following into account:

- 1) Put Him above everyone else, even mom, dad, spouse, children, etc.
- 2) Understand that He is the most important and necessary thing in our lives and that He is our very life.
- 3) That we must take up the Cross and follow Him, which means being willing to die every day, giving up our comforts, desires, etc. It means dying consciously for His cause. That is why today, He offers two reflections in the form of parables. About two apparent needs that we encounter: the economic one in the tower that man proposes to build. And that, when we run out of money, we had better be the laughingstock of the people. But the main tower is that of our life. May it not be you who builds it, but Christ who lifts you up. And I REPEAT: may it be Christ who lifts you up, snatching you away from the world, from your doubts and fears, as I snatched away the prophet ELIAS with power. Secondly, the appearance of strength and power, like the image of a king who has 10,000 soldiers and believes himself to be powerful, but when he encounters someone with 20,000 soldiers who are better armed, the solution is not found in strength or obstinacy. Rather, it is found in knowing how to dialogue with oneself in order to face our internal adversaries, who destabilize us, robbing us of joy and peace. Therefore, I invite you to ask Jesus to fill our lives and hearts, which are sometimes full of anxieties and wanting to declare themselves depressed. Forgetting what Jesus Christ himself said to Paul: MY GRACE IS SUFFICIENT FOR YOU. PRAISE BE TO JESUS CHRIST THE LORD.


