

Sacrament of Matrimony: In order to properly prepare for marriage, it is expected that the couple contact the pastor before making other arrangements for the wedding. This initial contact should be at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays at Our Lady of Grace at 1:00 p.m., and at Most Precious Blood immediately following the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which parents and Godparents are expected to attend. You must be a registered member of Our Lady of Peace Parish. Godparents must be baptized Catholics who are practicing their faith. Expectant parents are required to receive instruction before the baptism of their child. If you are expecting a child in the next six months, please contact the parish office to register for this instruction.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.

To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.



Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

OUR LADY OF PEACE PARISH REV. ANTHONY GENEROSE PASTOR

People have asked me if it is "Okay" to pray for a happy death. I think so since the only other option is to avoid the subject altogether. But dying is very much a part of living, and a happy death seems consistent with a life well lived.

The epistle this weekend is the conclusion of Saint Paul's second letter to his friend and collaborator, Timothy. Saint Paul reflects on his impending martyrdom from that perspective: I've lived my life well, though I've made some big mistakes along the way, and my death is happy one in service to the Lord Jesus Christ.

"My life is being poured out like a libation," he says, indicating that his martyrdom will amount to an act of worship as his blood will be poured out in sacrifice. "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." These words of Saint Paul speak of a life well lived, indeed, because he testifies to accomplishment of a mission which Christ himself revealed to Paul at his conversion (cf., Acts 9, 16). Jesus showed Paul what he would have to suffer for the Name of Jesus, and Saint Paul recognizes that when he needed the help of others in the mission, some failed him by deserting him. But Jesus did not abandon Paul. Note that Paul is not angry about their desertion. Instead, he prays for them just as Jesus prayed for those who abandoned him in his hour of need. And so, the happy death following a life well lived is not so much the loneliness of abandonment and the suffering of martyrdom, but the accomplishment of the mission worked by Christ through him.

If we pray for a happy death, like Saint Paul, it may not mean a painless death. Rather, our death can be happy if we can confidently testify to the accomplishment of a life well lived in service to Jesus.

No una oración ocasional, sino intensa. El día de hoy, el Señor viene de nuevo, a que realmente hagamos una oración, pero con humildad. Podemos ya decir, esa es la palabra clave: HUMILDAD. Porque no pareciera, ese es el antídoto, que nos salvará a que no nos destruya y deforme nuestra oración, o servicio aún dentro de la comunidad eclesiástica. Hay muchas personas que, por llenarse de orgullo, soberbia, celos u cualquier otro tipo de pecado, su trabajo o servicio es estéril. Pues triste decirlo, pero vivimos siempre actos, pensamientos o criterios racistas, como lo vemos en el evangelio de este Domingo. Por eso pone Jesús el dedo sobre el fariseo, ya que El, está manifestando que El, es el bueno en todo, honrado, trabajador, gran orador, gran penitente y por eso no reconoce lo que Dios hace, es al revés, le llega a recordar a Dios que él, es el que hace y por lo tanto se merece el reconocimiento de Dios. Todo lo contrario, a lo que enseña la virgen María en el Magnifica: Proclama su alma la grandeza de Dios, porque ha hecho en ella grandes cosas. No es ella, y lo reafirma en la boda de cana de Galilea, hagan lo que El, les diga. Orar con humildad, me ayuda a encontrar mis miserias, como también la posibilidad de servir, todo lo que Dios me ha dado. La humildad purifica mi pensamiento, mi corazón, me aparta de la esclavitud del pecado y de las idolatrías del mundo y que no idolatre a ninguna persona. Me hace ser libre y en disposición para Dios. La humildad es como el HUMUS DE LA TIERRA, QUE LA HACE FERTIL, la humildad me hace ser fecundo para Dios, para los hombres y para mí mismo. Ser humilde no es declararse inútil, sino agradable a Dios, y con un corazón sano y una mente sensata y sin ninguna duda o atadura. ALABADO SEA JESUCRISTO EL SEÑOR.


